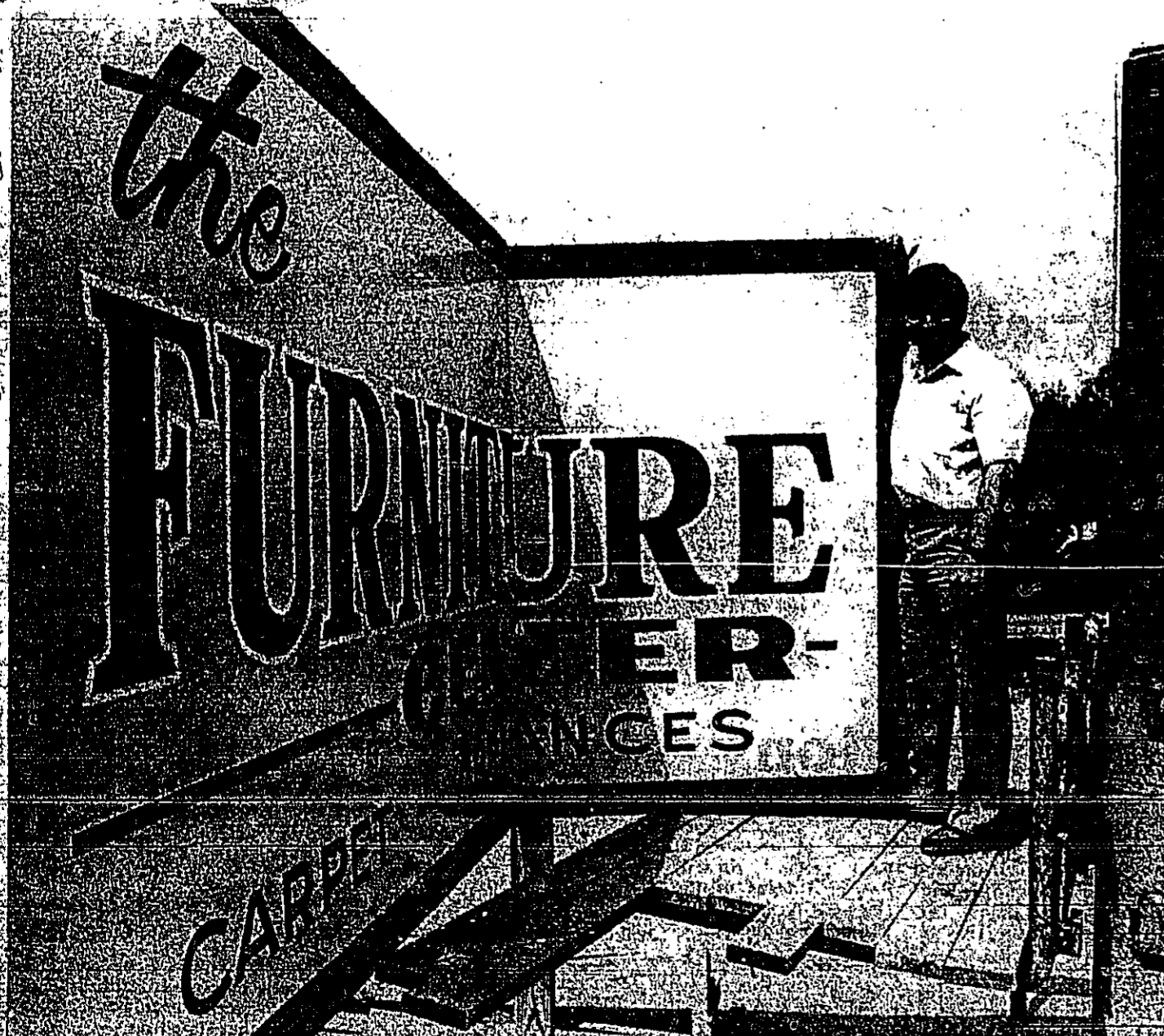

Court Issues Resolve

Tyler County Commissioner's protested Monday the reported potential closing of several post offices in the county. Maxie Riley, County Commissioner of Precinct 1, said, "The people would be hurt by the closing of these post offices."

According to Riley, the post offices that reportedly were scheduled for closing would have been Spurger, Warren, Colmesneil, Chester and Hillster. The court issued a firm resolution that these post offices stay open.

In other action, Robert Armentrout was appointed as County Extension Agent-Agricultural by the court. Armentrout was formerly the Polk County Extension Agent.

Harley Cruse, Constable Precinct 3, brought before the court the issue of communication problems of "officers out of their vehicles." He suggested that walkie-talkies be bought so that the men could communicate with each other when they weren't in their cars. The estimated cost of the walkie-talkies was \$3,400. The court agreed to try to raise some money to help solve the problem.

In other business it was determined that more information and thought be given to the council's financial report.

