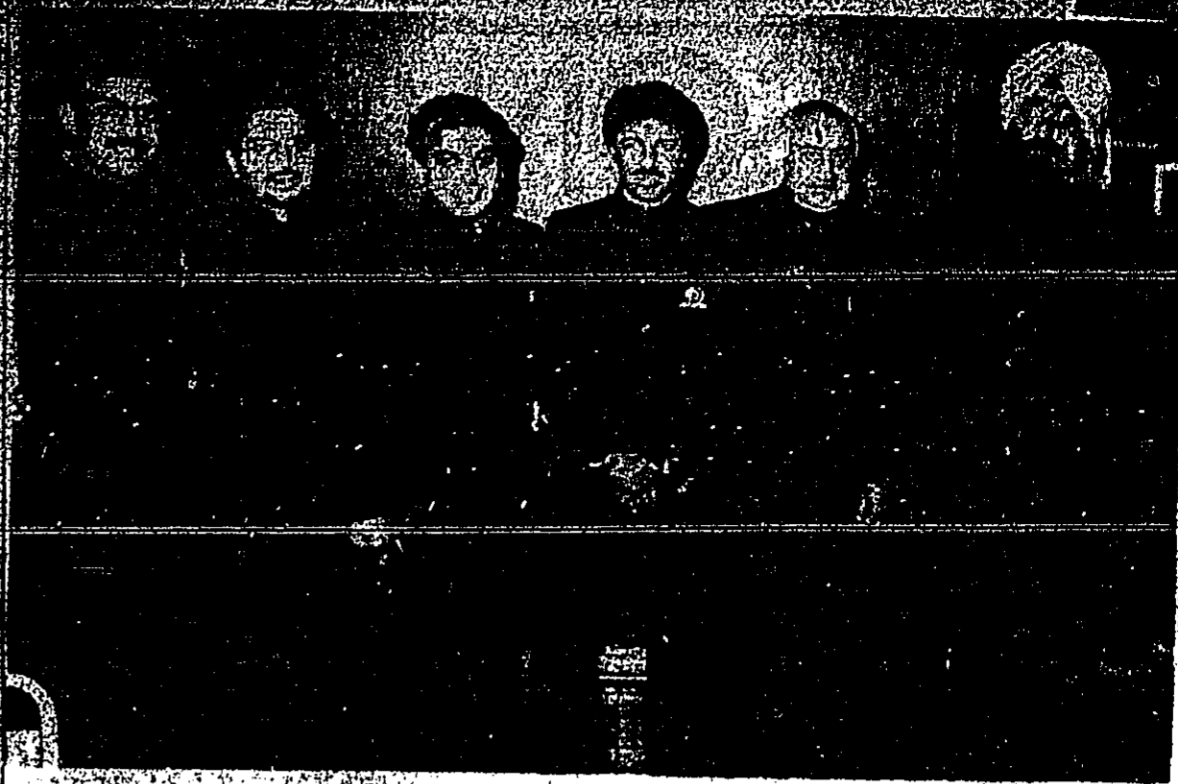

MHMR Gets Treatment Center Grant

With a start-up, matching grant of \$150,000 from the T.L.L. Temple Foundation, Deep East Texas MHMR Services will soon open a 220-bed psychiatric treatment center in Lufkin to serve persons from the region suffering acute mental health problems.

The announcement came at a regional meeting of county judges and local magistrates at the Rodeway Inn in Lufkin when county officials heard Temple Foundation Executive Secretary Ward R. Burke present MHMR Board Chairman Allen Sturrock, judge of Tyler County, with the Temple check for \$150,000.

The meeting in Lufkin was held to orient

county officials to the new treatment center and prepare them for the beginning of service, scheduled for May 23, 1985.

"This again confirms the very constructive and beneficial role The Temple Foundation has taken for many years in supporting and encouraging the development of much needed services for the people of our region," commented MHMR Executive Director Jim McDermott.

"We are proud and very appreciative of what the Foundation has done. We have every reason to believe the Treatment Center they have helped establish here today will be a first-class facility and a source of pride for those of us in the health care field in Deep East Texas."

MHMR officials say the new facility, called the Pineywoods Regional Treatment Center, will be funded on a continuous basis by third-party insurance payors, fees, and funds paid by the Texas Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation as reimbursement for serving patients locally who would normally have been treated at Rusk State Hospital.

Prior to this, there were few, if any, alternatives for those who needed short-term care while experiencing a mental health crisis, short of the large state institution at Rusk.

Now the less-stigmatized treatment center located in a local community hospital in Lufkin can provide this much needed segment of the mental health care system—a segment which was missing before.

The Center will be located on the fourth floor of Lufkin Memorial Hospital and will be integrated with the non-psychiatric, ancillary medi-

cal services of Lufkin Memorial.

