## Alabama Coushatta Indian Tribe Seeks Gambling Stop

The Alabama Coushatta Indian Tribe of Texas, together with the Yelata del Sur Pueblo of El Paso, has requested its representatives to amend the federal restoration legislation to provide for the outright prohibition of bingo or gambling in any form on the Tribes Reservation. As you know, the Comptroller Gullett has expressed concern that the restoration legislation would permit the Tribes to conduct high-stakes bingo and gambling operations on our Reservation without regulation by the state of Texas.

Our Tribe has repeatedly stated that we have absolutely no interest in conducting bingo or gambling operations of any kind, the Comptroller's proposed amendment which would permit the state to directly regulate on the Reservation -- was unacceptable to the Tribe because it would carve out an exception to our tribal powers of self-government. The amendment which we are now requesting would prohibit bingo and other gambling and thus goes far beyond the Comptroller's suggested amendment -- which would simply regulate such activities. We have chosen this course of action because an outright prohibition of all gambling regardless of whether it would be governed by state law, federal law, or tribal law.

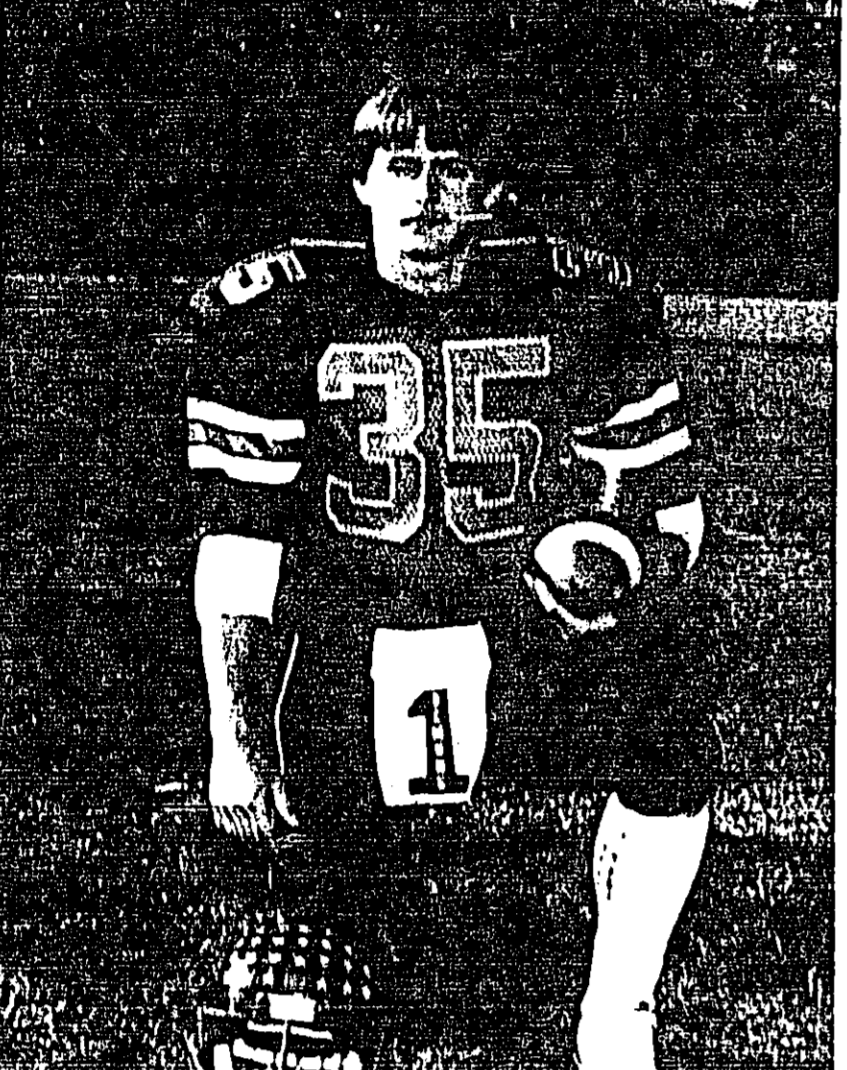

# Woodville Middle School Sweeps U-I-L Meet

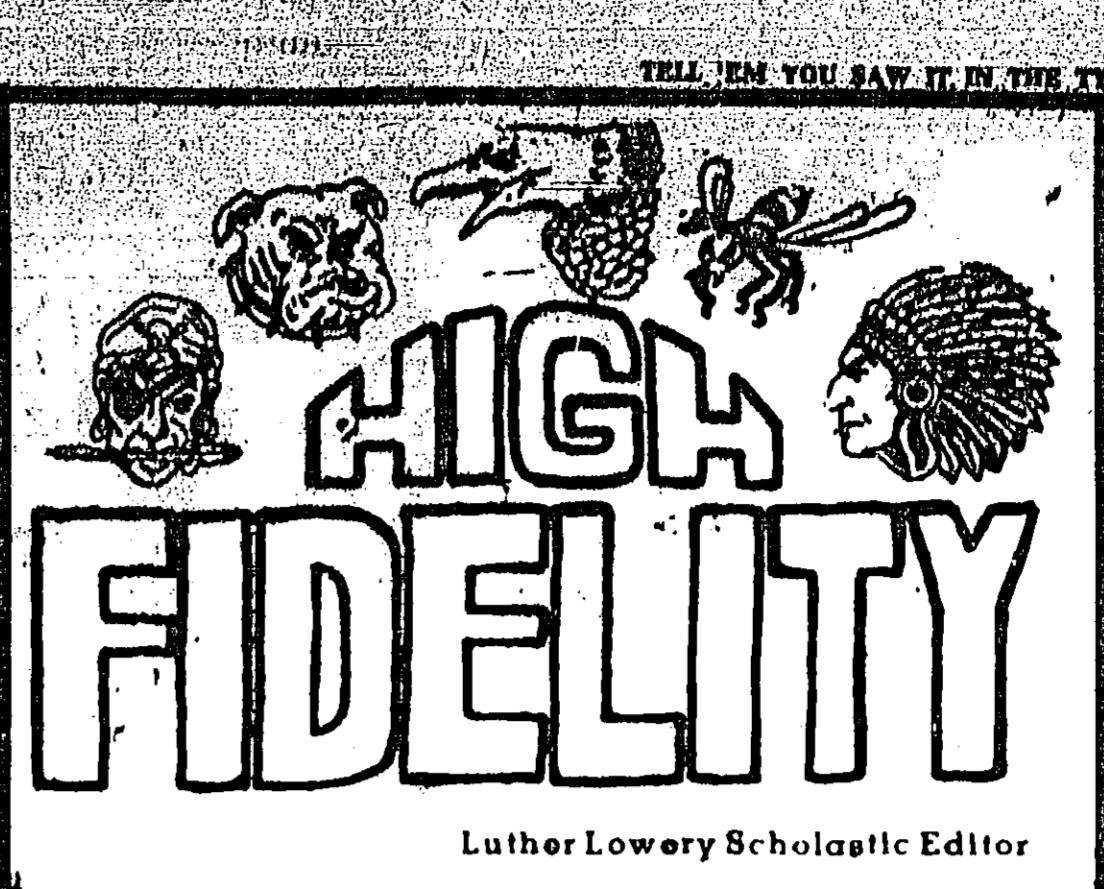

# Texas' Lieutenant Governor Bill Hobby Is Mr East Texas



Lieutenant Governor  
William P. Hobby

