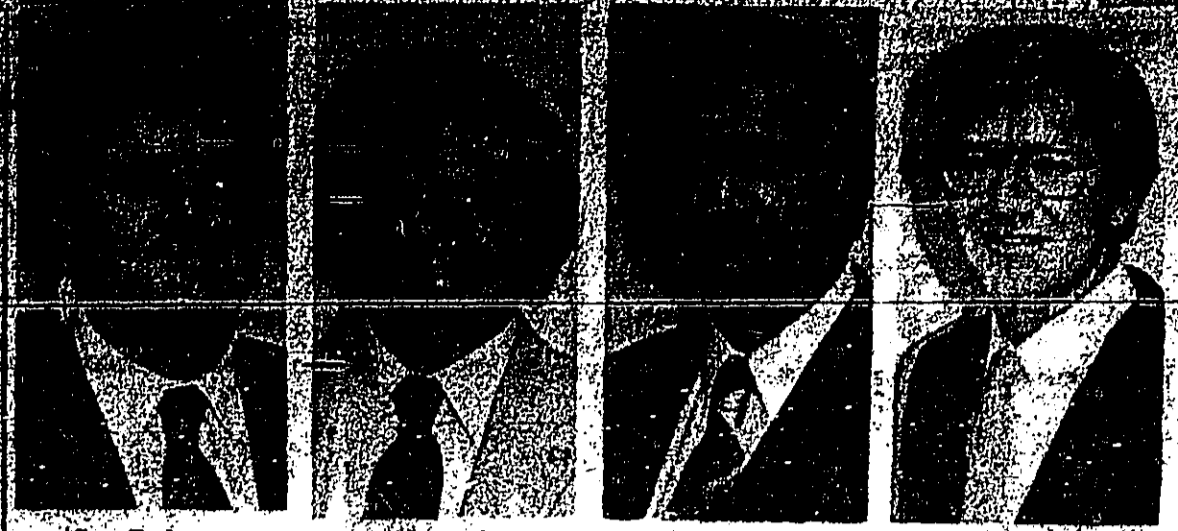

Pornography Sales Hit

The sale of pornography was the topic discussed by the Reverend Phillip Waller and the Woodville City Council at their regular monthly meeting Monday, May 13.

Waller, who is co-pastor of the Trinity Assembly of God Church in Woodville, had approximately 30 supporters with him, as he brought before the council the question of how to stop the sale of pornographic material within the city limits. He said, "Stores are selling pornographic magazines and video tapes are being sold over and behind counters."

Waller asked that all the obscene material, such as magazines and video tapes be removed from the Woodville city limits. He said, "We have a reputation of being a small, family oriented town, and people come to Woodville for that reason. If we continue to let this type of obscenity grow, there will be nothing left of the town." He added, "It's the minds of the children that will be corrupted."

Joe Wheat, city attorney, recommended that Waller and his group take the matter up with the District Attorney and the Grand Jury.

After a long discussion, Councilman J.M. Radford proposed to adopt a resolution to go on the record of opposing obscene material in Woodville.

In other business, Don Forse of Woodville, requested utility services for the sub-division on Highway 69 South. Forse said he needed water and sewer lines out there. The council said that they would be obligated to supply water to the sub-division if there were demands.

Forse added that he would like to have a speed limit in the area of his project, fire plugs, police surveillance, water, sewer and cable. He said, "I just want what everyone in town has."

The council said they would receive all of the requests as was the cities legal obligation because of citizen demand.

Bernice Best, of Woodville, requested to make South Chariton a one-way street in front of the Edwards Funeral Home. She said, "During a funeral, people double park their cars on the street, and then people come out the side doors and gather in the streets."

"The solution to the problem is to enforce the law," Mayor John Gilchrist said further, "We will write a letter to the funeral home asking them to try to keep people from parking and gathering in the streets, and we will talk to the police asking them to keep a closer watch during funerals, and stinging tickets to anyone, double or triple parked."

After an executive session, the court decided on the removal of the City Judge Joe Cash. The council said that there was on-going conflicts in the Justice's Department. "There will be studies done along with interviews to appoint a new judge," said Mayor Gilchrist.

A fire plug will be put on Kelly Boulevard. The plug and approximately 1000 feet of pipe will cost between \$4500 and \$5000. The council agreed that this was a good idea and that there was a need for this plug on Kelly Boulevard.

