

## Woodville Eyes \$1.6 Million For Streets

A \$1.6 million proposed street renovation was presented to the City Council Monday night at their regular monthly meeting by engineers from Klotz/Halle, Inc.  
The project would cover virtually every city street with primary streets costing \$588,175 and secondary streets going for \$1,021,408 said Pete Dubose, Chief Engineer at the Feb. 10 meeting, in which three members were absent.  
The proposal shown to Council members gave a break down in price and material required for each street individually.  
City fathers will study the proposal and act on it at a later date.  
James Henry, Jr. of Woodville presented the Council with a petition requesting amber flashing lights at the Hwy. 287 and 69 intersection and another where 287 and Neff intersect. Councilman Brian Dabin agreed saying "I live out there and it is a danger zone."  
Mayor Pro-tem, Tom Knapp, sitting in for John Gilchrist, who is ill, made a motion which was seconded and approved by all to authorize a letter to the Highway Department to check into this problem.  
In other action, approximate cost on such a machine would be \$4,600 according to Davis. During this discussion, Sheriff Leon Powell asked to make a statement concerning a misunderstanding between City Council and County officials.  
"The only reason I'm here" says Powell, "is to clear up the misunderstanding about the street about City prisoners being held in the County Jail. Some people have said that I don't want to handle the City's prisoners or that the county is gonna start charging as much per prisoner as I never said that." He added "There's no problem as long as I'm there."  
Police Chief James Kimble agreed with Powell and said "As far as I know, there has never been a problem putting City prisoners in the county jail."  
Walt Davis explained that he believes the City needs a dispatcher but would rather leave things as they are for now and "look long and hard" at the situation before making a decision.  
Council members also approved an order for a City Officer Fleet to elect a mayor and two councilmen. The date for the election needs a dispatcher but

## Doucette Road, Jail Financing Topics

"One question I have is what kind of base will it be? The Old Doucette Road was never done right. I'm in favor of topping because I live right on the road, but if it's not done right, we're wasting our money." He added "There's not enough room now for a car and a schoolbus to pass each other. What about some speed control? Traffic will be faster on a paved road. I'm nervous backing out of my driveway now."  
Waxman answered "The County will look at different material and choose the best one for the job." He went on to say "It's a county road, not a super highway, the county will have to look at the speed limits."  
Road was concerned that if the road is paved, Commissioner's will not keep it up and it will be consumed with potholes in a few years. Pct. 1 Commissioner Maxie Riley pointed out how well the Beaumont Hill Road and another recently paved road in his precinct have held up.  
The County was able to move a step closer in its plans for a new jail by authorizing a Notice of Intent to Issue Certificates of Obligation in the amount of \$1,800,000. A Certificate of Obligation is a way for the County to finance large construction jobs, such as the jail, without having a bond election. The certificates are sold to individuals or companies in the same way a bond would be and are tax exempt right now, says George Cooper, an investment banker with the firm of Schneider, Barnes and Hickman. The money received from these certificates would be deposited in an account which would draw interest until it's needed. Cooper said "This amount should earn enough interest the first year to cover half of the first payment due."  
In other action, a Public Hearing date was set for March 10 at 1:30 to hear comments on setting weight limits on bridges and on signs posted on roads.  
Also acted on was the approval of the County Extension Report. County Auditor's Report for monthly allowance and paying a \$400 bill to Motorola for a new radio.  
Debbie Pittman was approved as a deputy in the District Clerk's Office.  
The Treasurer's and Auditor's Monthly Reports were tabled until Friday, Feb. 14 as was the setting of specific payroll dates for each month.

County Judge Meets With Governor  
AUSTIN--Governor Mark White met with Tyler County Judge Allen Sturrock and 13 other county judges and commissioners from across the state to discuss a variety of issues affecting county government, on Jan. 30, 1986.  
"County government is the foundation upon which the rest of the state is built," Governor White said. "Federal budget cutbacks compounded by additional county responsibility have created a tremendous challenge for our officials at the county level. I'm pleased to report today that, despite many problems, our county officials are meeting the challenge and helping to ensure that Texas moves boldly and securely into the 21st century."  
Among the issues of special concern to the commissioners and judges is county responsibility for implementation of health care for the indigent. Governor White explained that the newly enacted indigent health care legislation for the first time defines the counties' responsibilities for indigent health care and places reasonable limits on each county's obligation.

Flowers, along with other aromatic substances such as incense or fragrant oils, hold an interesting place in folklore and tradition. Before the discovery of bacteria and viruses, for instance, people thought diseases were transmitted through bad odors. To purify the air and ward off illness, they surrounded themselves with flowers and other scents. Upper class citizens even carried dried orange peel and other scented items to hold their noses when they encountered a threateningly bad odor.



Over the centuries, flowers took on special meanings. A single rose came to mean affection, and roses were frequently sculpted or painted on dining room ceilings. The flowers in the illustration above are said to be "sub rosa" (or under the rose) and would not be repeated.

And, of course, roses also became emblems for love. A white bridal rose signified happy love, a yellow rose indicated wanting affection, and a deep red rose stood for bashfulness. Other flowers, too, have special meanings and with Valentine's Day coming on February 14, you might want to brush up on this floral language. If you send stately gladiolus you are saying that you think he or she has strength of character. Richly colored, velvet faced pansies say "occupy my thoughts." Forget-me-nots mean true love, and fresh, delicate daisies convey innocence. For a bolder message send tulips. They mean "dangerous pleasures." Poppies promise "alliance."

To say "I'm interested" and a sweet bouquet of purple lilacs. Accent it with jonquils for a return of affection. To say "I love you" send tulips bright, satin smooth, red ones. Yellow tulips are for hopeless love and spurned romantics. The greenery in your bouquet also has meaning. Ferns indicate sincerity, olive branches, peace, and ivy, marriage and fidelity.


