

Hobby Is 'Mr East Texas'

Lieutenant Governor Bill Hobby was presented this week with the "Mr. East Texas" award by the Tyler County Dogwood Festival. The award is presented each year to a Texas who best exemplifies the spirit and qualities of leadership which advance, shape and give direction to the growth and progress of East Texas.

Hobby is a Houstonian, but his father, the late Governor William Pettus Hobby was born in Mosco, Polk County, and was editor of the Beaumont Enterprise for several years.

Previous winners of the "Mr. East Texas" award include Arthur Temple, Chairman of the Board of Temple Industries, former Governor Allan Shivers, former Governor Price Daniel and former state Senator Don Adams of Jasper.

The presentation was made by the Tyler County Dogwood Festival, which was the prime behind creation of a \$35 million advanced technology research fund. The money is used to finance projects in biotechnology, microelectronics, aerospace, telecommunications and other emerging technologies at state-supported universities.

The Lieutenant Governor was presented with a plaque that read: "The Mr. East Texas award is presented each year to a Texas who best exemplifies the spirit and qualities of leadership which advance, shape and give direction to the growth and progress of East Texas."

The Tyler County Dogwood Festival was first held in 1940 to celebrate the blooming of the famous East Texas wildflowers. Events include an afternoon parade, the coronation of the Dogwood Queen, and an historical pageant that this year will trace the history of the festival. The pageant is held in a natural amphitheatre decorated by more than 2,000 artificial flowers made by the people of Woodville.

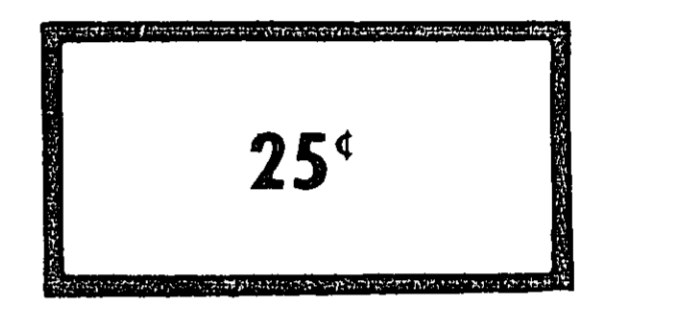

County Earns 'Bankable' Rating

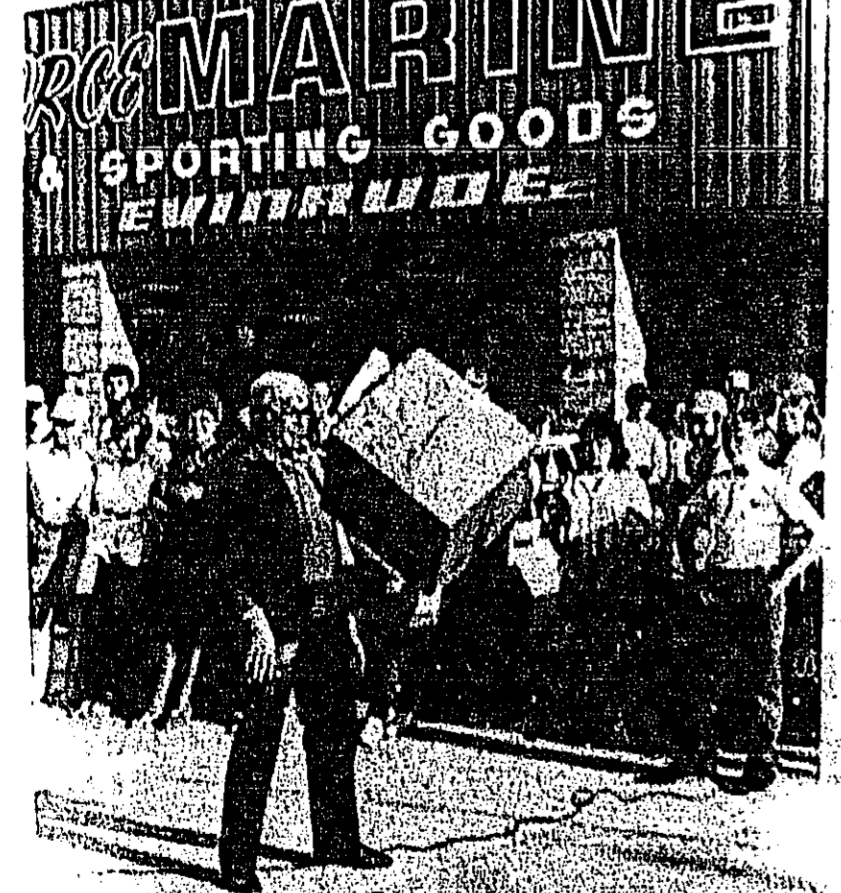
The county has received a BAA (Bankable Agricultural) rating, which is a "bankable rating" by the Moody Investment Item of New York, according to George Cooper, an investment banker with the J. Schnitzer, Barnett and Co., Inc., of Dallas. This rating means the county can proceed with its plans to issue the Certification of Obligations which will raise the \$1.8 million to be used in the construction of the new jail.

