Tae Kwon Do Tourney Feb. 22

In the early 1900's, a Korean woman, who was worried about other countries supplied with weapons leading her native Korea, put together a self-defense program for her countrymen, who had no weapons. She developed the hands and feet method of weaponry known today as Martial Arts.

From this small beginning, a world wide self-defense ability has progressed. There are numerous forms of martial art, each teaching its own brand of defense.

In 1962, a Korean by the name of Onyin Kim began the Tae Kwon Do method of martial art in the United States, which teaches its students to defend themselves against virtually every kind of attack.

The Southeast Tae Kwon Do Institute, which opened its school in Woodville in December of '85, stresses the fact that students should not use what they learn as a means of attack, but should be prepared to defend themselves should they be attacked.

On Saturday, Feb. 22, the Woodville school will be host to the Association's sixth semi-annual closed tournament.

In order for a student to compete, he or she must have advanced to an eighth degree yellow belt. Pupils compete according to belt degree and size.

There are two divisions in the tournament forms, which consist of the basic forms competitors have learned and Free Sparring, where students actually combat each other in elimination rounds.

Master John Mitchell, the Master Instructor of the Woodville and Lufkin schools, began taking Tae Kwon

Do 12 years ago after becoming interested in martial arts during his days in the service. He has worked his way up to Black Belt, 8th degree.

"It's an honor for the Woodville school to have been chosen for this tournament since its such a new school," says Mitchell. He added "This is the first time a Karate tournament of any kind has been held here."

The tournament will begin at 8 a.m. at the

High School Gym and last until about 6 p.m. Everyone is invited to

come out and watch the sparring matches and demonstrations.

A resolution endorsing and supporting the principle of fair and open housing was adopted by the Commissioner's Court Friday along with two other resolutions require for the Block Grant for the old Davette Road and bridge work.

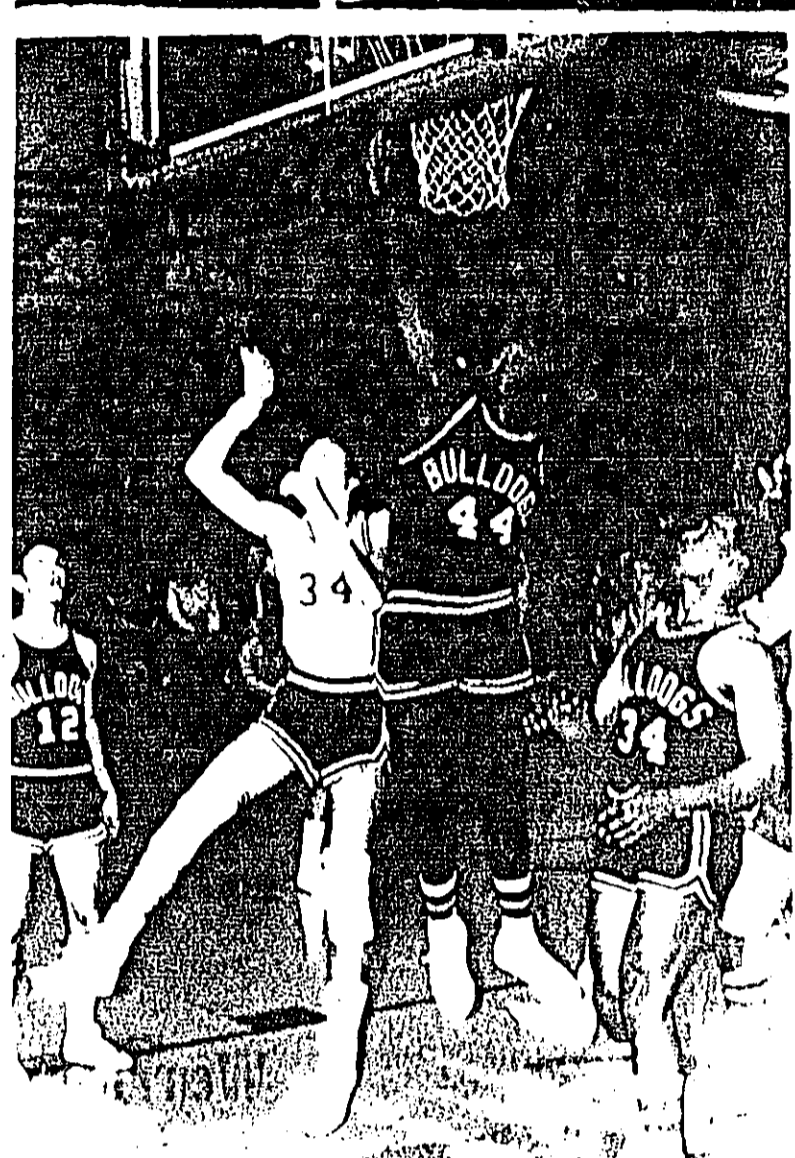