Bill Hobby, Texas lieutenant governor for 12 years, has served in that office longer than any other person elected to it. When he was first sworn into office in 1973, Bill Hobby continued a family association with the Texas Senate covering three generations and spanning more than a century.

His grandfather, Senator Edwin Hobby, represented the Piney Woods region of East Texas in the legislature from 1894 to 1899, later serving as a district judge and supreme court commissioner. Prior to his tenure as Texas' governor, Bill Hobby's maternal grandfather, J.W. Culp, who served three terms in the house of representatives, ran unsuccessfully for lieutenant governor in 1920.

William Pettus Hobby, Jr., was born in Houston on January 19, 1932. After attending Rice University and receiving his degree in 1953, he entered the United States Navy and served for four years in naval intelligence. Subsequently, he joined the staff of the Houston Post, at the time published by his father, and advanced through several editorial positions. As his father's health declined, Bill Hobby assumed increased managerial responsibilities at the newspaper company. He became executive editor and president of the Houston Post Company in 1965, the same year he was honored by the Texas Junior Chamber of Commerce as one of its "Five Outstanding Young Texans." Widely respected by his colleagues in the journalism and communications fields, Bill Hobby was president of the Texas Daily Newspaper Association in 1971 and has served several times as a member of the committee advising the jury awarding the Pulitzer Prize in Journalism.

