

# Congress OK's \$250,000 AE&D Funds For Rockland Dam & Lake Project

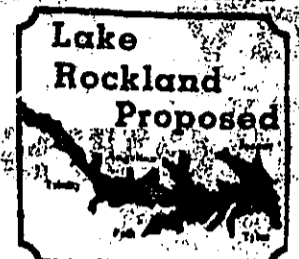

 The U.S. House of Representatives has approved \$250,000 for advanced engineering and design funds for the long-delayed U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Lake Rockland Project. The project, included in the 1986 fiscal year Water Development and Energy Appropriation bill signed by President Reagan last Friday afternoon, authorizes the Army Corps of Engineers to construct a 22-mile long and three-mile wide reservoir along the northern border of Tyler, Polk and Trinity counties in East Texas. The lake would be impounded behind a five-mile eastern Dam to be constructed two miles east of the Hwy. 69 Neches River bridge. Possibly complete as early as the year 2000, the Rockland Dam would act as a major supply of water for cities and industries in the Golden Triangle and for the city of Houston and function to reduce flooding problems on the Neches River below the Dam. The project is expected to produce inexpensive hydroelectric power for area users and provide recreation facilities for area and non-area users.

The \$250,000 funding is for a one year evaluation report of the Corps of Engineers project. As part of that report, a public hearing will be held in mid-December in Woodville and the area around the proposed lake, according to Project Manager George Prochaska. The re-evaluation report is scheduled for completion in October of 1986, says Kevin McCarthy, acting Chief of Programming for the North District office.

Long time supporter of the Rockland Project, Congressman Charles Wilson, who requested additional funding for the project, in written testimony before the House Appropriations Committee subcommittee on Water Resources last spring, said, "if from that's what the Corps needs, of I'll support it," according to Wilson's testimony last spring was accompanied by a petition signed by 346 Tyler County residents and the Rockland Project, including Lower Neches Valley Authority, including Woodville resident and Republican Don Forse who sits on the Angelina Neches River Authority and a letter of interest from the City of Houston Public Works Department Director and Former U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Galveston District Office Head, Engineer Col. Jon Vanden Bosch,

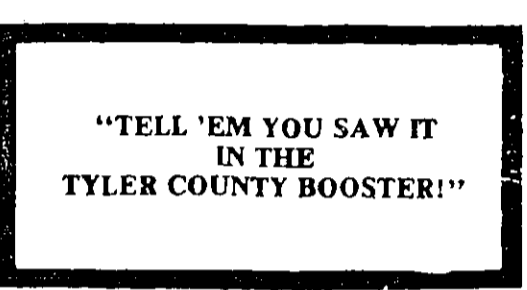
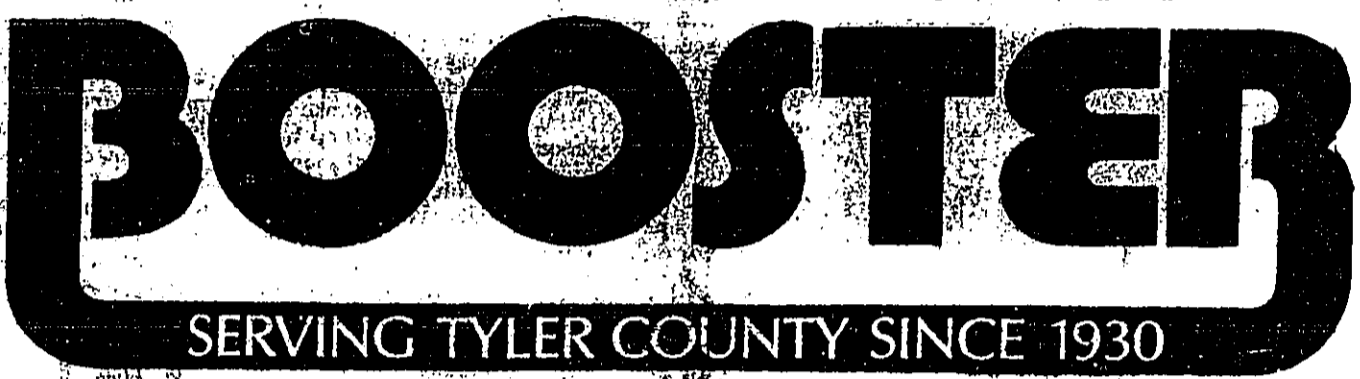