Clinical Director and Chief of Staff for the Treatment Center will be Michael Cleary, M.D., from Scottsdale, Arizona. Administrator will be Mark Severns, currently on the MHMR staff in Lufkin.

Services at the Treatment Center are designed primarily for adults with acute mental health problems. Children and adolescents, persons with alcohol and drug abuse problems, and persons with serious physical health problems will not be considered appropriate for admission.

In addition to the clinical director and administrator, the Center will have approximately 20 professional staff and a staff of nurses.

Warren I.S.D. Visits TEA

Concern over problems in the Warren Independent School District resulted in a meeting called by the Texas Education Agency between the Warren Board and Superintendent and the Agency in Austin.

The 2 hour, 25 minute meeting was held Monday, May 6, in the office of Dr. W.N. Kirby, Commissioner of Education.

Present for the meeting were Commissioner Kirby, Dr. Victoria Bergin, Deputy Commissioner for School Support, Joe Neely, Director of Accreditation Warren Superintendent Adolph Hryhorchuk and Warren Board Members Harold Davis, John Long, Walter McPherson, Ben Read and Bobby Samford.

According to Board

Member Long, "The Commissioner said they were aware of the problems in the Warren District and that it appeared many of the problems were a result of the inability of the Board and Superintendent to work together. The Commissioner said that the District needed to get back to the basic idea of teaching kids. He said that test scores indicate that Warren students are being affected because they are not scoring as high on the tests as they have in the past."

According to Long, "The Commissioner told the group that this was the first time the Agency had called a Board and Superintendent in a meeting before they actually went to a school in Warren district. The Commission-

er outlined the following options for the Warren District:

1) The Board and Superintendent could go back to Warren and iron out their difficulties.

2) If the Board felt they could not get along with the Superintendent, they could send a person (usually a retired Superintendent) to observe and report to the Agency what was going on in the District.

3) If nothing could be worked out, the Agency would send someone to run the School District, at which point neither the Superintendent nor the Board would have any authority."

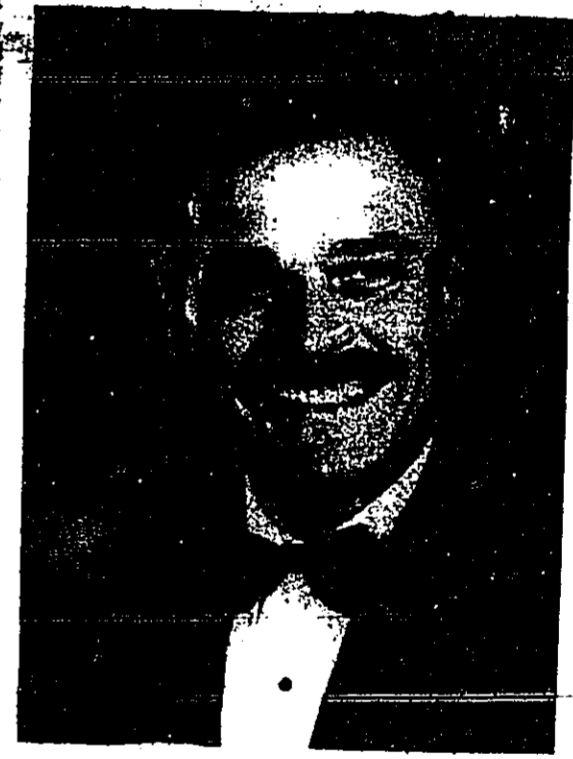
Youth Center Opens Doors

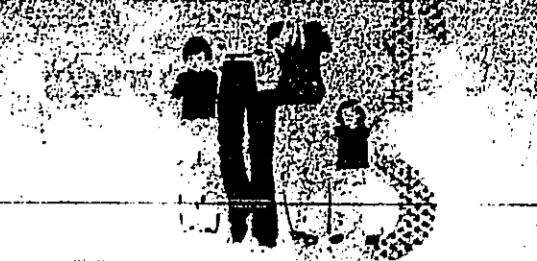
Maclin, a member of the Baptist Foundation and a minister, says that the ministry, which he began in 1983, is "a ministry to those who are in jail."