The minutes from the previous meeting and the financial statement for April were both approved.

Road Use Argued By Contractor

A \$1.5 million lawsuit threat was verbally leveled at the Tyler County Commissioner's meeting Monday at their regular monthly meeting by W.D. Jordan, of Hillister, who said he was discriminated against by the county.

According to Jordan, who spoke before the court, he "felt as though he has been discriminated upon because he was not allowed to haul gravel in his dump trucks over the road leading away from Allison's Pole Mill in Warren. Jordan said that he had several dump trucks that had to get to the gravel pit on that road and that was the only way in and out."

Jordan was stopped from hauling due to overloading. The weight limit is 20 tons on the road. He said, "I don't think it's fair to build a road and then stop you from using it." He added, "I see trucks that have 20 tons on the road and they aren't stopped."

Jordan said he had several dump trucks that had to get to the gravel pit on that road and that was the only way in and out.

Jordan was stopped from hauling due to overloading. The weight limit is 20 tons on the road. He said, "I don't think it's fair to build a road and then stop you from using it." He added, "I see trucks that have 20 tons on the road and they aren't stopped."

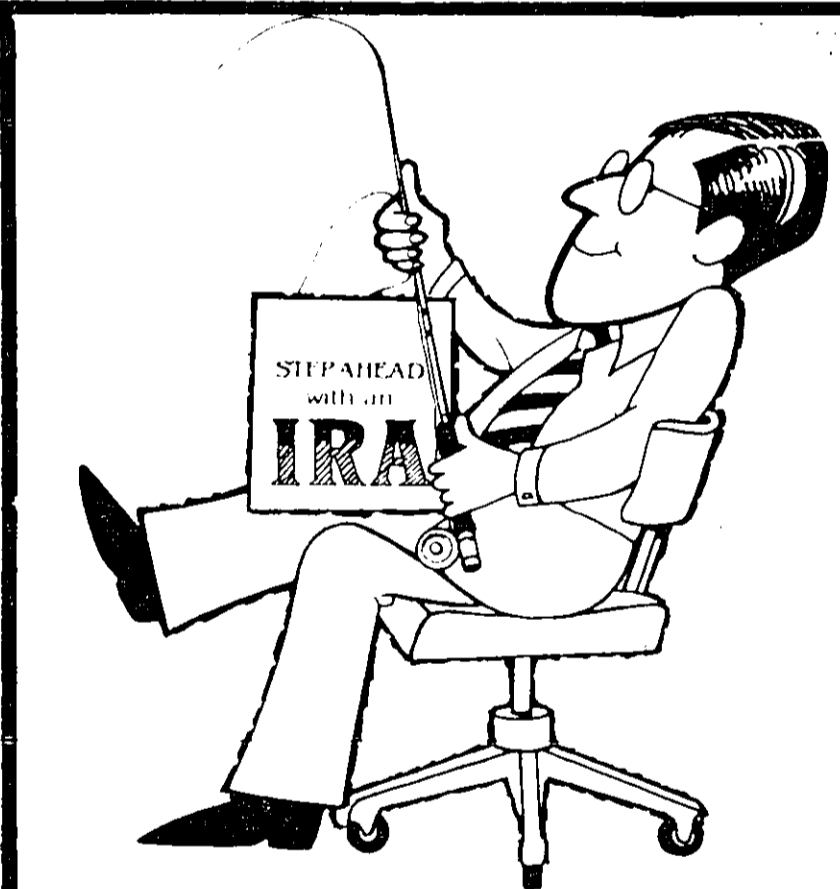

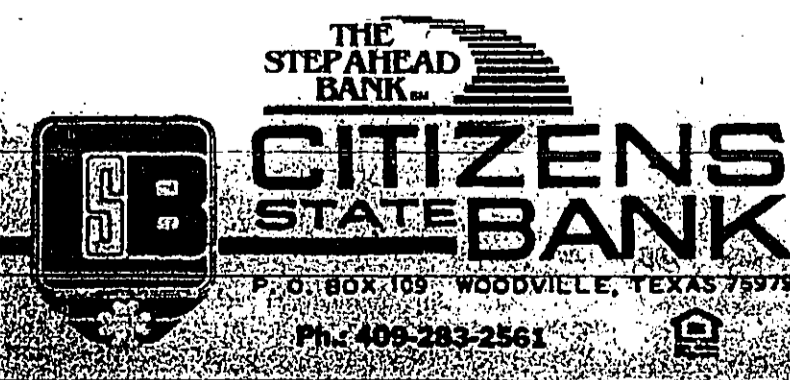

you and the LAW

Q: I live in a small West Texas town and the school board is constantly holding its meetings to the public. Isn't this against the law?