Bill Hobby received his first major exposure to the governmental process when he served as senate parliamentary officer of the 65th Legislature in 1959. Later, during the presidential administration of Lyndon B. Johnson, he was named to the Presidential Task Force on Suburban Problems and to the national Citizens Advisory Committee on Vocational Rehabilitation. In 1969 Bill Hobby was appointed to two state level posts. As public member and chairman of the Senate Interim Committee on Welfare Reform, he headed an extensive review of the state's welfare system. He was also named to the Texas Air Control Board.

In 1971 Bill Hobby resigned from the Texas Air Control Board to run for lieutenant governor in 1972. He was elected and presided over the senate of the 63rd Legislature, where, as chairman of the Legislative Budget Board, he promoted policies to improve the state's budget making process. Governor Hobby was a leading advocate of zero based budgeting, a system that was adopted by the state and that required agencies to justify their programs irrespective of previous budget levels. Another budgetary mechanism that was adopted was the fiscal note, which is attached to proposed legislation that requires appropriations in order to be implemented, the legislature can anticipate a measure's likely fiscal impact.

In 1972 a constitutional amendment was adopted lengthening the term of office for lieutenant governor from two to four years. Since 1974, this year, this change became effective. Bill Hobby has three four year terms in office by Texas voters. One of his significant activities during his ongoing tenure in state government was his chairmanship of the Joint Advisory Committee on Government Operations, a body created by the 64th Legislature to review and investigate ways of increasing the economy and efficiency of state agencies. As a result of one of the committee's recommendations, the 65th Legislature in 1977 passed the Texas Sunset Act providing for a system of periodic review and automatic termination or legislative renewal of most state agencies. He also recently served on the Select Committee on Public Education that met from 1983 to 1984 to study issues of educational reform and finance.

Bill Hobby serves as chairman of the Texas Legislative Council and the Budget Board as well as vice-chairman of the Criminal Justice Policy Council. His ex officio roles also include membership on the Texas Advisory Commission on Intergovernmental Relations and on the special committee established to adopt limits on the rate of growth of appropriations.

He has always been affectionately known to his family and thousands of friends, was born in Dayton, Liberty County, Texas, on Nov. 20, 1915, the son of Marion Price Daniel, Sr., and Nannie Parlow Daniel.

Two of his predecessors came to Texas with Stephen F. Austin's Colony in 1823. All six were pioneer Texas Patriots who played prominent roles in eventually freeing Texas from Mexican rule.

An eminent Trial Lawyer, Gov. Bill has practiced Civil and Criminal Law in the State and Federal Courts for more than 40 years. He is a member of the

# Roy Blake To Marshal Dogwood Week Parade



State Senator Roy Blake

State Senator Roy Blake of Nacogdoches was born in Nacogdoches County and has been a lifelong resident of Nacogdoches.

He attended the public schools in Nacogdoches. He attended Texas A&M University and Stephen F. Austin State University where he earned a B.S. Degree.

He is married to the former Mae Deanne Goodwin of San Augustine and they are the parents of five children. Blake is in the general insurance business with his son in Nacogdoches.

He served on the Nacogdoches City Commission for six years and ran a successful race for a seat in the House of Representatives where he served for five years. He was elected to the Texas Senate in a special election in 1978 and was reelected to a full term in November of the same year. He successfully sought reelection winning without a runoff over two opponents and carrying each of the 15 counties.

Blake was appointed Chairman of the Senate Committee on Administration in 1981 and was the first freshman member to receive a committee chairmanship. He also serves on the Finance Committee, the State Affairs Committee, and the Subcommittee on Nominations.

He has always been an active member of the Legislature, but in the 68th Session which concluded in May, he was more than active. After the tragic fire which occurred in February, he was on the scene within hours. Since the Administration Committee is in charge of all of the physical facilities of the Senate, he was faced with relocating ten senate members' offices that were heavily damaged.

# Bill Daniel Is Western Marshal For Parade Saturday March 29

William Parlow Daniel of Liberty County, State Senator, Ranchman, Churchman, Landman, Historian, Orator, Philanthropist, and Showman -- was Governor of the U. S. Territory of Guam from 1964 thru 1963, among a host of other distinctions which this tall Texas has earned during a long and eventful career.

