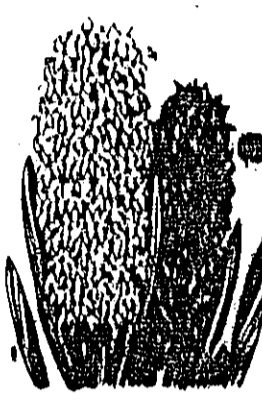


Hillister Happenings

Shopping With Diane

With frost on the ground each morning and a fire ablaze on the hearth, it's hard to remember that now is the time to select and plant bulbs for spring bloom. The hyacinth, fragrant and colorful, is one of Tyler County's favorites. They are often one of the first to bloom and are available in several delicate shades of yellow, pink, blue and purple. Both single and double-flowered forms are popular. Although often used in formal beds, the stately hyacinth can be planted informally throughout perennial beds, along a fence, or by a brick wall. Hyacinths are also frequently used to enhance rock gardens. They are impressive when planted in groups of six or more or when planted in rows. Hyacinths are particularly suited to our area because they prefer light, sandy soils which drain easily and warm quickly in the spring.

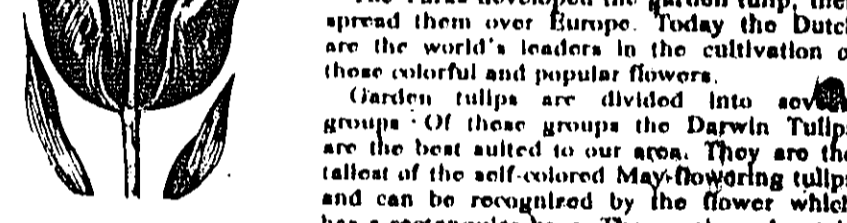

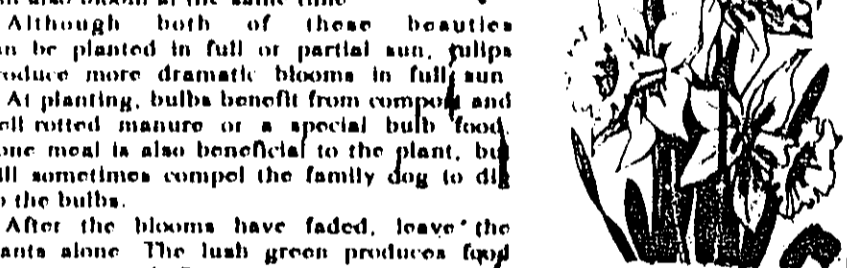
65th Anniversary

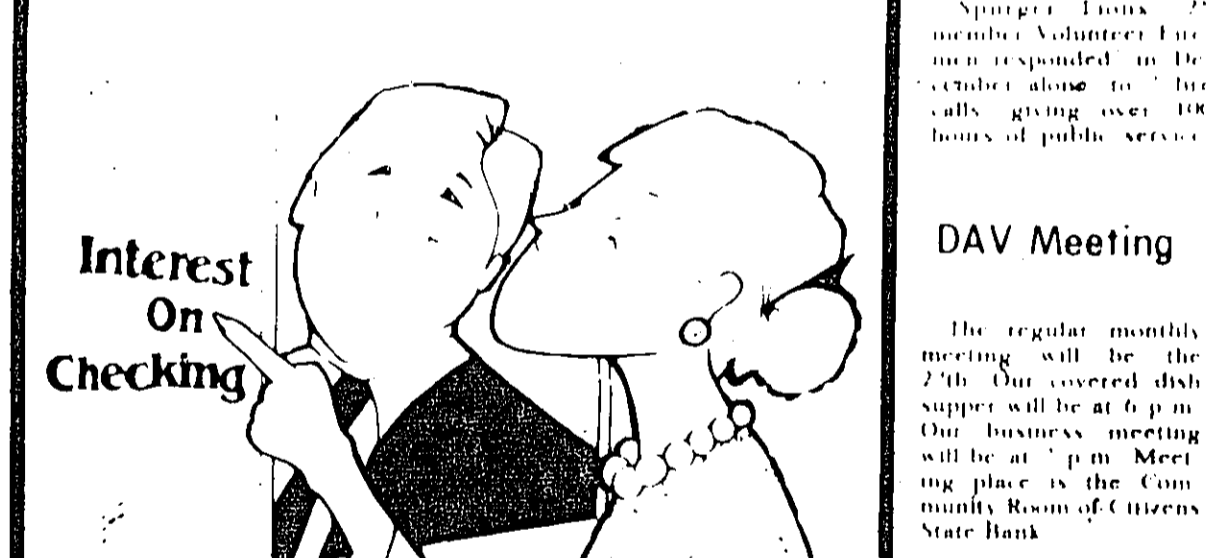
Tulips are another local favorite. They are actually natives of the Old World where they can be found from the Mediterranean to Japan. There are many species and several thousand horticultural forms. The Turks developed the garden tulip, spread them over Europe. Today the Dutch are the world's leaders in the cultivation of these colorful and popular flowers. Garden tulips are divided into several groups. Of these groups the Darwin Tulips are the best suited to our area. They are the tallest of the self-colored May-flowering tulips and can be recognized by the flower which has a rectangular base. The sepals and petals are square, pointed or rounded.



When selecting bulbs, choose those that are firm and not hollow. To avoid having to dig and re-plant the bulbs, hyacinths and tulips should be planted in uniform depth. Although both of these beauties can be planted in full or partial sun, tulips produce more dramatic blooms in full sun. At planting, bulbs benefit from compost and well rotted manure or a special bulb food. Some manure is also beneficial to the plant, but will sometimes compel the family dog to dig up the bulbs. After the blooms have faded, leave the plants alone. The lush green produce left for next season's flowers.



