



On Halloween children dress in frightening costumes, carve jack-o-lanterns, go "trick-or-treating" for candy and other special goodies and take great glee in trading ghost stories.

While some of the practices are modern,

others trace back for centuries to the New Years celebrations of the Druids. For the Celtic tribes who followed the religion of the Druids and inhabited Wales, Ireland and the Highlands of Scotland, November 1 was New Year's Day. It was also a joint festival honoring their Sun God and Samhain, the Lord of the Dead. It was common for the festivities to include human sacri-In the eighth century Pope Gregory III moved


the church festival of All Hallows, or All Saints' Day, to November 1; in the following century Pope Gregory IV decreed that the day was to be a universal church observance. It was in honor of all the saints who had died with or withou official church recognition of their sanctity. The

ored by witches and sorcerers. The modern practice of going door to door begging for candy, nuts or pennies while wearto the pagan New Year feast of the Druids. The people believed that ghosts congregated around their houses. To greet them they prepared huge quantities of food and set up eleborate banquet tables. When the feast was over the villagers, wearing masks and costumes in order to represent the souls of the dead, would march to the

eve of All Saints Day--All Hallows E'en--became

As Christianity spread, people attempted to give the costume and mask ritual a more Christian background. They said that the ritual got its beginning from the costumed parades of children who went around on the eve of All Soul's Day offering to fast for the departed souls n return for money or an offering. Another explanation is that the costuming

stems from the medieval practice of displaying the relics of saints on All Hallows. The poorer churches could not afford relics and so had processions with the parishioners dressed as the

Wash 4 or 5 medium apples and dry thoroughly. biossom end of each. caramel candies, ½ teaspoon salt and 2 tablespoons water, stirring frequently, until caramels are melted and mixture is smooth.

Keeping sauce over hot water, place each apple in hot caramel sauce) spoon sauce over apple until it is completely coated. Insert wooden are well in stem end; remove from sauce and place on waxed paper. Chill until caramel coating is firm.

Deer will feed on forbs between ber mudgrass plants and quail will use week seeds. However, when herbicides are used to eliminate forbs and weeds, bermudagrass pastures provide poor fare for wildlife. Interseeding legumes such as clover yetch, or peas will provide food for deer and turkeys during the winter and quail next spring when the vetch and peas make seed If legume seeds are properly lnoculated the plants will fix atmospheric nitrogen into a form that can be used by other plants. The costs of nitrogen fertilizer can be reduced by this practice so dink as inocultared legumes are maintained in the pasture.
