Deer Trail Country Club Will Open Soon

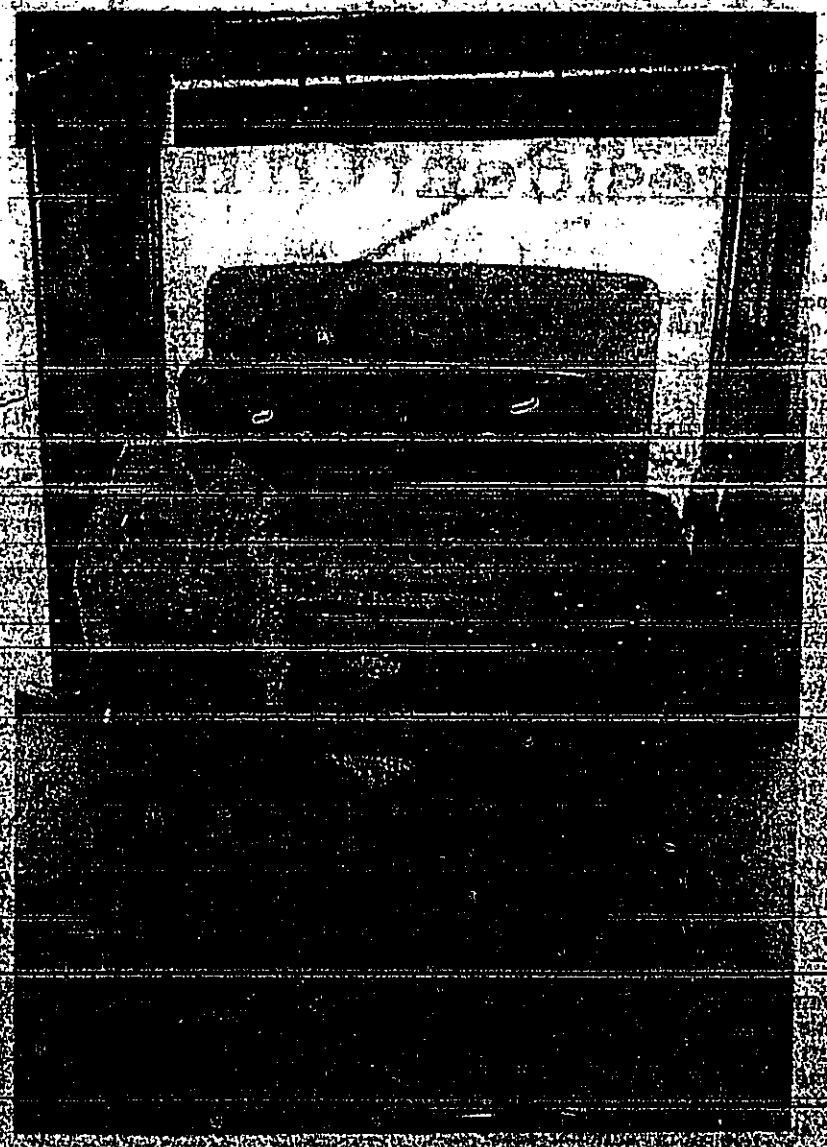

Children's Gifts

How do you know if a child shows potential? A child shows potential if he is interested in an activity. "Giftedness" is expressed in many ways, according to Growing Child, the monthly child development newsletter. For example, your child might excel in academic ability. One child might be gifted in using his hands to make things. Another can be gifted in her ability to understand other people's feelings. If you're taking care of your plants or garden, whatever his interest, you can best encourage it by: Noticing and commenting on his interest; seeing you like to be with them when I'm fixing something that's broken. Giving him the opportunity for involvement. "Would you like to try to fix this yourself?"
Children are naturally curious to investigate. Help them develop their gifts. But they need encouragement and opportunities to use their skills.
For example, you might notice your child singing along whenever he hears music on the radio or television. Your encouragement, plus some records of his own, might give him a chance to expand his interests and skills.
A child also needs to develop basic skills before he can use those skills effectively. For example, he needs to know how to cook before he can combine ingredients in new and interesting ways to invent his own recipes.
Your child also needs to use her gifts in order to develop them.
Have you ever told your child to do something, and then become impatient when she doesn't do it "correctly" right away? It's often easier to take over for a child than let her do things herself. But it's better to let her take the time to let her try things until she can do them. Learning perseverance is an important part of learning to use one's special gifts. It takes a while to learn to use a gift, and your child needs the chance to practice it until she can use it.

