Sign Up Now For High School Summer Classes

Tyler County High School students are encouraged to enroll by June 3, 1985 with the Woodville School District, with cooperation from schools all over the county, which will be offering Summer school beginning June 6, exclusively at the Woodville High School campus. The classes will be offered to provide students the opportunity to make up subjects failed and to enroll in an elective course. Students wanting to take one of the regular academic subjects will not be allowed to enroll unless the student failed the course during the regular school year. Students may enroll for the first time in classes known as electives. By enrolling during the summer, students are allowed more flexibility with scheduling during the regular school year. Students may register in the home district with the principal. They may, also, register by phone. Cost for each semester will be \$50. The first semester begins June 6 and ends July 3. The second semester begins July 8 and ends August 2. Classes will begin at 8 a.m. and end at 12 noon with a break from 10 until 10:30. "If at all possible, register today so we can plan class schedules," said officials of the district.

Ellis added, "I see people who live half way between here and Beaumont, here and Lufkin, here and Jasper, coming to Woodville to do their trading."

Exercise: A Cause Of Cancer?

Surprisingly, oxygen can be an unlikely source of danger to runners. That is the finding of Dr. Carmia Borek of Columbia University.

Exercise carried to extremes can be dangerous.

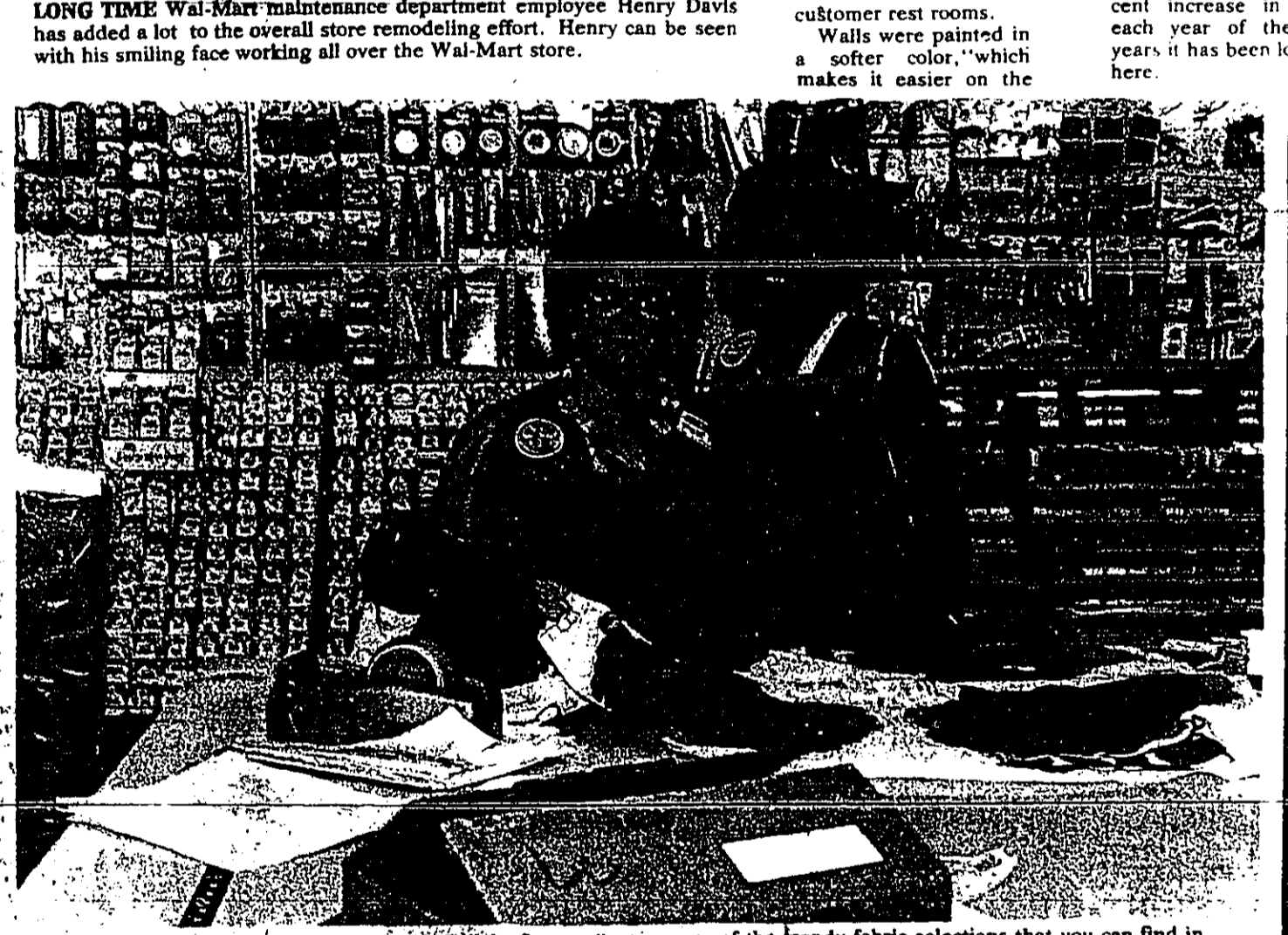
Borek has joined other scientists in pinpointing oxygen as a two-edged sword. Obviously, we cannot live without it, but it can also be destructive, bringing in its wake cellular damage.