A: Texas requires boards serving public purposes to open their meetings unless certain specific exceptions are met. When a board is considering matters affecting the value of real estate, for example, an discipline or dismissal of a public official, the deliberations may be closed.

Government officials may be criminally punished for closing meetings, because violations of the Act are a misdemeanor offense.

Q: My husband and I bought a trailer home last year and have experienced some trouble with it. I think the company is out of business. Do I have any recourse?

A: The company can be sued for the cost of the repair. If it was a corporation that has been dissolved, you can sue up to three years after such dissolution because the company was supposed to set aside adequate reserves to pay its debts. Outstanding warranties are considered liabilities of the company. However, unless the amount of money involved is substantial and the defendant has assets subject to execution, it is unlikely you will be able to recover your money through a lawsuit.

The Mobile Homes Standards Act requires the trailer home dealer to supply an express written manufacturer's warranty. If the trailer home was purchased from a dealer, you may have recourse against the manufacturer on the basis of that warranty.

Q: I think I need a lawyer. I am pregnant, and have a common law husband who has refused to accept any financial responsibility for the baby. In fact, he wants to separate as soon as the baby arrives. Can I make him pay for anything? Can I make him pay me child support? What can I do?

A: You need to consult a lawyer immediately before the baby is born, while your common law husband can still be found. Your lawyer will discuss with you several choices. For instance, if the father will affirm paternity, child support can be ordered for your baby. If he refuses to acknowledge paternity, a hearing could be scheduled to determine who is the baby's father. As a third choice, you might want to file for divorce from your common law husband and have child support ordered in the divorce decree.

Q: How is an estate settled when my widowed mother dies without a will? I am the only child and there is no property, only C.D.'s. Do these certificates have to be reported on a tax return?

A: All property owned by a decedent must be reported in the proposition owned. In some cases, the total is so small, no tax return has to be filed. To determine whether federal estate and state inheritance tax will be due, total the value of your mother's taxable estate (including the C.D.'s) and the amount of any taxable gifts made during her lifetime. If this totals more than \$25,000 for persons dying in 1984, tax will be due. The exclusion goes up to \$400,000 for the estate of people who die in 1985, \$500,000 in 1986 and \$500,000 in 1987.

Q: I lost my \$32,000 a year job and now have one paying only \$12,000. My child support payments to my former wife are \$600 a month, which of course, I can't afford. Can I go to court to get the payments reduced?

A: In order to get your child support payments reduced, you must file a Motion to Modify the Court which granted the divorce. You will have to show that there has been a substantial and imminent change of circumstances. This does not mean you must lose the \$200 per month. The loss of your job, two-thirds of your income should be a sufficient change of circumstances.

Arthritic's Diet A Key

Good nutrition will not cure arthritis, but poor diet may compound the problem, says a Texas A&M University Agricultural Extension Service nutritionist. Mary K. Sweeten explains that arthritis is a chronic inflammatory process of unknown origin which causes discomfort and pain in the joints. "In an attempt to alleviate the pain, many arthritis victims become the victims of food faddists, quacks and self-appointed experts who advocate maraculous cures with a special diet plan," she says. Dietary oil, vitamins, lecithin and blackstrap molasses have all been promoted for the relief of joint pain. But there is no scientific evidence that any food or any nutrient is of special help to people with arthritis. Sweeten points out, "Still, people with arthritis should pay attention to their diet," she says, "since nutritionally balanced meals benefit overall health, muscle tone, and build resistance to the wear and tear of the disease." According to the specialist, one recent study of rheumatoid arthritis patients indicated that out of our was malnourished and deficient in a variety of proteins, zinc and folic acid. "Whatever the cause, people with rheumatoid arthritis should make special efforts to eat well with a varied diet of fruits, vegetables, meats, fish, poultry, grains and dairy products," she advises. "Accepting the fact that no special diet or vitamin will cure arthritis will save disappointment and frustration," Sweeten maintains. "It will also save money for expensive arthritis health foods on other fad diets that have no effect."

