





Pomegranates range in color from light yellow to purplish red They are the size of a large orange. When left on the tree to ripem this fruit tends to split open Therefore, they are usually picked before they are fully ripe. Cold storage, however, improves their flavor.

In selecting pomegranates, choose ones with a thin, tough skin and deep red color. Select large fruits as the kernels inside will be better de veloped. Store at room temperature. Refrigerate before serving.

Pomegranates are different from other truits. Their tiny seeds are covered with juicy sweet fruit. The seeds are edible. The connecting pull is bitter and should be discarded.

To remove the flesh-covered seeds, cut pomegranates in quarters will dish out the seeds from the shell. The juicy kernels can be used in truit ity scaloul saids and fruit cockfails.
