





IN MEMORIAM

ROBERT W. SUTTON

March 15, 1919-February 4, 1985

"It is better to go to the house of mourning than to go to the house of mirth." My first trip to the grand state of Texas proved Solomon's wisdom tru beyond a doubt. For what was originally planned as a cheerful three-day

visit to Beaumont before taking up a new reporting assignment, changed profoundly in character when it happened to coincide with the death of a uniquely Texas man, Robert Sutton. And those three days of mourning gave this

New Yorker a far deeper understanding of the people of Beaumont and of Texas itself than three days of mirth could have ever done. Oddly enough, I had never met Robert Sutton. I knew his wife. Violene, and others of her fam-

ily, but I had never met the man of whom Brother Hilton spoke with tears and brokeness, as we stood beside a freshly dug grave in the Woodville Cemetary and committed a body to the earth and a soul to the skies. Yet, after one day with family and friends, I came to know Robert I heard all about him. His injured leg, his

favorite chair, his candy jar for neighborhood kids, his concern for the preservation of forest land, his passion for coin collecting, his investing savvy, his timber business, his generosity, his fascination with the Smithsonian Institute, his trips with his family, his love of little children and his love for God.

I came to know him through those he loved and through those who loved him, and I was received with such warmth that I felt like family from the start. Imagine, a New Yorker who could not even speak with a Texas accent, feeling so at home. But it happened in Texas.

Oh, what hospitality and warmth I found when after the interment service we gathered at the Woodville home of Robert's sister, Mary Lissie McCombs, and her husband, Robert. And it seemed that Robert Sutton's family was end less-at least three generations, and perhaps fourth. Yes, there was blessing in this house of

Psychologists Tracey Revenson and Carin Rubenstein found in their investigation that people over 65 reported being much less lonely than people under 25, even though they were more likely than the younger group to be living alone. A study by sociologist Ethel Shanas found that 73 percent of her subjects over age 65 said that they "rarely" or "never" feel lonely. Dr. Shanas also found that three out of four people over 65 who have children live within 30-minute drive of them