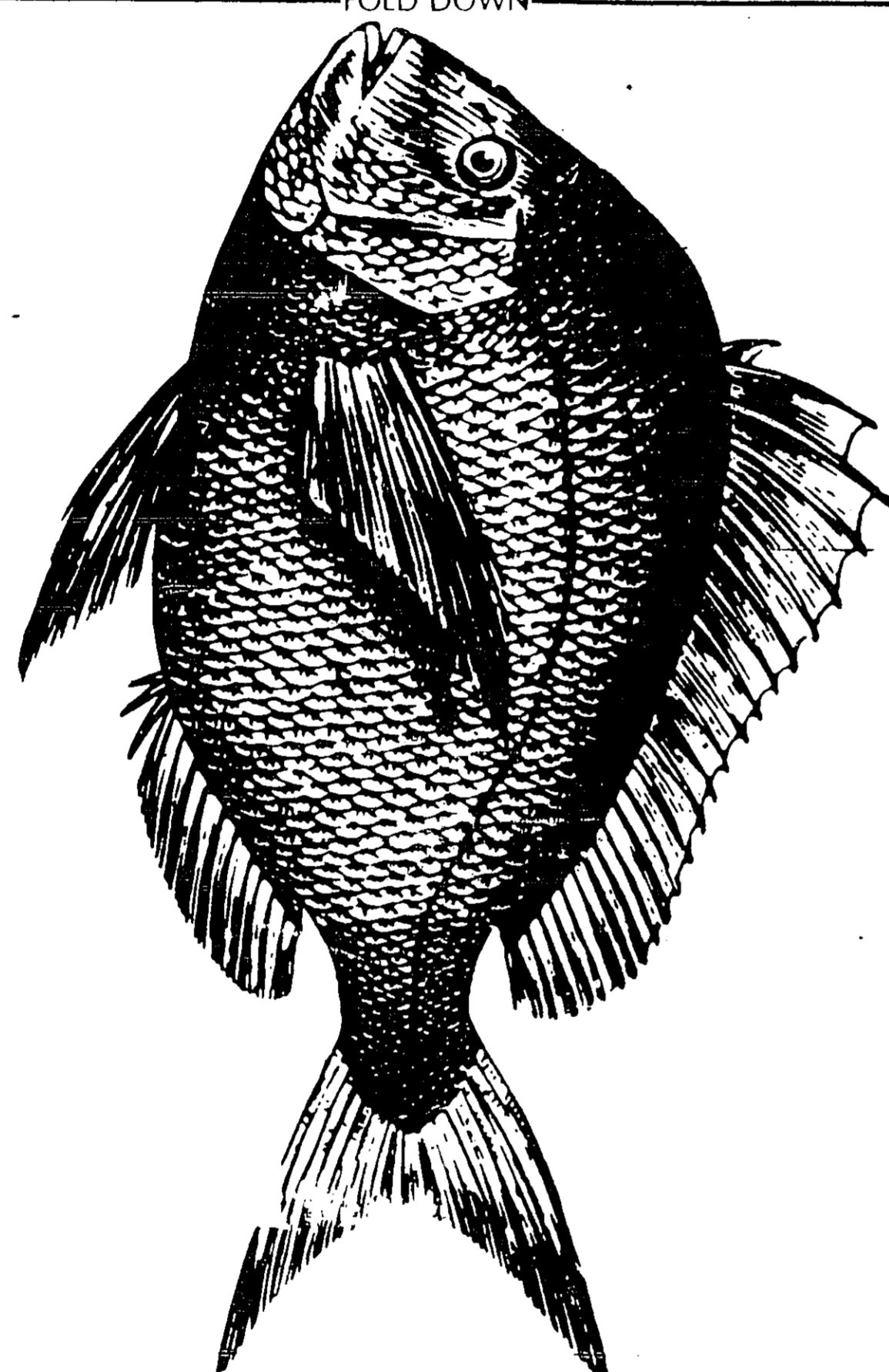

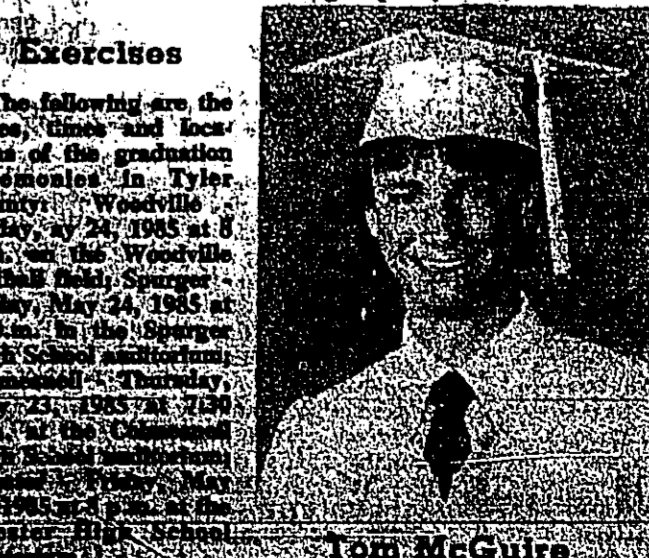