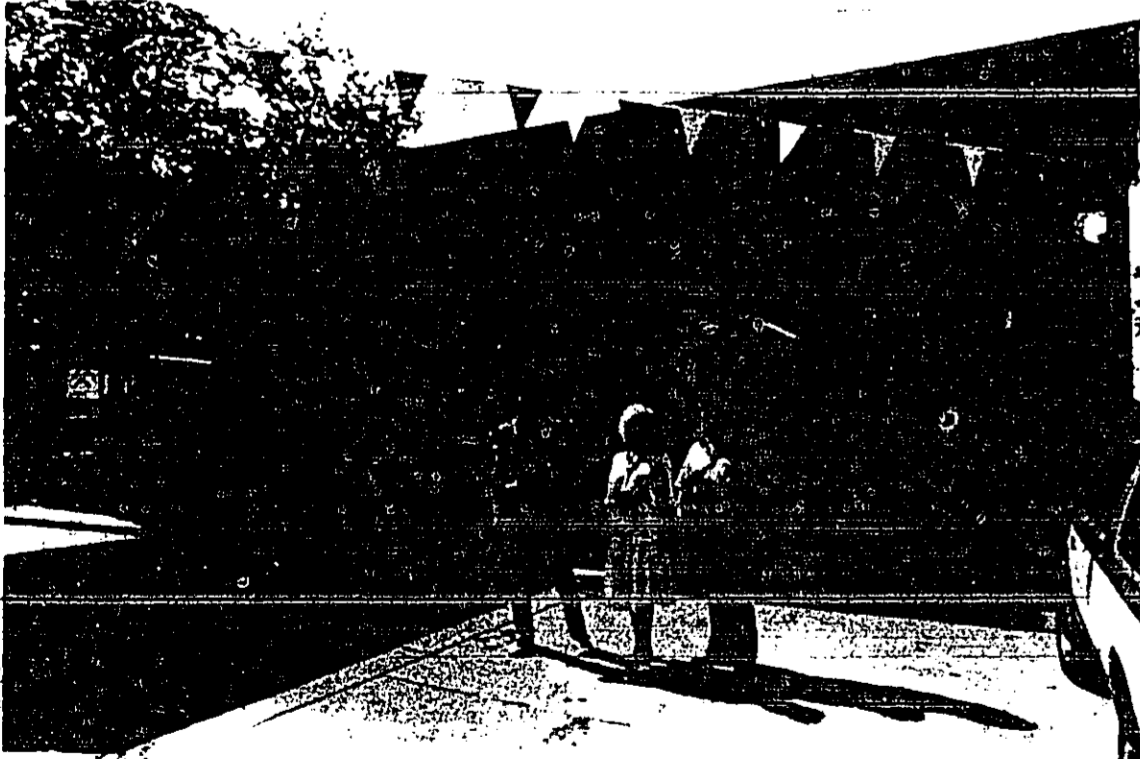

CONSTRUCT YOUR OWN GARDEN CULTIVATOR

Some garden spots are too small to justify the expense of buying a power tiller, but they're a little too large for the dig-and-shovel technique. If you've got such a problem, the Fabulous Burkholder Garden Cultivator may be just what you need.

Now, we wouldn't be THE MOTHER EARTH NEWS if we simply told you to run out to the nearest store and buy one. No, we're into making do with less, so what we suggest is that you find two old bicycles so you can make your own magic hoe.

Dennis Burkholder, a resident junkophile at THE MOTHER EARTH NEWS, has designed this ingenious garden tool using the frames of two discarded bicycles. If you'd like to build one yourself, keep in mind that—though junk components are perfectly acceptable, Dennis does recommend that the wheel be fairly straight and possess enough spokes to keep it that way when in use.

Construction of the tool couldn't be much simpler. To start, Dennis took a men's 26" bike and removed the front fork assembly, handlebar stem, crankset, brakes and cables, and both wheels from the frame. He then located a fork assembly from a second 26" bicycle, and using a hacksaw, cut the fork stems from both front wheel holders. (The stem is the tubular stub that fits into the head tube, or neck, of the bike. It's fairly difficult to saw through, so you might want to just leave both stems intact, since they won't be in the way.)

Next, Dennis drilled a 3/8" hole crosswise through the seat tube at a point about 4" above its junction with the bottom bracket. He then temporarily positioned the two bare forks backward, but with prongs down, at either side of the frame member so that their four tubes protruded beneath the bottom bracket by 8" or so. By drilling through the leftmost tubes at points in line with the 3/8" seat-tube hole and the opening in the bottom bracket, he was able to lock the fork sets to the frame with two 3/8" x 5 1/2" lengths of threaded rod and four nuts with lock washers.

Burkholder then cut into the bike's head tube with his hacksaw, making two 1" wide by 1" deep V-shaped notches in the forward part of each end of the neck. (Naturally, the two head bearing cups had to be tapped out of the frame before he attempted this surgery.) The V-shaped slots enabled him to lock the handlebar clamp and stem firmly into the bike's head tube with a 1 1/2" x 8" bolt through the seat and a 1 1/4" pipe flange placed at the opposite end of the tube. With the right-side handlebars turned around and cemented in the clamp, the assembly was in an ideal position for some serious gardening.

If you're looking at this bike's seat, by the way, it's back and forth, and it's not nearly as high as you'd expect. Dennis was able to raise the front part of the seat by 2" or so by using a 2" x 2" piece of wood in addition to a 2" x 4" piece. The wooden support was mounted under the seat, and the 2" x 2" piece was bolted to the top of the seat. Some other readers, though, have found it just as easy to raise a notchcut and leave the frame flat for both tasks.
