

Chamber Hosts Visiting Travel Experts

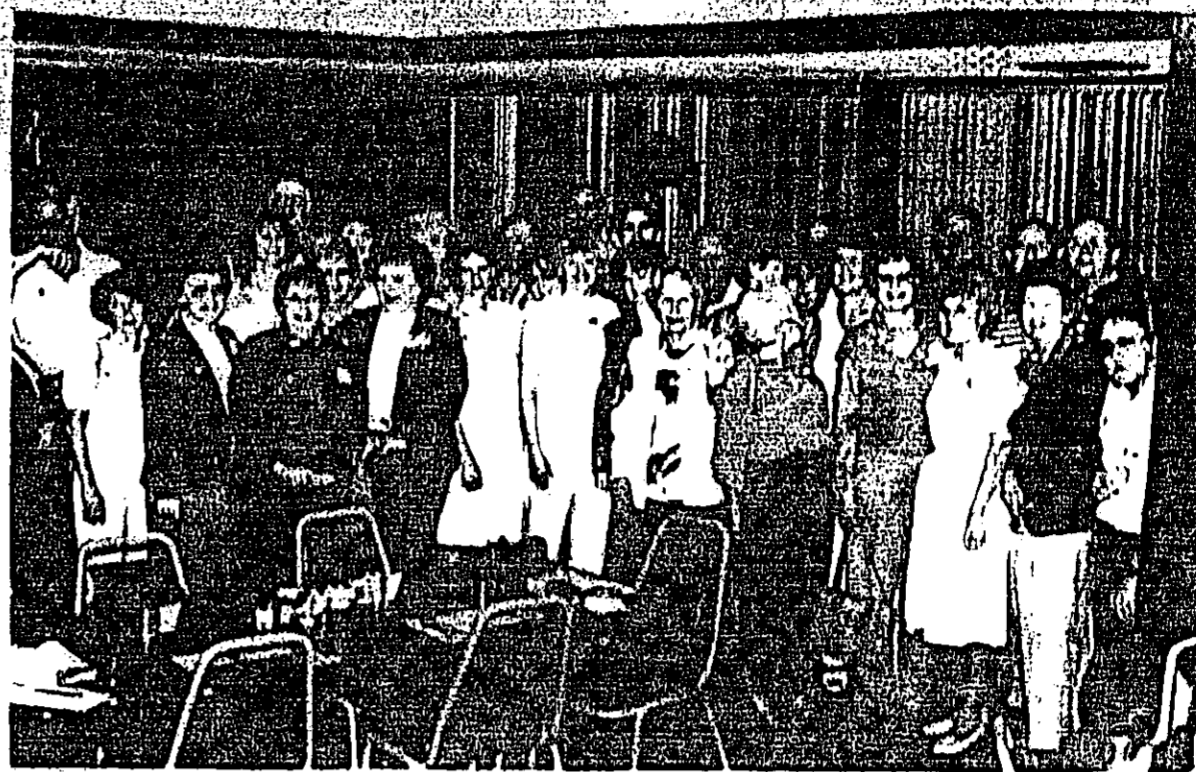


Woodville and Tyler County may soon be seeing an increase in tourism if the tour and travel planners who visited our city Monday has their way.

Tyler County was described as being the "smoothest run of all" by officials of the East Texas Chamber of Commerce who sponsored the familiarization tour, "Waltz Across East Texas." Head-On Collision Injures Two

A 7:30 p.m. head-on collision between two single occupant vehicles Sat., March 15, on Pope Mill Rd. southeast of Woodville resulted in multiple injuries for both drivers and trapped one of the accident victims in her car for approximately one hour until she was freed by a Woodville Jaws of Life team. The incident involved two Woodville residents, Madelon Graham McKinney, 39, who was reportedly travelling south and Jim Sterling, 46, who, according to Dept. of Public Safety investigating officer, Mike Scales, was travelling north; the two impacting at the crest of a hill located in front of the Rev. R.C. Tillery residence. Keep Election Signs Off Highways

Candidates for Office in the upcoming elections should be aware of a new law passed recently by the Texas Legislature which prohibits campaign signs from being erected along an Interstate or Primary Highway, even on private property.

If the private properties are adjacent to various State maintained highways, candidates, campaign managers and supporters must obtain a State License to engage in outdoor advertising business and secure a permit for each sign location, according to

official traffic control signs, are allowed within the limits of the right of way of any road or highway. (To Page 8A)

On Saturdays real chocolate lovers can get a chocolate treat that made from chocolate dough. If you've got a special occasion coming up you'll want to give Janice or Joyce a call. They offer sheet and layer cakes for birthdays, weddings, anniversaries or any other special events. The cakes are made to your request and can be decorated in a variety of cheerful colors. Cookies and cupcakes can also be ordered. The Donut and Bake Shop also offers sausage and homemade biscuits and Pigs In A Blanket. By those of you that don't know what this is it's a spicy link sausage wrapped in dough and baked until it's golden brown. In addition to these tempting items you can get a fresh salad that's loaded with your garden favorites. The salads are offered in several sizes, including a delux which is topped with chicken or tuna salad. According to Janice, homemade onion rolls, french bread and bread sticks will be offered soon.