Knapp, Tolbert, Anderson Reseated On Council

After officially canvassing the election results Monday, Doug Tolbert, J. Gordon Anderson and Tom Knapp were formally sworn in to office by Woodville City Attorney Joe Wheat who read them the oath of office at the regular monthly meeting.

After the swearing in had taken place, Tom Knapp was re-elected as Mayor Pro-Tom.

In other action, City Council turned down American Cablevision's rate increase request. American Cablevision, represented by Bob Carter, requested a 31 percent increase on each cable outlet. Carter said they could have taken \$50 this year and another \$50 next year to equal their dollar rate request. But preferred to take the matter to the council and explain the situation and ask for the dollar increase.

Carter's request was brought before the council's financial report.

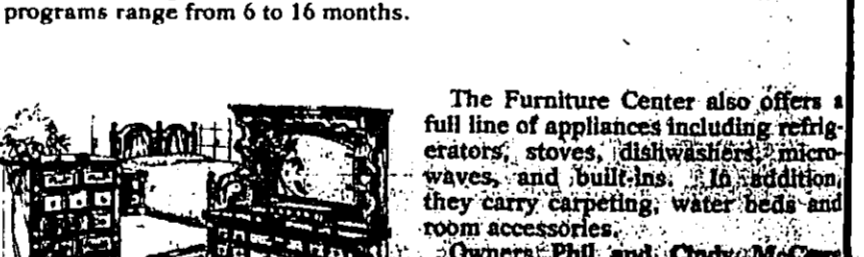

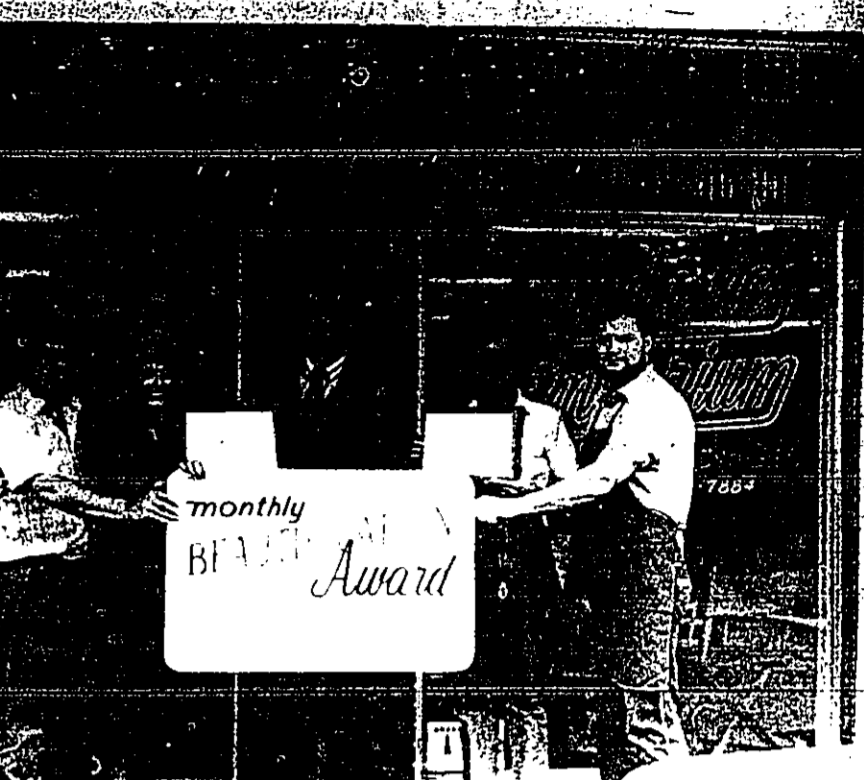

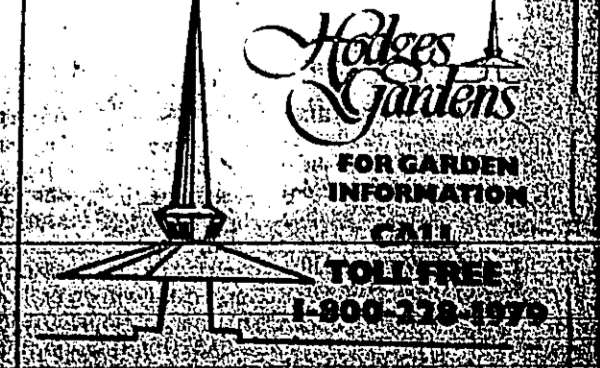

So maybe it was possible for someone to peek inside before the actual ceremonies were to take place.

