Dear Str. The TYLER COUNTY BOOSTER wants to be there when you visit the Warren School District in October. We feel your presence will be an excellent way for you to assure that the changes instituted by the Warren School Board under the guidance of your agency will continue to be ef-

fective in the future. The Community of Warren is beginning to feel some confidence again in their schools and in their leadership. Hopefully this latest period of

contentiousness which you are well aware of is at an end. We feel the State's guidance has been very helpful in assisting the district in ordering it's priorities and making needed changes.

THE BOOSTER has disagreed with you in only one matter. in May of this year you called the newly elected Warren School Board to Austin for a closed meeting in your office. In addition, you advised the Board members [according to a member of your staff] to hold "closed work-sessions" before each board meeting. We believe both these

actions violate the Texas Open Meetings law and also set a bad example for the operation of the school districts under your agency's control. We hope when you come to Warren in October in an open meeting of the school board, "eyeball to eyeball" with the Warren community, you will give a concise explanation of where the school district stands with the Texas Education Agency and, also explain the changes your office will expect from the Warren schools as they address

Consider this visit an opportunity to help the community of Warren lay the cornerations for a period in which their schools will function free of the contentiousness of the past. A period in which Warren schools will be able to concentrate on the real challenges of providing a good education for their children.

"Recent publicity suggests that Gulf States is going to ask for a 38 percent electric rate increase in Texas to pay for the River Bend nuclear plant. Is this true?"

ANSWER

No. Gulf States will not ask for a 38% rate increase.

We are not requesting that large an increase for two important reasons: First, our company is sensitive to the effects of a substantial increase in electric rates on customers, especially with our current weak economy.

Secondly, we have been working with the River Bend Task Force, sponsored by the Public Utility Commission, in hopes of finding ways to gradually
