That budding, done over two decades ago, was the beginning of the "Hyde Beauty", a native pink flowering dogwood budded onto Tyler County's own white stock.

Two of the original trees still stand in Hyde's front lawn. They are now over thirty feet tall. Over the years, says Hyde, they've not only drawn attention from passersbys, but several years ago prompted Texas A & M University to send researchers to the spot. According to Hyde, the team took samples of the seeds, the small trees underneath, and even the bees.
