

Youth Development Center Gets \$280,000 Grant For Fiscal Year 1986-87 Operations

The Tyler County Youth Development Center will be refunded for another two years with a total of \$280,000 for fiscal years 1986 and 1987.

The total local match for each year is \$21,000.

Total state proceeds from the contract grant which provides support for 100 runaways children at \$338,000 over the two-year period.

As of September this year the Youth Center will have successfully completed the first 18 months of operation offering extensive hours of volunteer service and direct client referral benefit to children in need.

The cost of the center is based on a sliding scale which is what a family can afford. If the youth are referred through a probation officer the fee is based on a different scale.

A maximum of eight youths can occupy the shelter at one time.

The Youth Center will not accept youth that show violence toward other individuals, or suicidal youth.

The center provides health screenings, medical attention, dental care and psychological care.

Since it was established in 1983, the center has had good evaluations from the State Department of Human Resources and has made vast improvements. Re-

cently, the center has added a needed 10' x 16' office building and concrete basketball court. New future improvements will feature fencing and farming on two acres of land.

"The Tyler County Youth Development Center is a non-profit organization and any who supported the money or donations for the past 18 months should be considered as tax donations, and for all the donations which are tax donations. Community Meeting Helps Establish Golf Course Goal

Needs 200 Members To Start

Billed as a "drawing card for growth", local citizens jumped on the bandwagon Monday night to "think tank" a way to assist Country Club Developer Bob Carrington in his bid to re-open the abandoned and formerly named Dogwood Country Club. New name for the new enterprise is Deer Trail Country Club and

Carrington says he's under the gun to get the place in order with 200 memberships sold by September 15, 1985.

Carrington, who is a pro-golfer himself, says many folks have come forward with ideas and advice but that what he needs is "Simply 200 memberships at \$500 a piece."

Carrington told the group Monday that the business will not be able to operate with less than 200 members. He also said he would be glad to advise member prospects on how to set up membership plans to provide for the membership fee.

John Coker president of the Tyler County Chamber of Commerce and Citizens State Bank said, "Tyler County needs a golf course and country club. It's the first question our chamber office is asked."

How far do I have to go to play golf?"

Coker advised the group that Citizens State Bank would participate in the club's membership startup drive by holding \$400 of the initial \$500 membership fee in escrow until September 15 at which time it would be returned if the customer member was not satisfied with the improvements or the overall general movement of the club's management to improve other conditions there.

"The golf course is the main reason I came to Tyler County," Carrington said, assuring the group that main dollar emphasis would be placed on golf course improvements. Interest in swimming was also expressed along with future tennis court construction. Carrington said close watch would be kept on the pool quarry and development

plans had already begun for the tennis courts.

Carrington also said that exploration for financing for an additional 9 holes was also planned.

Coker suggested that the community hold a workday at the course to help "For the little things that you just can't afford to pay for," Coker said, "Everyone could then play nine holes of golf."

Carrington who has owned a dairy farm which is currently for sale in Cooper, Texas near Dallas, is also

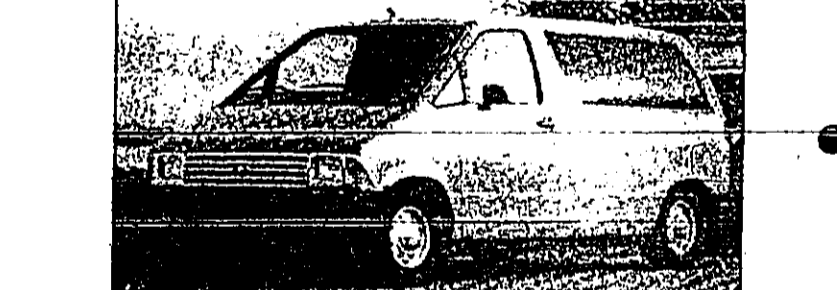

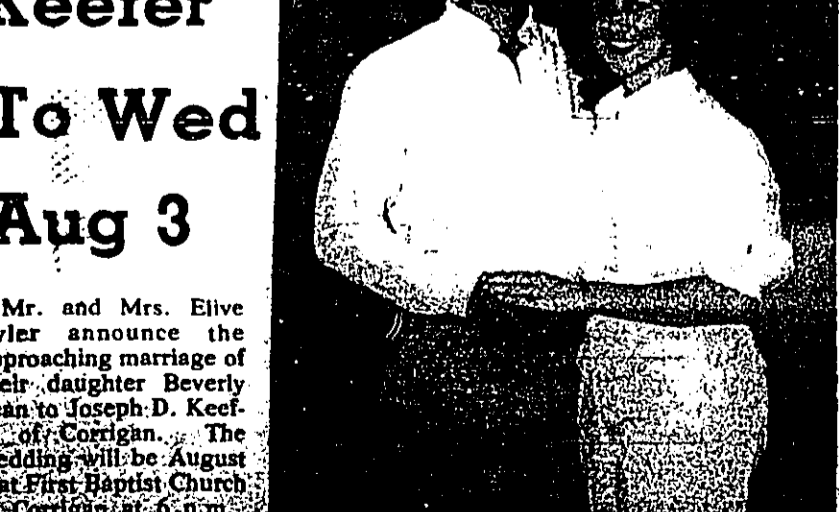

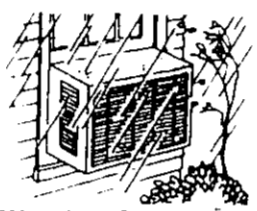