### District Board Goes To School

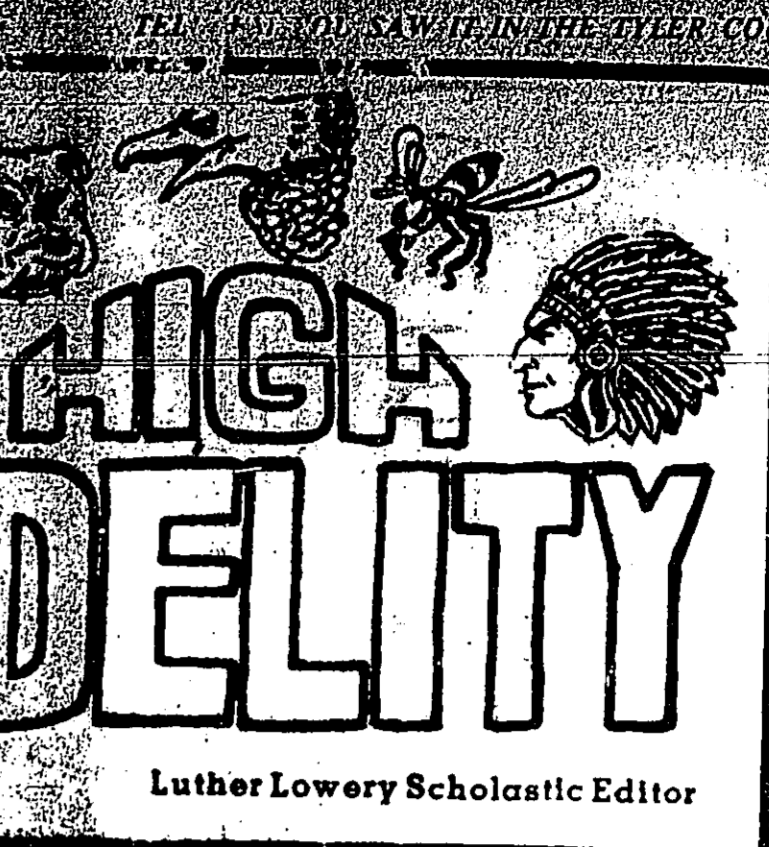

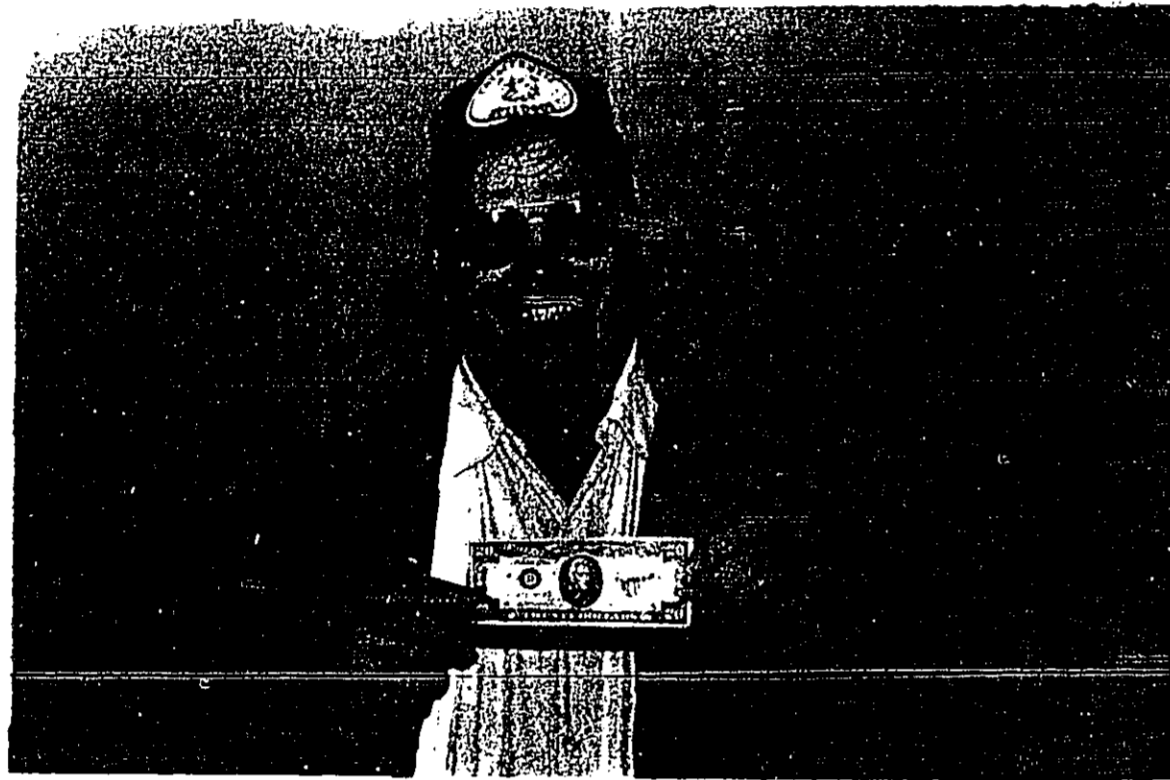
