Editorial

Why Not Both?

The Poles County Booster is a strong supporter of both the Big Thicket Preserve and the proposed Rockland Lake and Dam Project. There is no reason to believe that the Rockland Project in any way endangers the biological vitality or diversity of the Big Thicket bottomlands. Nevertheless, the arguments presented to Congress by Big Thicket Conservation Association representative Joe Wells on April 1, are ill founded enough to warrant quick

The Big Thicket Conservation Association's objection to further

funding for the Rockland project is, they say, that Lake Rockland will reduce flooding on the lower Neches and will result ultimately in 'a suppression of natural flooding patterns which would dry up portions of the bottom lands along the river and alter the ecologicial diversity for which these areas were acquired."

The truth is that Sam Rayburn Dam has been reducing flooding and "supressing the flooding patterns on the lower Neches river" for the past 20 years, but with no discernable adverse effects on the ecology of the Big Thicket.

Yes, Rockland's flood control will somewhat intensify the flood control effects of Rayburn Dam but, as Paul Harcombi, the nationally noted ecologist and expert on Thicket plant life stated in the Tyler County Booster, two years ago, that if Rayburn has not had any major adverse effects on the Thicket, then Rockland Dam should not be the cause of any major harm to the Thicket Dam should not be the cause of any major harm to the Thicket
Likewise, the effects of Rockland Dam on the Upland Island
Wilderness are debatable only because we are not as injusticely
ledgable of the ecology of that area. But it is worth noting that a similar bottomiands area downstream from Sam Rayburg Dam, was being touted as recently as last spring; by Ned Fritz's Texas Committee on Natural Resources, as having ecological qualities

Tyler Countians and the lakes area community in general should have the conflict in regarding to supporting both efforts at a preserving and developing projects such as the Big Thicket Proserve and the national forest Wilderness areas. Not to mention advocacy for the long promised benefits of the Rockland Dais and Lake Project through the Lake Rockland Area Tourism and Development Committee. worth preserving as wilderness.