McGuire, Borowski Tops In Woodville

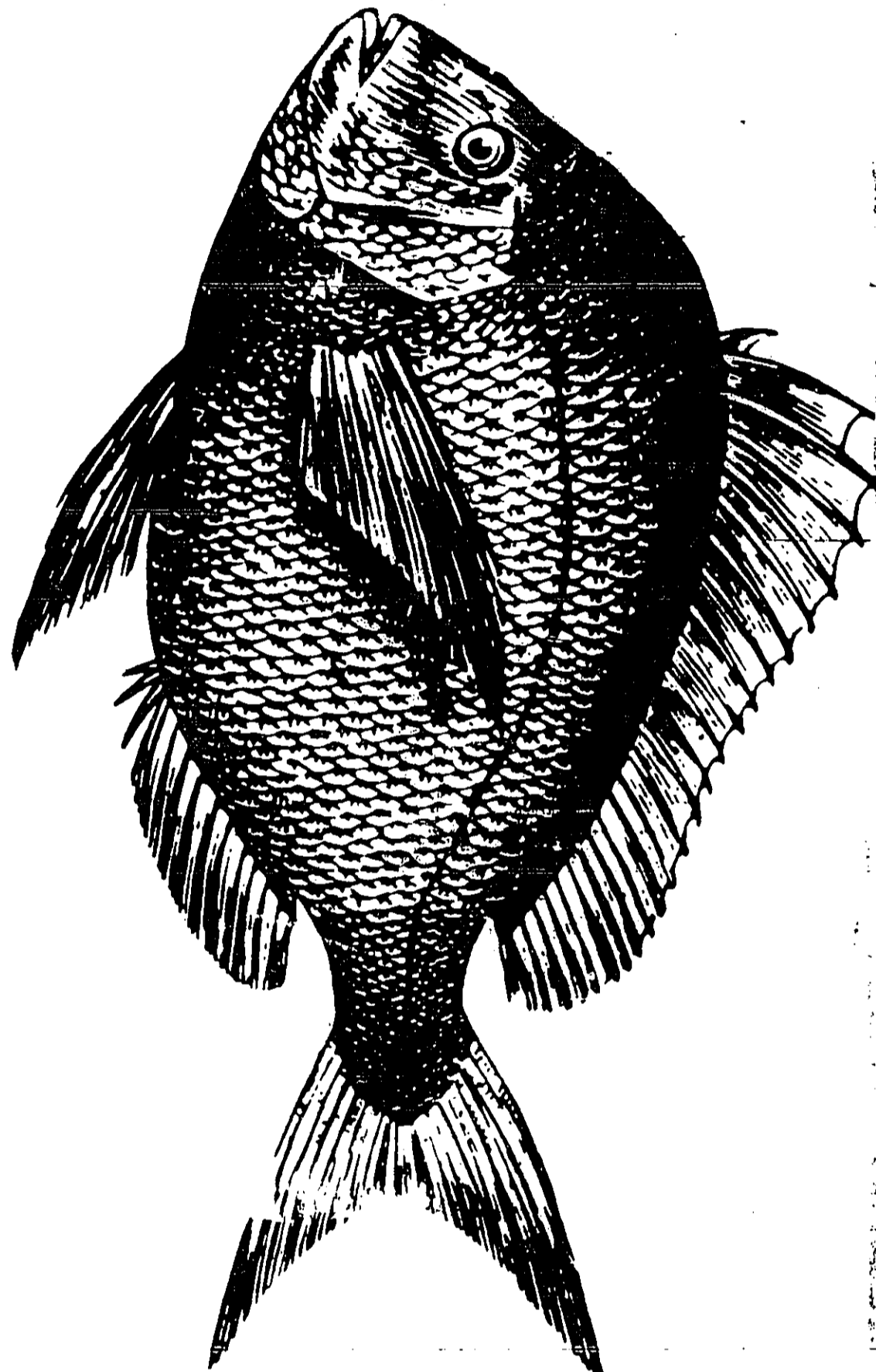

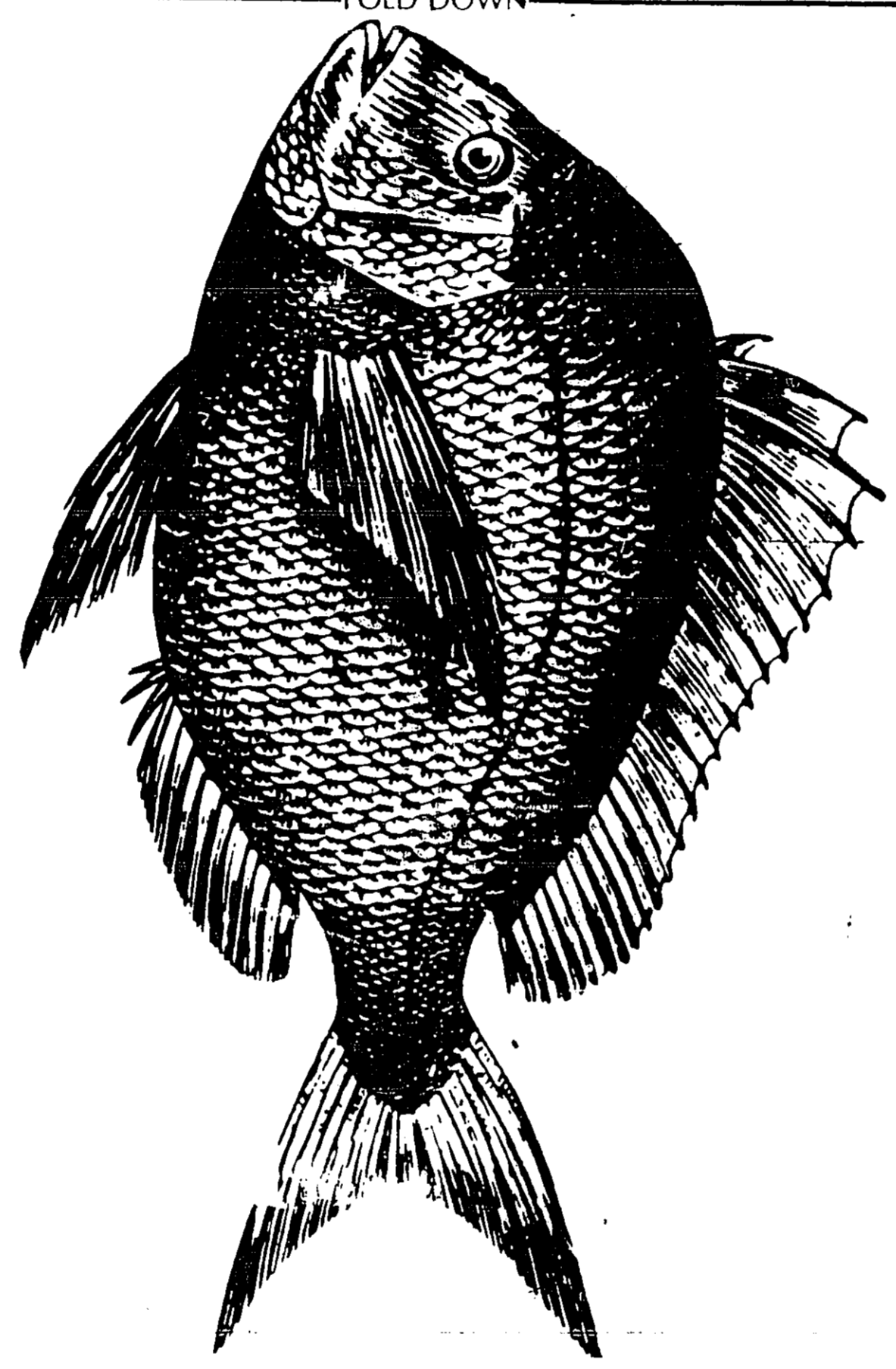