SPRING BULBS

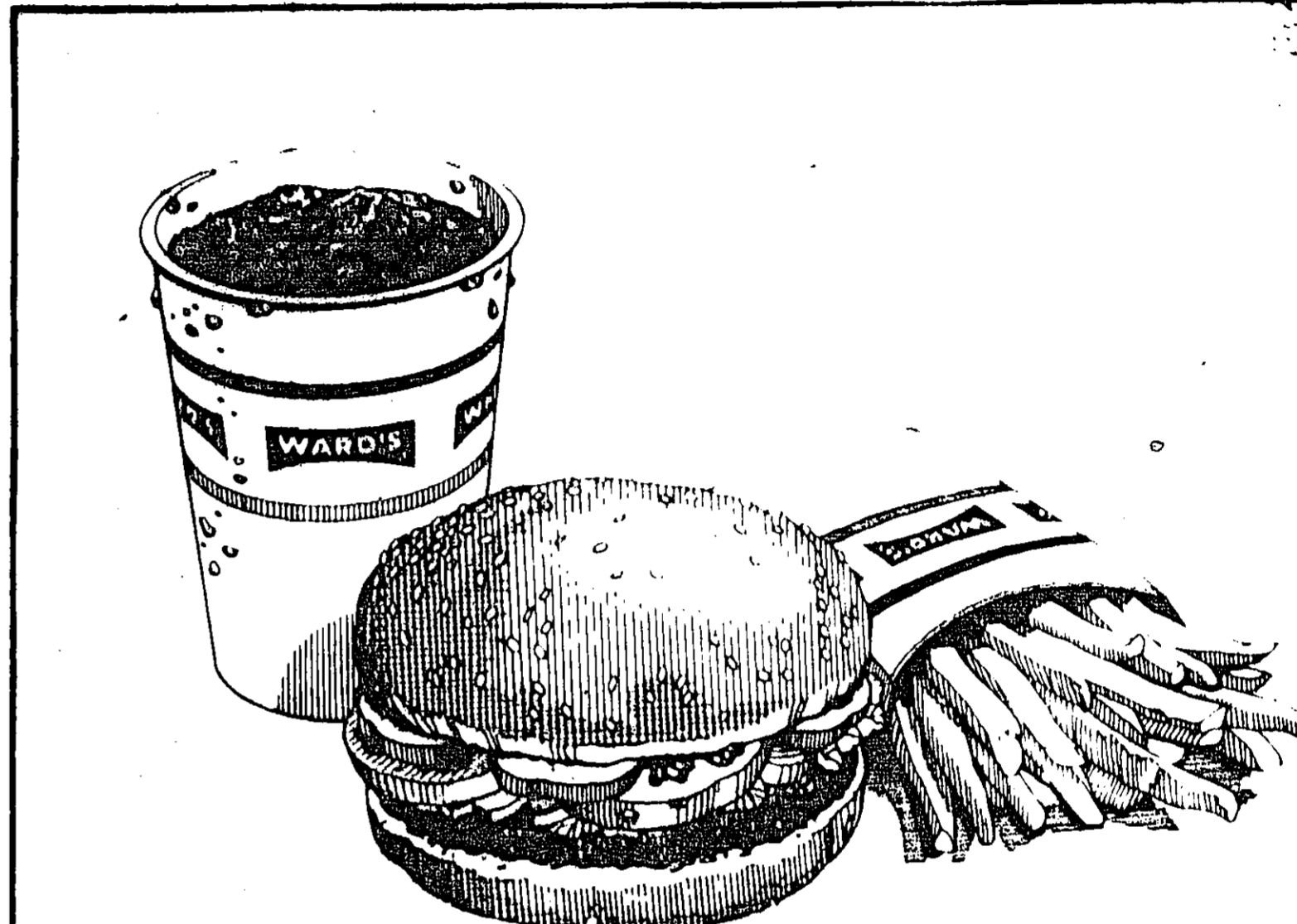
Going Into Business Workshop Jan. 30

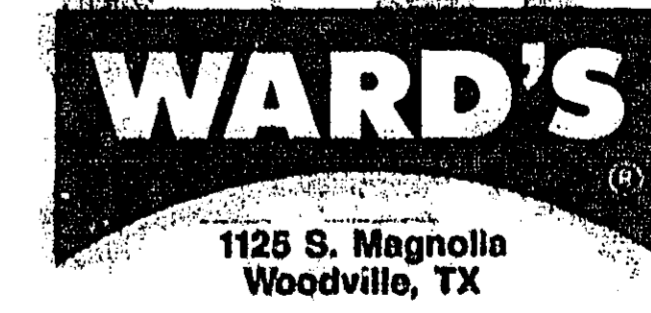

WASHINGTON D.C. Late December-early January is usually a period when most Congressional offices are decreased amounts of incoming mail. However, one office on Capitol Hill has been receiving their daily deliveries by the overload.

Congressman Charles Wilson (D. Tx) issued a two page, 46 item questionnaire early last month, to get a reading on how certain economic and legislative issues were viewed in his East Texas District. A normal return on similar questionnaires in the past has been in the neighborhood of 2000 pieces. This mailing must have struck a cord because over 15,000 forms have been returned to date, many with letters attached.

"My office has been opening and tabulating responses for the last two weeks," Wilson said. "The initial deluge has let up, but we are still receiving over 100 in each day's mail."

"Although I've never doubted the active interest of 2nd District residents in their government, and their willingness to let me know how 'Washington' is doing its job, this kind of response is gratifying." The issues covered in the questionnaire included budget priorities, tax reform, immigration reform, the U.S. trade deficit and school prayers. According to Wilson, the questionnaire format and wording drew both praise and complaints, but "even the critics are useful. We will try to fix those problems the next time around."

Wilson plans to publish the results of the tabulation in a winter newsletter.
