Area Grants

COG Review: \$4,322,176

Grants totaling \$4,322,176 were approved for recommendation by state and federal agencies during the regular monthly meeting of the Deep East Texas Council of Governments Board of Directors Thursday, Sept. 19, at the Woodville Inn. Three of the largest grants receiving a favorable review were:

—\$98,900 for the Agency on Aging. These are new monies needed to fund home delivered meals, nursing home ombudsman and long-term care in conjunction with nursing homes and hospitals.
—Although not on the agenda, an "emergency project" grant was approved for \$36,920 for the Alcohol Program of the Alabama Coushatta Indian Reservation in Livingston. Mrs. Ann Lee Robes, who is on the Tribal Council, says "The pro-

gram will help members of the reservation and also advise others where to get outside help for their alcohol related problems.
In other action DETCOG Committee book was approved along with the 1986 Fiscal Year Budget which calls for some \$6,300,554 in operations expenditures.
In an informal meeting before the Grants Review, the Board heard a brief explanation of each of the agencies duties and concerns by the directors of each agency. New Board members, C. Grady Manis of Huntsville with the Trinity River Authority, Randall McCullar,

Idia McClain Honored With Building Name

"I did what I was called to do and that's what I wanted to do"

Idia McClain as she told Spurger Elementary School District, James McWilliams how she sums up her teaching career which spans over some 50 years, 46 of which was spent teaching several generations of students for the Spurger School District.
In honor of her many years of dedicated teaching the Spurger School District has named their 2-year-old 13 classroom elementary school building Idia McClain Elementary School. That building provides space for a younger generation of teachers to provide instruction from Kindergarten through 6th grade.
Formal dedication services conducted by the Spurger Ex-student Association honoring McClain who is a lifelong Spurger resident will take place on Dec. 7 as a part of the District's Homecoming Activities.

McClain began teaching in 1927 at a small school at Hicksbaugh. "A sawmill town near Warren", where she taught first through third grades for 2 years. She then began teaching at Spurger where she taught until 1945. She accepted a position and taught for two years at Warren then returned to teach seventh grade at Spurger for another two years.
After teaching third and fourth grade for several years, she "was privileged to move up to teaching second grade" at Spurger. That was the position from which she retired in 1977. McClain and her older sister still live in Spurger and are still active in school activities such as the local PTO.

Coker Is CDC President

John Coker, president and trust officer of Citizens State Bank of Woodville and former treasurer of the Deep East Texas Regional Certified Development Corporation (DETRC) was recently elected president of the DETRDC.

DETRDC represents a 13 county region and helps business and industry expand in East Texas.
Functions of the program include: Locate eligible applicants, screen and package loans, process applications, and provide legal accounting and business service expertise to small businesses throughout the

region.
In order to qualify a business's net worth must not exceed six million dollars with an after tax profit of less than two million. It also must be located in the 13 county area. A typical loan structure would consist of:
Private Sector (1st Mortgage)....50 percent
DETRDC (2nd Mortgage)....40 percent
Applicant....10 percent

Proceeds of the loans are put back into the program as new construction of renovation, machinery and equipment and household improvements.

PIC Group 'Awards' Bid

The Deep East Texas Private Industry Council is trying to get approval of county judges in replacing Deep East Texas Council of Governments (DETCOG) as administrator of the Jobs Training Partnership Act. In

an "emergency" meeting Thursday at Citizen's State Bank of Woodville, PIC members representing a 12 county area agreed to accept a bid from the East Texas Business Institute of Nacogdoches. The ETBI was one of four bidders for the

job of administrator of the JTPA program.
According to Jerry Johnson, PIC president, the ETBI would receive only 7 1/2 percent of the federal funds allowed for this program, while the Deep East Texas Council of Governments spends 15

percent. DETCOG president, Wayne Baker, of Livingston, however, does not agree with the 15 percent figure. The new agreement would free \$200,000 of the \$2.8 million allotted, to be used in other areas of the program, says Johnson.

After a temporary court injunction prevented an earlier meeting, both the PIC and county judges agreed not to go to court over the issue. However, a new meeting date has not been set, but could take place within two weeks.

Court Buys Grader, Trucks

The Tyler County Commissioner's Court approved Friday, \$46,912 to be used in the purchase of a used Caterpillar motor grader for Precinct 1. This price

includes a trade-in. Also approved in the special meeting was the purchase of two dump trucks for Precincts 1 and 4 from Knapp Ford of Woodville at a total cost of \$37,134. This amount does not include

the truck beds, which will be purchased from the Texas Prison System at a later date.

\$1,150.50. However, Powell has not yet accepted the award. If she does not, the next highest bidder will be notified.

TEAMS Test Mandatory

The Texas Educational Assessment of Minimum Skills (TEAMS) test will be given to all 11th

graders, beginning this year. This test is scheduled for Oct. 1 and 2 and again May 1 and 2. All students must pass the TEAMS test in order to graduate from high

school. This is a state-wide, mandatory test. Students will have four opportunities in which to pass. If they do not pass the test before graduation, they may

take it after the end of the school year until they pass and will then be given their diploma.
Even if they have passing grades in every

subject, students will not graduate without passing this test, according to Catherine Patton, Woodville High School Counselor. Patton feels parents and the community should be made aware of the importance of the TEAMS test to a child's educational progress.
TEAMS consists of two parts: language and math. Students must pass both parts. If they should fail one part and pass the other, they are given one more try. Patton states the TEAMS test is separate from the TABS test which is given to elementary school children at the end of the year.
Students who will graduate this year are exempt from the test procedure.

