 You will also be enrolled in the Family Assurance Program, which enables donors and their families to receive free blood for one year. Donors are always needed, but especially at this time of year because of unexpected blood use due to accidents. Usually over 500 pints of blood per week are necessary for the 18 area hospitals dependent on The Blood Center for blood.
 The Blood Center will also conduct a blood drive in Woodville on Tuesday, January 7 and Wednesday, January 8. So if you miss the ones in Beaumont and Ft. Arthur, you can participate right here in Woodville.

Warren I.S.D. Supt. Search Moves Ahead

The Warren Independent School District Board of Trustees took another step in their search for a Superintendent Tuesday, December 17, when they appointed a committee to view Superintendent applications.
 The newly appointed committee consists of board members John Long, Walter McPherson, and Bobby Samford. Final interviews for the position will be held before the entire Board. In order to qualify for the Superintendent position, a person must meet the following requirements: (1) Earned at least a Master's degree from an accredited college or university, (2) Hold a valid Superintendent's certificate and teacher's certificate in the State of Texas and meet all requirements of the Texas Education Agency, and (3) Furnish two letters of recommendation from schools served in the past.
 The Board adopted the Discipline Management Plan. The plan had been put together by teachers, administrators and parents from the District.
 D.C. Bullard was elected Appraisal Review Board member. The results were given from the TEAMS Test which was taken by students in the 11th grade. Results were good with 83% mastering mathematics and 92% mastering language arts. The TEAMS Test replaces the TABS Test for the state of Texas.

Woodville I.S.D. Reported Financially 'Sound', Audit

 Woodville School District Trustees meeting Tuesday night, Dec. 17, unanimously approved the annual Audit report from the Woodville firm of Weaver and Smith covering the 1984-1985 school year after hearing Auditor Tommy Weaver pronounce the district "financially in good shape and having had a pretty good year." The district ended the year on August 31 of this year with a budget surplus of \$452,358. According to Weaver, money which was carried over to the current budget year and is used to start school with. In past years, we have had to borrow money to start school with. We have been fortunate the last few years," explained Alva Cook, Woodville School Board president. Weaver indicated the district had done a good job setting up everything on computer and suggested that improvements be made in bookkeeping for delinquent tax roles, complete work on an inventory of the district's fixed assets and also complete work on an internal set of controls for accurate accounting for funds from ticket sales for admission to athletic events.
 In other business, parents who give permission for their children to participate in the "Young People's Prints Program" in cooperation with the Woodville Police Department. Plans call for