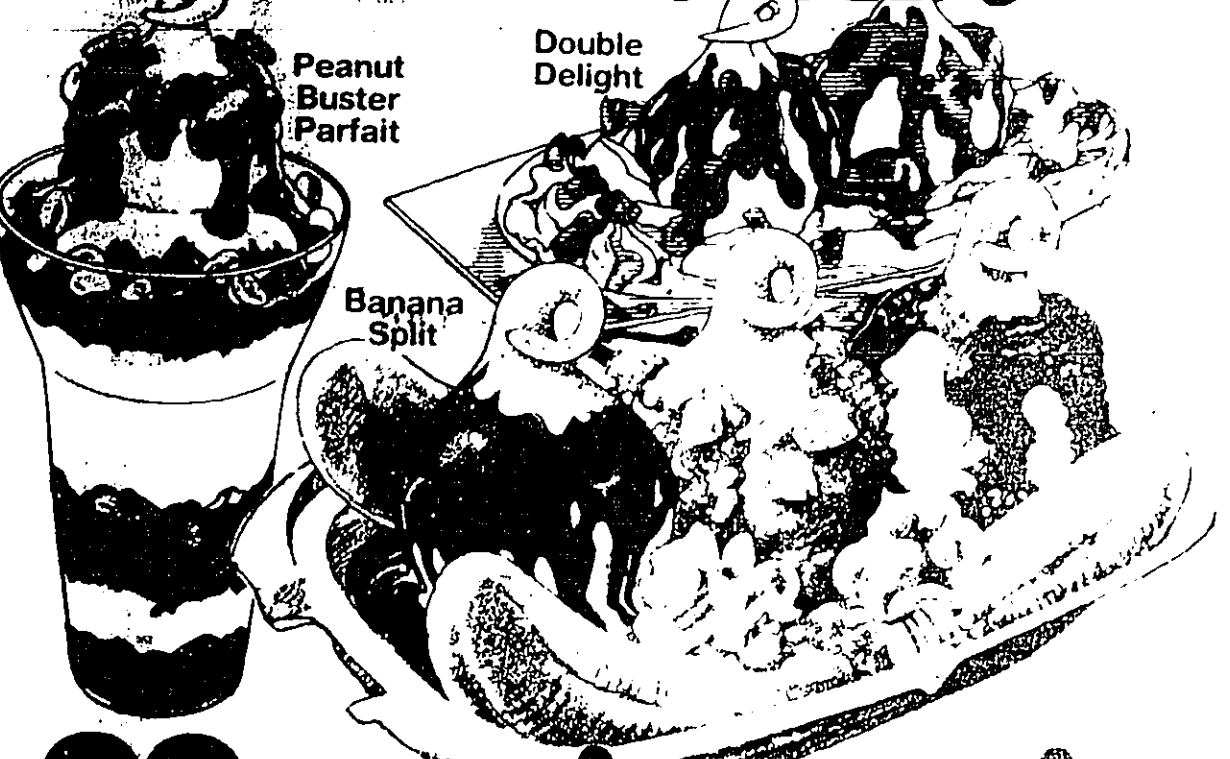

The colors in a tender plant with colored leaves or flowers. They are natives principally of Java and tropical Africa and belong to the Mint family. Labiate. Coleus is the Greek word for sheath and refers to the arrangement of the stems.

The modern varieties of Coleus with brightly colored leaves are descended from C. Blumei, which has bronze-colored, nettle-like leaves. The leaf coloring is variegated and ranges through yellow, pink, red, crimson and green. The flowers of the colored-leaved kinds are comparatively inconspicuous. These plants require a minimum temperature of fifty-five degrees and must be potted in rich, well-drained soil when grown as house or greenhouse specimens. When used for outdoor summer beds and borders they thrive in any good soil. They need full sunshine.

To keep pot specimens shapely, the tips of the shoots should be pinched occasionally to promote bushiness. Plants that have filled their containers with roots should receive applications of dilute liquid fertilizers at weekly intervals.

The most important flowering Coleus is C. thryoides, a native of Central Africa and a perennial that grows to a height of three to four feet and bears bright blue flowers of great decorative value. An important point to remember about this plant is that if it becomes necessary to pick off faded leaves this should be done with an upward pull; a leaf is removed with a downward pull. Long pieces of stem will be stripped from the stem and remain attached to the base of the leaf that is pinched off.

Another good flowering species is C. shrenkii, which is a native of Central Africa. It grows about three feet tall and flowers a month or two later than C. thryoides. It, too, is a perennial. Its flowers are paler blue than those of C. thryoides.

Coleus Frederici, a native of Angola, is an annual or biennial kind that has richly colored deep purple flowers in the early spring. It grows to a height of three to four feet and forms a well-branched bushy specimen.

The Coleus is best used in this area as border plants for our flower beds and re-planted each year or as a pot plant for our home to add color. Let's color our summer with Coleus.

Beware Of Lightning

Lightning strikes may occur between clouds, between clouds and earth. Composed of a number of separate strokes, a lightning stroke contains a first "pilot stroke" with a speed ranging from 100 to 200,000 miles per second for the main stroke. In extreme cases, current can range up to 200,000 amperes, lasting for a few millionths of a second.

Even if lightning does not start a house fire, the force can cause splintering in dry wood beams or blow out windows. If you live in an area with frequent lightning storms, on open land or on a hilltop, you may want to consider having a professional install a lightning protection system on your house. Make sure the system you choose has the Underwriters Laboratories, Inc., "Master Label Service" which provides for factory inspection and field inspection of a number of installations. It is also a good idea to have a lightning arrester properly installed on your television antenna to carry lightning induced charge to the earth.