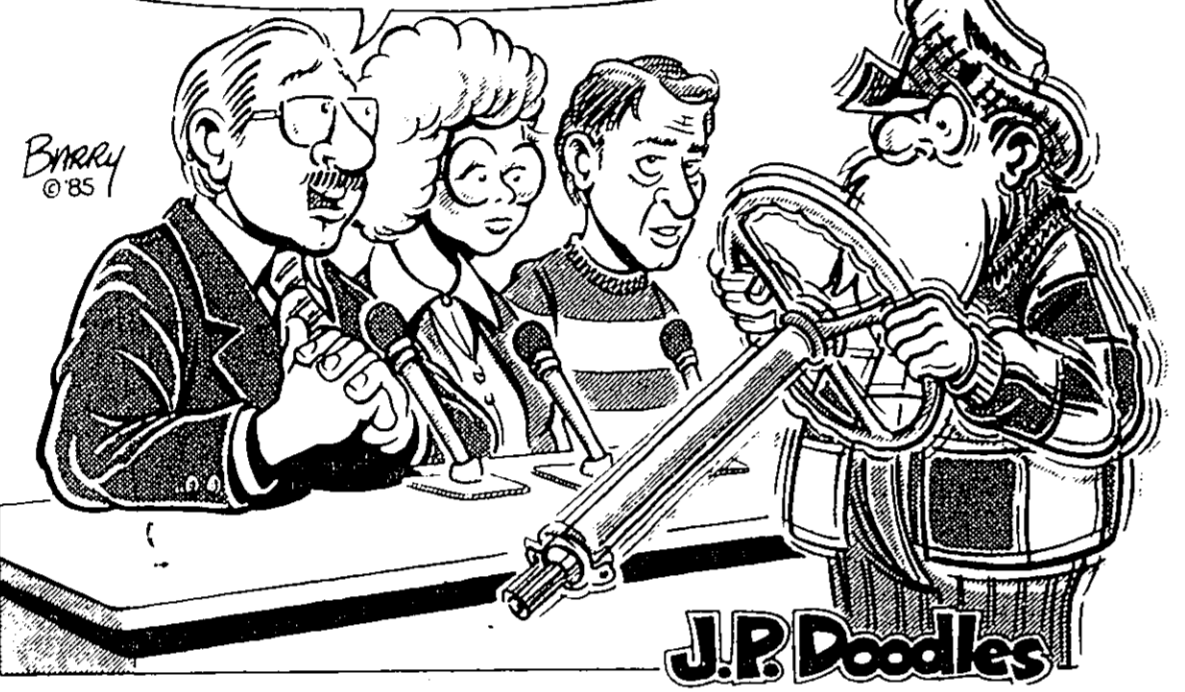

Blake Issues Seat Belt Position

Austin—I wear my seat belt. I wish you would wear yours. However, I am not going to vote for a bill to make you wear one. While I wish everyone would buckle up, the reasons listed below I am going to vote for a bill to make you wear one.

Other than personal safety, the rationale behind seat belt legislation is to bring Texas into compliance with federal safety standards. By doing so, bill sponsors have indicated we can avoid mandatory air bag laws at a cost of four to five hundred dollars per vehicle.

However, I would like to point out that the bill as written does not comply with federal regulations. A clause dealing with the use of seat belts in assigning liability is missing. Each highway death costs over \$300,000. The lifetime expense for catastrophic injury runs over \$4 million per incident. Families suffer loss of income and medical expenses. Employers lose out from the high cost of medical insurance. Workman's compensation, and vacation pay, are also lost. Accidents also cost the federal government, paid out of your tax dollars, in additional medical, welfare, and reduced revenues. The public tab for injuries suffered in auto accidents runs over \$7 billion annually.

If a company needs to cut production by 20% for example rather than layoff the workforce, the employees could work four days per week, and at the employer's option, receive unemployment benefits for the fifth day. Benefits are paid from funds accumulated from employment taxes, and participation would be voluntary.

Through the work sharing option, business owners are not subject to wage swings, such as the semiconductor industry, can have substantial cost savings. The cost of recruiting and training a new employee can return to a normal level. Productivity is maintained because skilled workers remain on the job. These benefits are achieved for little or no change in the unemployment compensation tax rate. Employers benefit because their salaries are supplemented by unemployment compensation, allowing 92 to 94% of normal pay to be maintained. 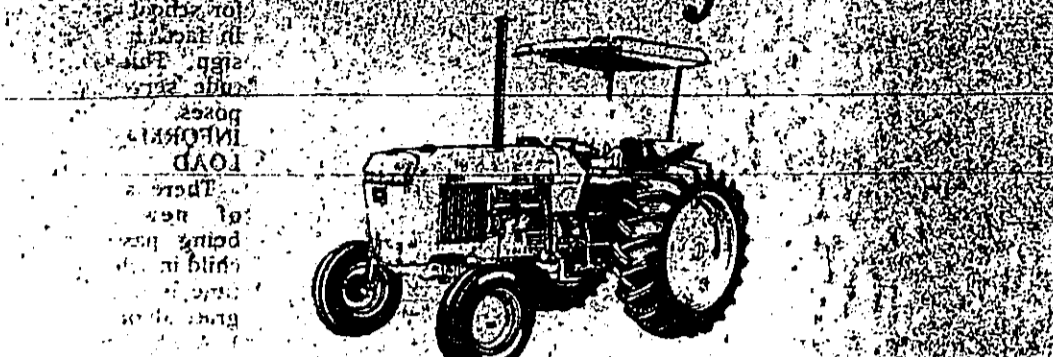

