source is threatened. The worth of our wetlands lies not only in the vital feeding. pawning, breeding and resting habitat they provide fish, fowl and other wildlife, but in other ecologic and economic benefits

The playa lakes of the Panhandle rank second only to our Gulf Coast in importance as wintering places for waterfowl in the Central Flyway. In a good year, 100,000 ducks escape the northern cold at Muleshow National Parks. Our Gulf Coast plays winter host to half a million receive and hundreds of thousands of shorebirds, with estimated total ranging from two to seven million waterfowl. Many rest there temporarily on the way to South America.

These birds form the base of a multi-million dollar industry that includes hunters, birdwatchers and people who enjoy recreation in natural settings. Fish that spawn and feed in our wetlands can provide more than a million of our states' recreational fishermen with more

• than five million tail tales during a year. The Texas commercial fishing harvest in 1981, worth nearly \$175 million, totaled 113,108,000 pounds of fish and shellfish, most of which had depended on coastal marshes and esquaries for part of their life Our wetlands also support many endangered species of wildlife, as well as the nutria and muskrat valued by trappers for their

pelts.

In addition to the wildlife they support, wetlands are also vitally important to the control and maintenance of our water supply. They act as a buffer between salt and fresh water, naturally purify polluted water and recharge ground water. They also help control crosion, floods and hurricane damage. In the Panhandle, the playa lakes collect up to three million acre feet of water a year



Across the U.S., we are losing weilands at the rate of 458,000 acres, a year to dredge and fill activities, and almost half of our nation's wetlands are now gone. Leves already has lost more than 600,000 acres of its original oastal wetlands



JUST THINKING