"Governor Bill", as he is affectionately known to his family and thousands of friends, was born in Dayton, Liberty County, Texas, on Nov. 20, 1915, the son of Marion Price Daniel, Sr., and Nannie Parlow Daniel.

Two of his predecessors came to Texas with Stephen F. Austin's Colony in 1823. All six were pioneer Texas Patriots who played prominent roles in eventually freeing Texas from Mexican rule.

An eminent Trial Lawyer, Gov. Bill has practiced Civil and Criminal Law in the State and Federal Courts for more than 40 years. He is a member of the

American, Texas, Guam, Alaska, U.S. Pacific Trust Territory, and Liberty County Bar Associations; the American Jurisprudence Lawyers Association; and Texas Criminal Defense Lawyers Association and others.

He is a 1938 graduate of Baylor University with LL.B. and Doctor of Jurisprudence degrees; a Counselor of the Baylor Law School and an active member of the Baylor University Development Board.

In addition to his law practice, he heads a number of GOV. BILLY DANIEL ENTERTAINMENT PRIZES, INCLUDING Plantation Ranch.

Since his father's death in 1937, he has been President of the Daniel Land and Cattle Company, Inc., veteran activist in developing Liberty County land, cattle, oil, gravel and lumber. Founded by Gov. Bill's father in 1912 it is now the oldest firm of its kind in the area.

For several years, he was Attorney and Secretary for the Liberty Board of Trustees.

He distinguished himself as a vigorous Prosecutor after he was elected Liberty County Attorney in 1942, and then served unopposed for several terms in the Texas Legislature. While there, he authored many economic, social and educational improvements, including the new housing of our State Archives, Supreme Court and several State Office Buildings. The Liberty Historian waged a six-year vigil-fight to get Texas' Declaration of Independence and other "sacred" historical records off the dirt floor of an old dairy barn in North Austin and into Texas' beautiful, new Archives Building.

Gov. Bill was the Attorney for Miss Yettie Kersting and helped her to write her Will setting up the Kersting Memorial.

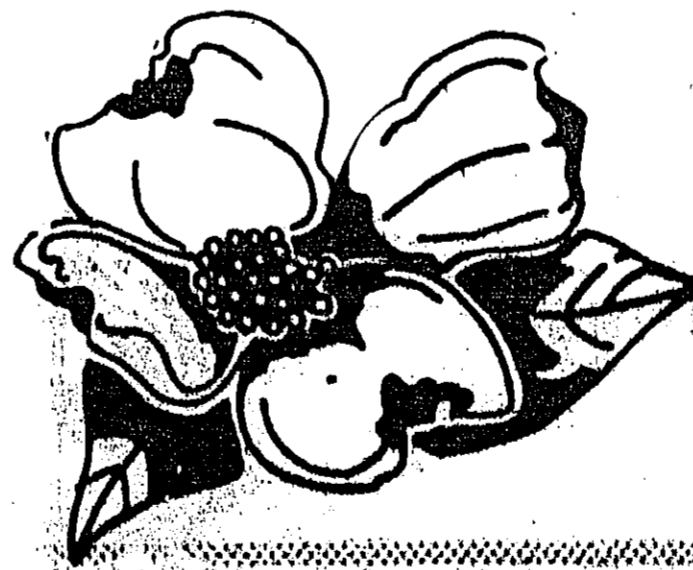

### The last flag of the Alamo...

In the blood red dawn of March 6, 1836, a single blue flag still flew over the topmost point of the Alamo. On the blue banner were the words "First Company of Texan Volunteers from New Orleans, God and Liberty". It was to be the last flag flown by the Texas garrison, and it typifies the story of the Texas fight for independence.

In October of 1835, a meeting was held at Bank's Arcade in New Orleans. There, a group of Texans led by Adolphus Sterne of Nacogdoches offered rifles and aid to the first men who would join the Texas fight.

Two companies of volunteers answered Sterne's plea and formed The New Orleans Greys - over 100 men from 12 states and 6 foreign countries who joined "the noble cause". The Louisiana Volunteers received their flag at San Augustine and carried it to San Antonio, to Goliad, and finally into the siege of the Alamo.

Of the 182 men who died defending the Alamo, no record remains telling how many were part of The New Orleans Greys. Only the men's names were known - not their battle units. And it doesn't really matter.

During those immortal 13 days at the Alamo, all the men became more than a garrison of different units. As John Meyers later wrote, they became eternally "symbols of valor in the minds of men".