"The market is unusual to say the least," says Cooper. "And the county is in a unique position in that no other county of this size has had to issue bonds that would be comparable to Tyler County," he adds. The Certificate will be issued at an interest rate of 7.99 per cent, which is an excellent rate according to Cooper.

Local interested buyers have first choice in purchasing the Certificates, and individuals may also purchase them without having to pay taxes on the interest they earn from the certificates. Commissioners asked County Attorney Pat Hardy to check over the contract before it is signed, but did approve the Resolution to issue the Certificates.

Commissioner of Pet. 3, Willis Graham and County Judge Allen Sturrock were given the "O.K." to authorize the Historical Commission to study an area of Carlo Hill Road which may be considered a Historical Landmark.

The site is said to have Indian artifacts and possibly be an old Indian campground. Bids on the county's computer paper were opened with the lowest bid going to the Arles Paper Co. of Lake Charles, La. at \$22.25 per case. Other bidders were Hancock Co. of Nederland at \$23.00 a case. Source of Forms of Nacogdoches at \$23.02 per case. Morgan Business Forms of Dallas submitted a bid but did not list a "Per case" amount and would have charged \$21 for shipping and handling. District Attorney Pat Hardy said he would be staying with friends and would not need the additional amount of a hotel room.

Street Bond Idea Tabled

Discussion of a bond issue election to raise the needed \$1.6 million for City street repair was tabled until next month at Monday's City Council meeting. The issue was listed on the agenda for the March 10 council session, but councilmen decided to wait until all members could be present to vote on the proposed election. City secretary, Walt Davis indicated the bond issue could be as much as double taxes if passed. \$165,628.45 which is due the sewer contractor was approved for payment and council raised the two City dispatcher's salaries by 10 cents an hour to bring their pay up to the amount the County pays.

In other action, city fathers were told the City has begun the cleanup proceedings for the Dogwood Festival. "We need a little help from the citizens to pick up in front of their homes," says Davis. He added the Highway Department will be sweeping the main highways soon.

Committee Asks 'Look Spiffy By March 15'

Business and property owners along major thoroughfares in Woodville and Tyler County are asked to "spruce up" by Saturday, March 15. An influential group of tour guide operators will be in Woodville on Monday, and a "spiffy appearance" is hoped for by members of a special committee appointed by John Coker, president of the Tyler County Chamber of Commerce.

"Scrap paper pickup, mowing, edging, things that you were going to do anyway, we're asking that you do by this weekend," weather permitting, explains chairman Virginia Messick.

Walt Davis, Woodville's City Manager, said Monday that municipal crews are mowing lots as fast as possible.

State highway department personnel are scheduled to sweep Hwy. 150/69/287, but not until just prior to Western Weekend, he added.