"It is a dangerous friend," says Dr. Lester Packer, a professor of physiology at the University of California, Berkeley. His research recently indicated that physical exercise by any animal generates huge bursts of oxygen-containing compounds called "free radicals." These have been linked to cancer and degenerative diseases.

Like Borek, Packer is a project director of the National Foundation for Cancer Research, a publicly-supported organization which funds basic research into cancer's origins. This non-profit foundation was started to support the work of Nobel Prize winner Albert Szent-Gyorgyi, the discoverer of vitamin C, who has also pioneered the investigation of cancer's electronic dimension.

"These results were recently reported at a workshop on Oxygen, Radicals and Cancer," sponsored by the National Foundation for Cancer Research and the University of California, Berkeley.

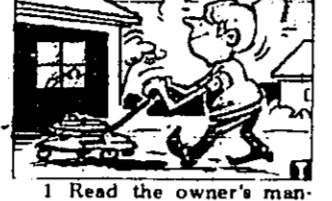

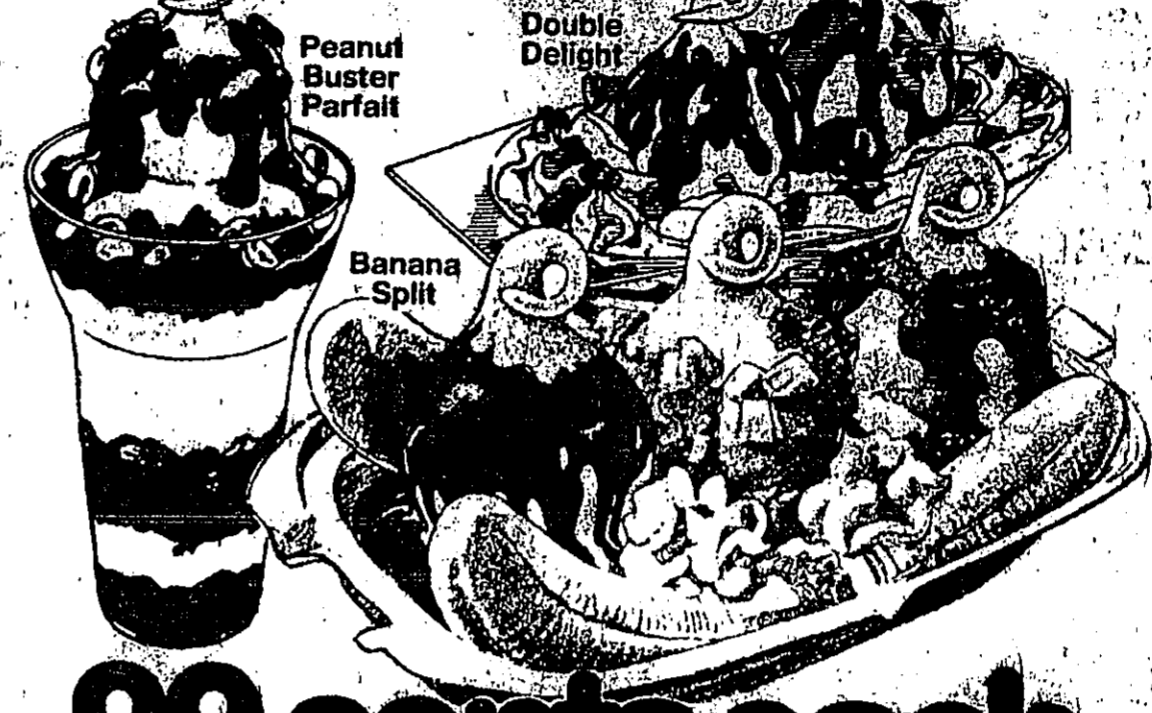
SAFETY SENSE

Simple Lawn Maintenance
 Keeping a beautiful lawn involves frequent mowings, but this is one chore that can be as enjoyable as the results if you know how to use a power mower. Before you get going, be aware of these safety tips from the Outdoor Power Equipment Institute:



- 1 Read the owner's manual thoroughly and follow the safety practices it describes. Make sure everyone in your family who will operate the equipment reads and understands the owner's manual.
 - 2 Always avoid contact with moving parts. Shut off the motor before attempting any maintenance. On power mowers don't remove the grass catcher bag before the mower has completely stopped.
 - 3 Be careful on slopes. On riding mowers and lawn tractors always drive up and down, never across hillside. On walk behind mowers cut grass across the face of a slope, never up and down.
 - 4 Never carry passengers.
 - 5 Inspect your work area carefully. Remove objects which may be thrown, and keep bystanders and pets out of the area. Thrown objects can cause injury and property damage to you or anyone nearby.
 - 6 Handle gasoline carefully. Always refuel outdoors. Prevent fire or explosion by using only approved gasoline containers. Refuel only when the motor is stopped. Wipe up spills. Don't smoke.
 - 7 Never tamper with safety devices or guards. These features are present for your protection. Don't remove them, use them!
- Trouble free mowing can be a matter of patient planning.