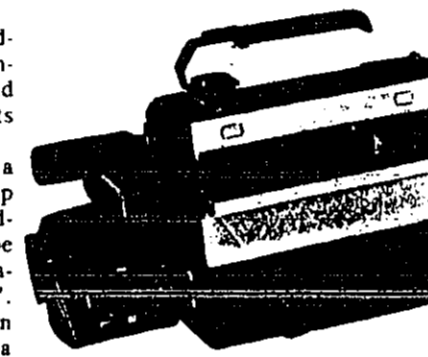
Notes From J.W.

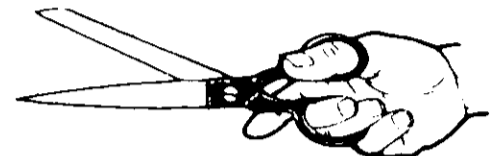

First Six Weeks!

Spurger School District is in the news twice this week. One story is the continuation of what Henry Joe Jordan in his own words calls producing the news. In other words more about the political squabbles on the deeply split Spurger School Board. So far we can count two favorites of the Press, the County Prosecutor Pat Hardy, (now Henry Joe Jordan) and the Grand Jury have said "no" to accepting the charges against four Spurger School Board members. Jordan is now pressing his case with the Texas Attorney General.
The other story is that of naming of a school at Spurger for Miss Alma McClain, a dedicated teacher who persevered for fifty years in providing instruction for innumerable students in the small saw-mill towns of Southern Tyler County.
One wonders how many Spurger style school board fights "Miss Ida" has taught through in her fifty year career. They must not have made much of an impression on her because the thing that impresses you about this teacher is her youthful positive attitude.
That attitude, more than anything, separates the two stories. Her positiveness of attitude is what seems most sadly lacking in the present school board. The votes on all issues are always four to three regardless of the issues being discussed. It shows the negative leadership of the current "reform" majority faction of the Spurger School Board.
But what are they reforming?
Dismissing the generally well run programs and destroying the positive educational achievement of Spurger school teachers and administrators over the past few years is not the road to take.
The positiveness of attitude is what is still present to a surprising extent in the teachers and other employees of the Spurger District. That is the most hopeful sign.
The Spurger School Board membership needs to find a way to settle their differences and support the dedicated cadre of teachers and other employees who are educating Spurger's next generation of students. With or without positive unified direction from their board, there is no way for this "hot" district to satisfactorily meet the challenges and pressures of the next few years.
Today THE TYLER COUNTY BOOSTER gives the student body and teachers of Spurger school an "A" in Government.
The School Board get a "D-Minus" overall and an "F" in Government.

In September Eradicate Unwanted Fish

If the fish population in your pond is hopelessly out of balance, September is a good month to remove these fish with rotenone. During October and November after water temperatures decline, your pond can then be safely restocked.

Rotenone kills fish by constricting blood vessels in the fishes' gills, suffocating them. The warmer the water, the more effective rotenone; thus, August and September are usually the best months to apply it. Some fish are more difficult to kill than others. Bullheads (mud cat, polywogs) require more rotenone than sunfish (bream, sun perch) and crappie. Bullheads inhabit the pond bottom and when maximum water depths exceed five feet, rotenone must be applied with special care to kill all the bullheads.

Soil Conservation Service personnel at Woodville can provide technical assistance in obtaining and applying rotenone. SCS personnel, who give assistance to landowners and operators through the local Long Leaf Soil and Water Conservation District, can also help pond owners compute the cost of rotenoning and restocking as well as ways to improve the balance of your fish population.

No. 2 in a series of Straight Answers from Gulf States Utilities

QUESTION

"How long will GSU have the highest residential rates in Texas?"

ANSWER

Only until November 1. GSU's rates went down 2.5% on September 1 with our reduced fuel factor and will drop another 15% in November when the lower winter rate takes effect.

Electric utilities traditionally have had seasonal rates that were higher in the summer than in the winter. Other Texas utilities recently dropped their seasonal rates, which helped give GSU the dubious and temporary distinction of having the highest residential rate in the state. On November 1, we will drop from the No. 1 spot.

As part of our next rate case, GSU will ask to join other Texas utilities in doing away with the seasonal rate. Such a step will help partially offset any rate increase that might be approved prior to next summer. In addition, GSU is going to continue aggressively negotiating for natural gas in hopes of producing additional fuel cost savings and lower rates.

The 2.5% rate reduction that took effect September 1 was a direct result of our fuel-buying strategy. If we are able to lower fuel costs even more, this would help further offset any rate increase that might take effect by next summer.

In the future, GSU's rates should be more stable than other Texas utilities, which unlike Gulf States, are not at the end of their construction programs and face the prospect of seeking more rate increases in the coming years.