NIW BUSINESS

SOME THING FISHY

If you're not hungry for seafood now, I guarantee you Market, one mile south of Calmeswell on Highway 69. The display cases are stacked full of several sizes of fresh shrimp, deviled shrimp, crawfish tails, catfish, buffalo and crabmeat. You can also purchase fresh oysters by the quart or half gallon and crawfish and live crabs (when available). According to owners Amos and Fay Miller, the shrimp is straight from the shrimp boat in Cameron, Louisiana, and the oysters are fresh from Dosey's Oyster House, also in Louisiana. The Millers opened their business on February 15 and make several trips a week to pick up inventory. "We like to make the pick-ups ourselves," says Fay. That way we know the seafood is fresh.

The market also carries Cajun Bouffee Mix for crawfish or shrimp, Scattered Fish Fry, Cajun Gumbo Mix, Creole Crab Ball, Creole Gumbo File and Roux and Gravy Mix.

According to Amos, the business offers special prices for large advance orders and will offer frozen deals during the season. They will also offer fish shrimp this summer.

The Market is open five days a week, from 9 a.m. until 6 p.m. They accept food stamps.

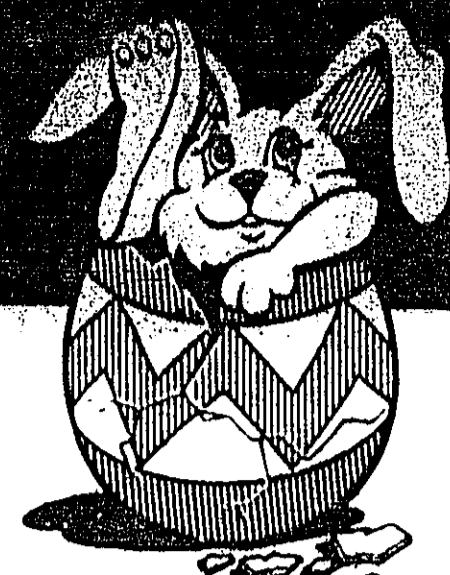

Tour Operators Visit APPLE SPRINGS -- The sights, sounds and smells of the forest await Texas who are looking for an interesting place to visit, that isn't far from home, and doesn't cost a fortune.

And with Spring near the agenda, from mid-March to mid-April, is one of the best times of the year to visit to see colors, flowers, natural beauty and plenty of dogwoods in bloom.

To be sure, a drive to any of the National Forests in Texas is free, like than a day away from any place within the eastern one-third of the state and a memory-making experience.

Now is an especially good time to visit the Trinity District of the Davy Crockett National Forest where Roger Dick Lukes has planned a self-guided tour for visitors that includes blossoming dogwoods and various stages of managed forest areas.

For adults it's a continuing education and for youngsters it's an experience in dealing with nature. For the whole family, it's a relaxing, fun, and interesting picnic, picnicking and fun.

The trip should start at Lukes' office in Apple Springs, where visitors are encouraged to pick up a "welcome packet." The packet describes the forest, offers plenty of pertinent information, and provides a step-by-step driving instruction which makes the tour simple.

'Financing Fallacy'

THOUGHTS
 If you can get someone else's share of money, then, with your disproportionate share, you can exploit him. Consider:

The Federal Reserve Banking System has the authority to set an upper limit on the ratio of the amount of money its member banks can loan with respect to the money held in their vaults. This ratio is 7 to 14 times the amount of money in the vaults.

The above is what you are taught, even by our leading economist, regardless of whether they are pro or con for the existing system. The above concept is very misleading. You can not loan, give, use or do anything that is not in existence. Hence:

- bank cannot loan money it does not have or does not create. So, before it loans money, that is not in the vault, the new money must be created.
- If you make a loan using a promissory note, then, since money is any redeemable debt, basically, your promissory note becomes the money which you borrow. The bank didn't sign the note. You did. Hence, you created the money.
- Suppose a certain bank loans out six times the amount of money it has in the vault, then 5 parts of the money it loans is money it does not have, nor does it create. The other 5 parts being created by the issuer or person creating the loan.
- Here in lies the enigmatic situation, the bank charges interest on all six parts of the loan and keeps all of the interest. Reason would tell you that the party creating 5 parts of the money should get 5 parts of the interest. An example will point out how devastating this can be, and too often is, to the borrower.