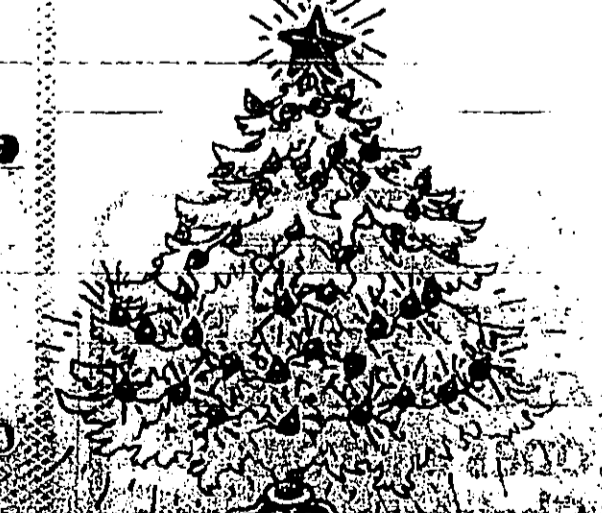

Comeback Includes Handiwork

 Friends and relatives of Gloria and Troy Copeland of Doucette will receive some very special Christmas presents this year. The fact that all the gifts (except to their children) are hand-crafted by Gloria is only part of the variety of these items.
 In May, 1985, while sitting at her desk at Citizens State Bank, Gloria suffered a stroke which caused paralysis to her right side. During her rehabilitation therapy, her doctor told her she should get back to her craft. Gloria had been doing almost all pieces of work, and she was young and full of painting lessons about 17 years ago because one of her neighbors wanted to do it, but didn't want to go alone. Now, Gloria teaches her own oil painting class. After her stroke, she "had to learn to walk again and use my left hand for writing. I couldn't do any of the detailed work."
 But with much courage and perseverance, Gloria has been able to overcome most of the difficulties her stroke caused. She still has to use both hands when doing small detail work, but the outcome is beautiful. "Some days are worse than others. I don't have any patience and get frustrated easily," she explains.
 In September, Gloria opened "The Hen's Nest" in her art and crafts shop, in a mobile home next to her house. "Getting back to my art work really helped me after the stroke," says Gloria.
 Her home is an expression of the love of life that goes into her art work. It's warm and cozy and tastefully decorated. Gloria's husband, Troy, gets involved in the business also, as he does the carpentry part of the crafts.
 "I had been trying to think of a gift for a friend of ours who collects little pigs," she says, describing how she came up with the perfect Christmas gift for a friend of the family. "All of a sudden it hit me. I had been in the So. I told Troy when he came in, and he got so excited he went right out and carved one." Afterwards, they stained it and put the clock works in and presented it to their friend for Christmas.
 "And, once while driving down the road, I spotted a piece of wood. I told my husband to pull over to get it. He said 'what are you going to do with that?' I said, 'I would make a piece of watermelon out of it.' And that's just what she did. It now sits in her dining room."
 Gloria will be starting another oil painting class in January and is sure her students will learn much about determination, talent and courage as well as the art of painting.

Host Friends With Moderation

During the holidays, fruit and ginger ale punch is no longer the main alternate choice for holiday parties. Smart hosts are now offering friends a wide range of drinks fitting the trend to moderation. Among the factors stimulating this trend are the campaigns against drunken driving and the interest in health and fitness. Coolers, spritzers and light beers are selling well. Non-alcoholic drinks are being promoted for the "designated driver," the person assigned the responsibility of staying sober so that passengers can get home safely from the bar or the party.

The host who prefers non-alcoholic eggnog prepared at home will use whole eggs, sometimes beating the egg yolks and whites separately. For Southern-style Eggnog, beat together 4 egg yolks, 1/2 cup sugar and 1/4 teaspoon salt. Three cups of milk and 1 cup of wine will need to be gradually added, and the mixture is cooked over hot water or low heat with constant stirring until it thickens and coats a metal spoon. Cool this custard sauce, add 2 teaspoons of vanilla and chill it thoroughly. At serving time, beat 4 egg whites and gradually add 1/2 cup of sugar. Beat the chilled custard until smooth and frothy and fold in the beaten egg whites. To serve this delicious eggnog, sprinkle it with nutmeg and garnish it with whipped cream.

After caroling, a Winter Warmer combining milk, a cup of port wine and a tablespoon of confectioners sugar to serving temperature. Add a sprinkle of the spice everyone's heating his flavor from the wine and only one main.)

Estimate 29 Will Die Over Holidays

AUSTIN--Texas Department of Public Safety officials have estimated that as many as 29 persons will die as a result of traffic accidents during the Christmas and New Year's holidays. The DPS expects 12 fatalities during the 30-hour Christmas period and 17 deaths during the 54-hour New Year's period.

Colonel Jim Adams, DPS Director, asked motorists to maintain safe driving habits during the holidays to minimize the loss of life in vehicle crashes.

"We'd certainly like to see our fatality estimates prove to be too high," Adams said. "Unfortunately, there will be drivers who will ignore speed limits and attempt to operate vehicles after drinking. The best way to avoid becoming involved in an accident with a careless driver is to drive in a defensive manner. It also makes good sense to be sure everyone in the vehicle uses a safety belt."

Adams said he has authorized Highway Patrol captains to utilize troopers from other uniformed Traffic Law Enforcement services to augment the regular patrol.

"Additional troopers will be assigned where large volumes of traffic or additional accidents are likely," Adams said.

During the 102-hour Christmas period in 1984, vehicle accidents caused 43 traffic deaths in Texas. A total of 42 deaths were attributed to crashes occurring during the 102-hour New Year's period last year.

The Department of Public Safety will provide state traffic death updates as part of the "Operation Motorcade" program. The counting period for Christmas begins at 6 p.m. Tuesday, December 24 and concludes at midnight on Wednesday, December 25. The New Year's counting period begins at 6 p.m. Monday, December 30 and ends at midnight on Wednesday, January 1.

7. Has your drinking caused trouble at home?

8. Do you ever try to get "extra" drinks at a party because you do not get enough?

9. Do you tell yourself you can stop drinking anytime you want to, even though you keep getting drunk when you don't mean to?

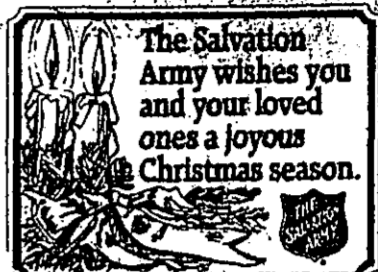
10. Have you missed days of work or school because of drinking?
