

When Pat Moore, an industrial designer and gerontology student, stepped out of her New York apartment one morning in 1979, she looked 60 years older than she had the day before! In order to understand the problems of the elderly, 26year-old Pat had taken on the appearance and mannerisms of a woman of 85. She did this at least one day a week for the next three years, visiting a total of 14 cities all over the

United States and meeting hundreds of people. During that time the young 'oldster' encountered many instances of age discrimination. She was a victim of muggers and was ignored or treated with impatience by many clerks and service people. But she also found beauty and serenity as a "senior" and established numerous friendships with others both young and old. Her conclusion: despite its obvious problems growing older can be a joyful part of life, as long as a person remains open to new experiences. Remember When? 1935-- A new board game was introduced. The manufacturer thought "Monopoly" would be

only a short-lived fad, but the game is now played in at least 38 countries and 19 languages and has sold more than 90 million coppies.

An independent firm is in the process of conducting a management audit that was commissioned by the Public Utility Commission of Texas. This audit is examining all aspects of company operations and we anticipate that it will help us identify additional areas where the company can operate even more