JUST THINKING

There are many good people in the world, but they are not good enough. Some are good—morally good. Attend the services of the church of Christ which meets 15 miles east of Woodville on 100th Street.

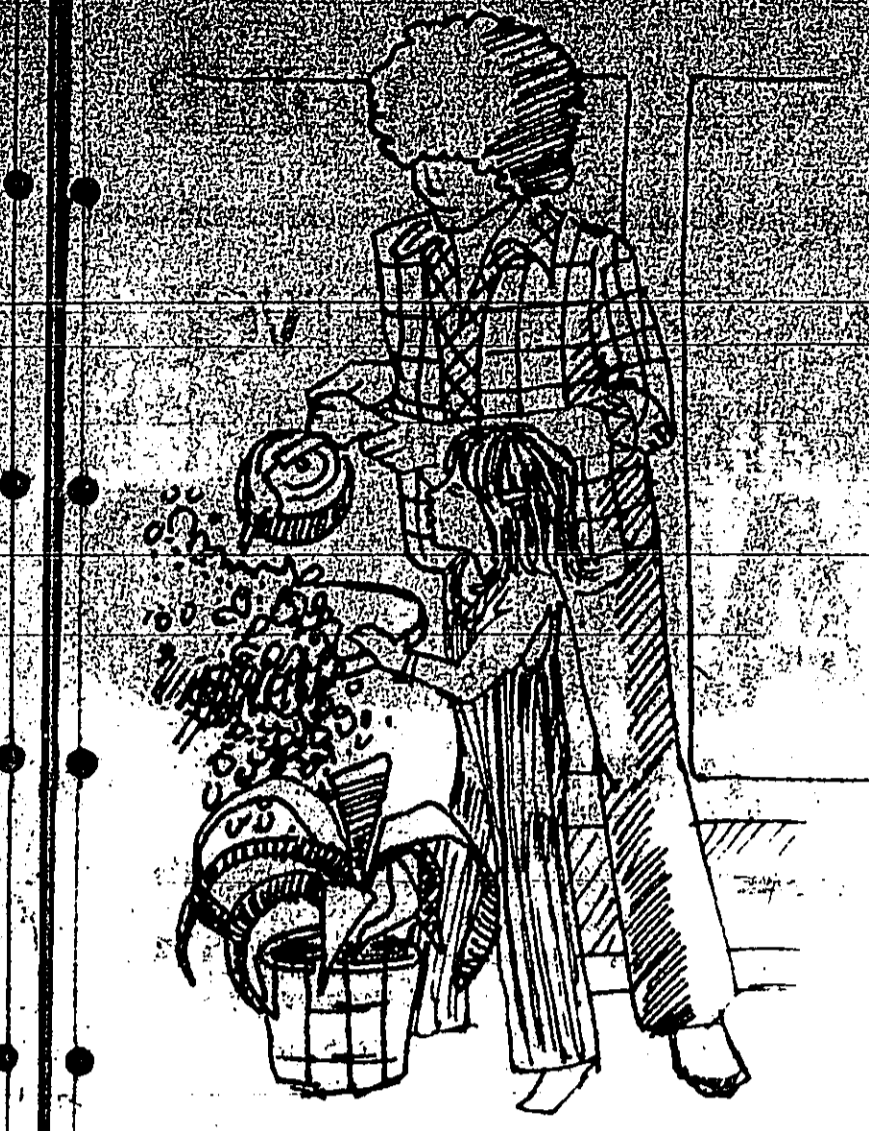

Artful Answers To Kids

Questions Short, To The Point

One of the satisfactions of being a parent is being able to answer a child's questions, to fill a small mind with ideas where there were none before. Of course, this satisfaction is sometimes replaced by annoyance for a child's understanding grows, so do the number of difficulty of his questions. And not only are his questions "hard" to answer, they tend to pop up at times when you are busy or your mind is occupied by something else. Sometimes a child will ask a question just to gain your attention, but more often than not he has been doing some hard thinking about something and has run up against a mystery.

It is very easy to give a child a simple answer to a question, but it is very difficult to give a child a complex answer. The best way to give a child a complex answer is to give him a simple answer that is correct and to give him a simple answer that is incorrect.
