Spurger Monitor Sought

As the result of the critical report of an Texas Education Agency (TEA) monitoring team visit on Dec. 2 and 3rd of last year the TEA has lowered the Spurger Independent School District Accreditation Status to an "Accredited Warned" status and recommended that the Texas State Board of Education consider appointing a monitor to oversee the district while it meets the recommendations called for in the report.

The monitoring team noted two violations of state education rules, failure due to late arrival of supplies for a required 40 percent of science instruction to be field/lab activities and failure of the district to "develop comprehensive curriculum guides". In addition, there were 23 "areas of concern" noted by the team including, all items of "Community Conditions", "Governance", "Instruction", and "Physical Facilities" categories. Acceptable conditions were indicated on 19

items. In the area of Community conditions the team noted "a division along two lines, one represents the old guard, the other represents a new political majority". The team recommended "the board of trustees take a more positive, professional, objective, and business like approach to conducting the business of the district". They also recommend "the district establish systematic and regular procedures for positive public relations".

The Accreditation team also indicated that "funding is not adequate to allow the instructional program to be in compliance with accreditation requirements" noting that large class sizes, multiple teacher preparations and many classes taught at the same time in the same classroom. "Generally the district needs to provide more classrooms teachers and/or instructional arrangements to meet the needs of the pupils of the district".

The report also included a number of recommendations on improvement of curriculum development and documentation of student mastery of "essential elements", criticized the involvement of Board members in the evaluation of principals and other personnel, and over involvement of the school board in handling complaints which should initially proceed through the teacher, principal, superintendent and finally the board.

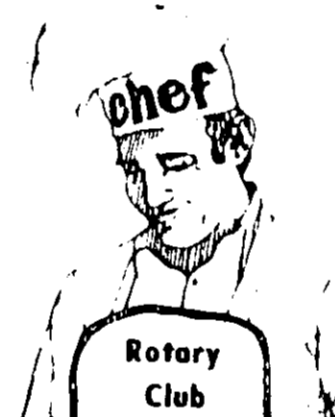

Woodville AARP To Host Melody Makers

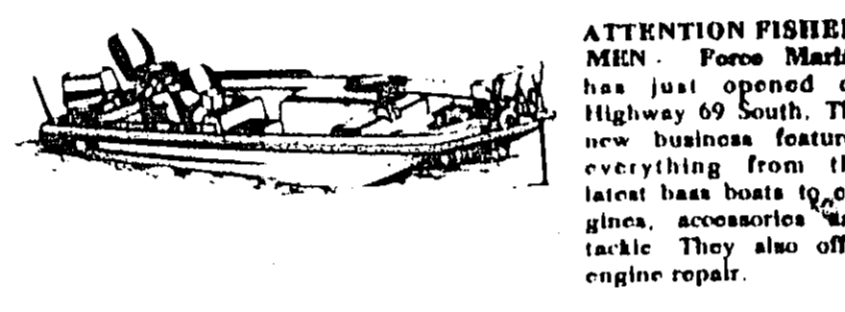

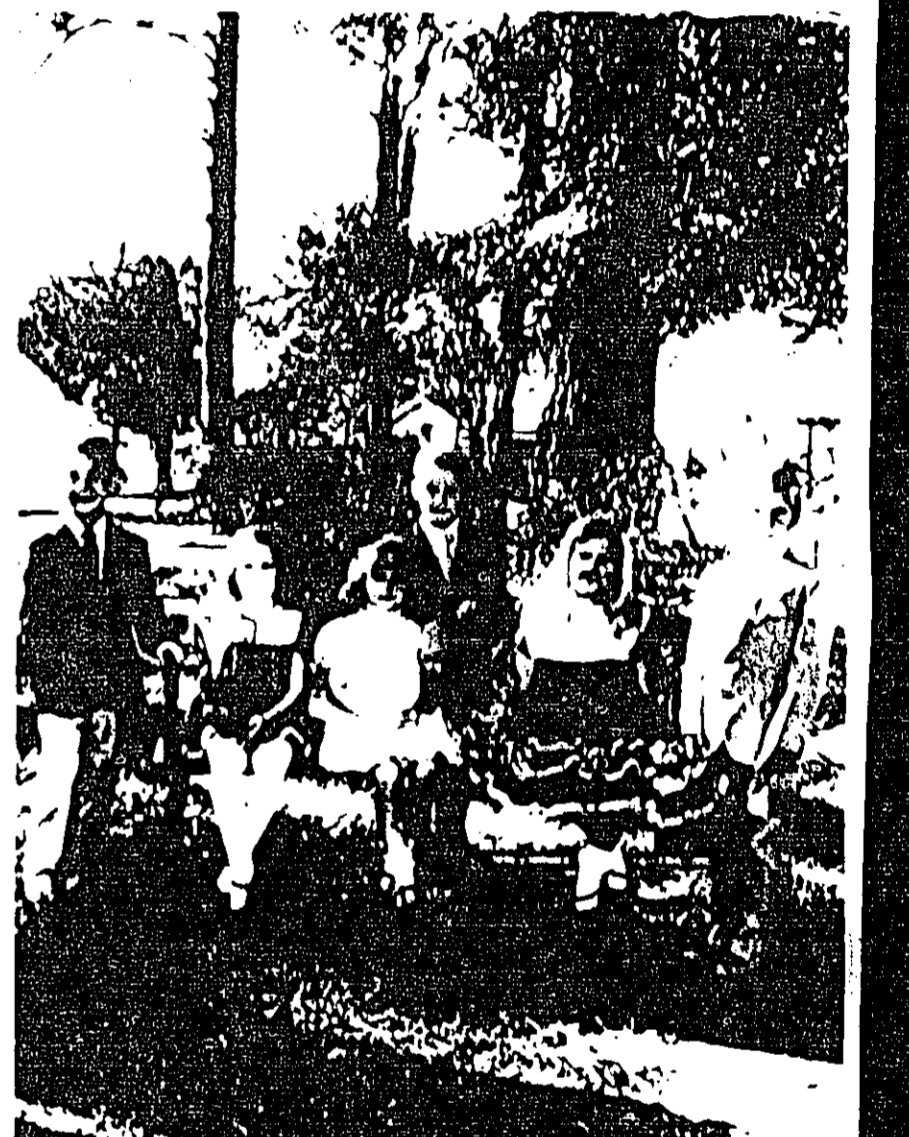