"A friendly attitude and good community appearance will impress these VIP's mightily," said Messick. "There's no place better or prettier than Tyler County, and with dogwood and rebudbs coming out in perfect coincidence with the visit, we'll do just fine," she said.

An estimated \$2 million in tourist revenues can be expected to be generated as a result of the Waltz Across East Texas excursion sponsored by the East Texas Chamber of Commerce.

As much as \$3,500 per city per day spins off from a motorcoach tour of 45-50 people, according to information from the National Tour Association.

"You can see that it would do for Tyler County if we can get our guide operators to make Woodville an overnight stop on their itinerary," Messick said.

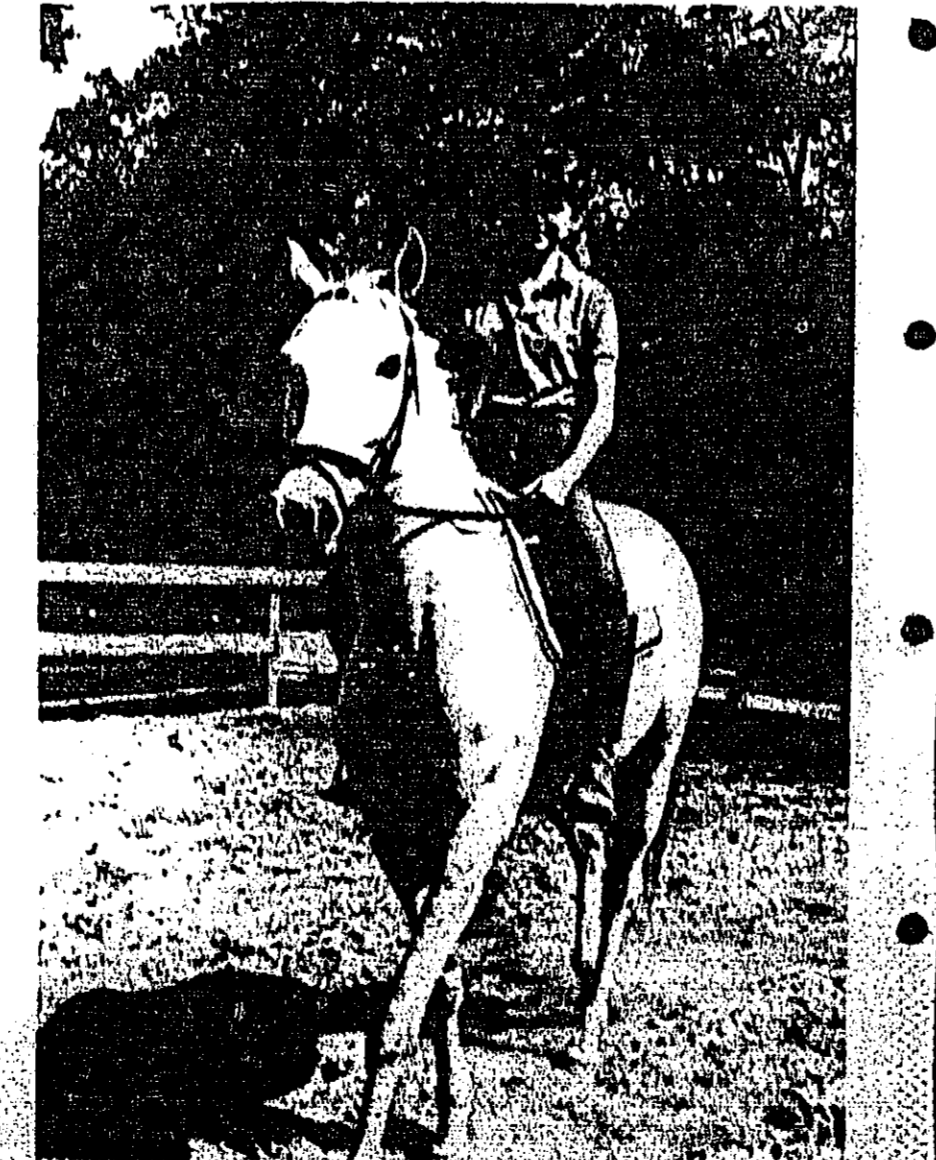

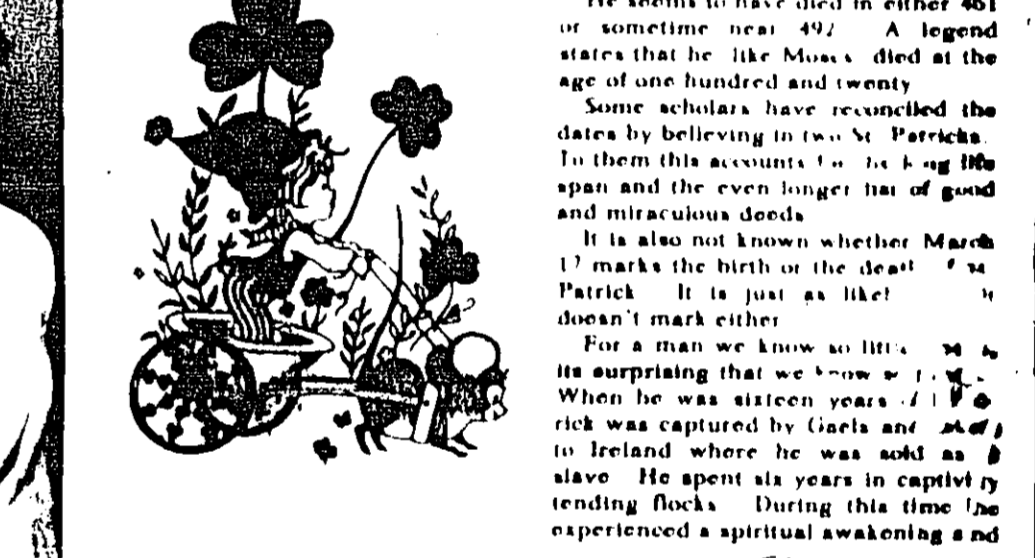

Shopping With Diane

A lot of us don't know much about St. Patrick's Day except that it's observed on March 17 and it's a good day to wear green and carry a shamrock. The interesting thing about the holiday is that even the experts don't know much about the man it's named for. For instance, the only definite statement that can be made about the birthplace of St. Patrick, the patron saint of Ireland, is that it wasn't Ireland. He is said to have been born at Kilpatrick, in Scotland. He is also said to have been born in a village close to Glanumbury, England, in Mounmouthshire, England, in Tours, France; and in Wales. St. Patrick himself says he was born in Bannavem Taberniae, but no one ever heard of the spot and it is yet to be found on a map.



