

Charges Filed

 Conflict between two factions of the Spurger School Board moved Friday afternoon from Spurger School Board meetings to Tyler County courts with the filing of four complaints in Justice of the Peace Roy Drake of Precinct #4 Court by recently defeated School Board candidates and former Spurger School Board member Henry Joe Jordan. Jordan said Friday that filing of the four complaints, if accepted by Justice Drake, would establish grounds for a recall election of four current board members. Drake as of Tuesday morning had still not decided to accept the charges on Spurger Board President Pat Cudd and fellow board members Pete Hollis, David Hanson and Eddie Norman. Hanson contacted Tuesday morning, said he "was aware" of the effort to press charges against him and other board members, but would "not comment further" on the issue. Spurger board members Mooney Hicks and Lee Bingham accompanied Jordan to Drake's office Friday and Bingham indicated that he would sign the complaints also, if necessary. Hicks stated he would sign the complaints "if they are accepted by Drake". Jordan alleges that Board President Cudd's actions in securing a depository contract from First National Bank of Woodville, a bank in which her daughter is an officer, constituted an illegal conflict of interest which is a class A misdemeanor offense. If Cudd were convicted, it would result in a fine not to exceed \$2000 or a year in jail or both. Jordan alleges that Cudd solicited a bid from the First National Bank, took part in discussion of bids at the August 9th board meeting and introduced a motion to reject all bids when the bid submitted by First National Bank was not in the form requested by the Spurger School Board. Jordan further alleges that Cudd "hand carried" the bid of First National Bank to the board meeting of August 27th, participated in discussion and voted with the 4 to 3 majority for acceptance of the First National bid. Jordan said in the other complaints that the four board members Cudd, Hollis, Hanson and Norman violated the Texas Open Meetings law and also set a bad example for the operation of the school districts under your agency's control. We hope when you come to Warren in October in an open meeting of the school board, "eyeball to eyeball" with the Warren community, you will give a concise explanation of where the school district stands with the Texas Education Agency and, also explain the changes your office will expect from the Warren schools as they address the future. Consider this visit an opportunity to help the community of Warren lay the cornerstone for a period in which their schools will function free of the contentions of the past. A period in which Warren schools will be able to concentrate on the real challenges of providing a good education for their children.

No One Loves A Love Bug!

 While driving down any highway in southeast Texas, be on the lookout for an invasion of "Plectra Nearctica". These critters are known to destroy paint jobs, clog radiators, obstruct vision and generally aggravate just about everyone. Their larvae are aquatic but they must come out of the water to mate and are almost always seen in pairs, hence their more common name of "love bug". According to Bob Armentrout, County Extension Agent, these insects belong to the family of Bibionidae. They tend to build up their numbers in late summer and early fall. The extent of the invasion is usually determined by the amount of rainfall and climatic conditions of each area. Love bugs are attracted to highways because of the CO2 content there. Swarms usually last 3 to 5 weeks in most areas and then diminish. Armentrout states that Tyler County is not experiencing a bad year for love bugs so far, but because of the recent rains, the situation may become worse later on. However he adds, "There is no practical way to control the bugs because using pesticides in the area bodies of water would destroy most of the useful insects." So if you don't want to face the ugly job of scrubbing "Plectra Nearctica" off the front of your car, take a taxi for the next several weeks or as a local car dealer service manager says, wax your car and leave the wax on.
