AUSTIN--Texas Department of Public Safety officials have estimated that as many as 29 persons will die as a result of traffic accidents during the Christmas and New Year's holidays. The DPS expects 12 fatalities during the 30-hour Christmas period and 17 deaths during the 54-hour New

Year's period. Colonel Jim Adams. DPS Director, asked motorists to maintain safe driving habits during the holidays to minimize the loss of life in vehicle crashes

'We'd certainly like to see our fatality estimates prove to be too: high," Adams said. 'Unfortunately, there will be drivers who will ignore speed limits and attempt to operate vehicles after drinking.
The best way to avoid becoming involved in an accident with a careless driver is to drive in a defensive manner. It also makes good sense to be sure everyone in the vehicle uses a 😤 safety belt."