It is also not known whether March 17 marks the birth of the great St. Patrick. It is just as likely it doesn't mark either. For a man we know so little about, it is surprising that we know so much. When he was sixteen years old, Patrick was captured by Irish and taken to Ireland where he was sold as a slave. He spent six years in captivity tending flocks. During this time, he experienced a spiritual awakening and began to have dreams and visions which he believed were divinely inspired. One dream told him to escape. He did, but returned to Ireland. It is documented that Patrick studied at an island monastery off France. He later became a priest, then a bishop. He returned to Ireland and spent the rest of his life there, converting Irishmen, founding churches and schools and generally organizing the Church of Ireland. One of the stories about St. Patrick which is believed to be true explains the association of the shamrock with the holiday.

It is said that when he was trying to teach his converts about the Holy Trinity, he held up a shamrock explaining that the leaves represented the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Many miracles were credited to St. Patrick. It was said that he raised his father and several others from the dead. It was also said that he burned snow to make a fire and that he caused vulture-shaped demons to die in the sea. Another story recounts how he fooled the Druids by poisoning wine they had poisoned. It is said he froze the tainted liquid, then poured off the poison. Finally he melted the wine and drank it without harm. It is believed that St. Patrick died at Saul, not far from Downpatrick. His body was thought to have been buried under the Abby of Downpatrick.
