



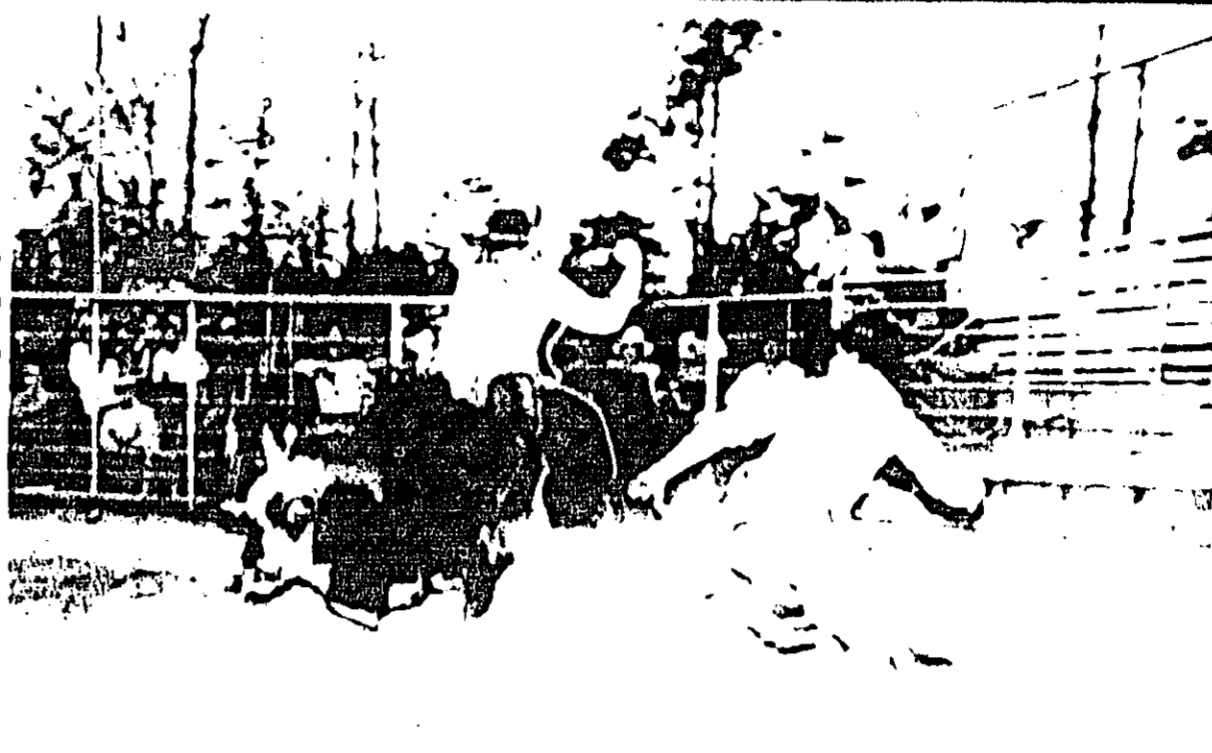

## 'Dogwood Day' Elections Feature Local Races

Elections will be held Saturday, April 5, from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., to fill positions in all five Tyler County school districts and all three county municipalities. Spurger and Warren School Districts have contested races and two of the counties cities, Colmesneil and Chester, have more candidates running than the num-

ber of positions to be filled and Colmesneil has a contested race for Mayor. In the contested races for Spurger School Board incumbent Board member in Position 3, Pete Hollis will run against incumbent Board member Mooney Hicks in Position 5. Position 4 candidate Willie Chapman, son of

late Board member, James C. Chapman, will run unopposed, and incumbent Position 4 Trustee Eddie Norman is running for Board Position 3 where he is opposed by a former school trustee Henry Joe Jordan. The election will be held in the Spurger School Vocational Agriculture Classroom building.

Warren School District will elect three Trustees with incumbent Position 1 Trustee, Walter McPherson, opposed by challenger MacDella Higgins, incumbent Position 2 Trustee Marvin Fannin running unopposed and candidate for Position 3, Walter McAlpin also running unopposed. Voting will take place

at the Warren Jr High Library, Fred Elementary Library, and at Village Mills Baptist Church. Colmesneil City residents will choose from three candidates for mayor, incumbent Mayor pro-tem C.J. Ogden, James Harold Brown or Jonathan Sears. There are also five candidates. Leonard

Durham, Joe Hughes, Henry Ogden, Kenneth Powell, and Sam Rivers for four alderman positions. Voting will take place at the Community Center in Colmesneil. Chester city residents will choose from four candidates, incumbent Pat Cherry and Clarence Woodrome, Alton Woodrome and

K.C. Lawson for three council positions. Voting will take place at the Chester Lion's Den. In Woodville School Trustee elections incumbent Position 6 Trustee Dr. Jim Jinnette, incumbent Position 7 Trustee Jerry Hulbert are running unopposed. Voting will take place in the Woodville Intermediate school

on North Charlton. In Woodville, incumbent city councilman Tom Knapp is running unopposed for Mayor following current Mayor John Gilchrist's decision not to seek the post again, and incumbent councilmen Dr. Mahom Radford and Dr. Bryan Babin are running unopposed for re-election. Voting will be

held at the Woodville Fire Station. Chester School Trustees Steve Watts and Raymond D. Klores are running for election unopposed with voting to be at the Chester School Cafeteria. Colmesneil School incumbent Trustees J.R. Henderson and Jimmy Crews are running unopposed for re-election with voting to be held at the Colmesneil Community Center.

## Bridge Limits Court Topic

State recommended weight limits were approved for Tyler County roads and bridges by Commissioners Monday during a special meeting and public hearing. Mazie Riley, Commissioner for Pct. 1 suggested the county set these limits on each road and bridge individually and use the State's recommended weight limits. "This" he said "does not actually limit the weight which can cross these roads, it only tells you what the safe limit is."

If a bridge is labeled safe for 10 tons, and a truck carrying 15 tons goes over it and the bridge collapses, the county can not be held responsible, according to Riley. Commissioners also agreed to set up all signs in their precinct.

Red Pitts, of Woodville, showed up for the public hearing and asked commissioners to try to do something about the amount of unnecessary traffic which travels down this road. Commissioners approved a measure to put up a "No Throughfare" sign for that road which is located south of Woodville between the

old and new Beaumont Highway. The new weight limits will be posted in the County Clerk's Office for public viewing. J.C. Raybuck of Woodville was appointed to be an emissary for Tyler County residents in the case of a dispute with the Mental Health Mental Retardation Department. Should a resident feel he or she were not receiving fair treatment from the MHMR, Raybuck would intercede in their behalf. Also today, the county began condemnation proceedings against two tracts of land owned by Jim Sullivan and located at the intersection of highways 190 and 92. Sullivan has repeatedly refused to allow the county to purchase this land which is needed for the right of way at this intersection, according to Willa Graham, Pct. III Commissioner.

Joe Smith, former District Attorney for Tyler County, will handle the proceedings. Commissioners turned down a contract with Bill Jefferson, a telephone consultant, which would have cost taxpayers \$400 per year

in a service contract. Also given "thumbs down" was a legal protection insurance plan for county employees as a group. Employees may take out the insurance on an individual basis if they wish. This policy, which is through J.T. Henssling Insurance Company, provides legal aid to members on personal matters. For a monthly fee, members are guaranteed certain legal fees will be paid up to a set amount. County officials did not feel this type of coverage

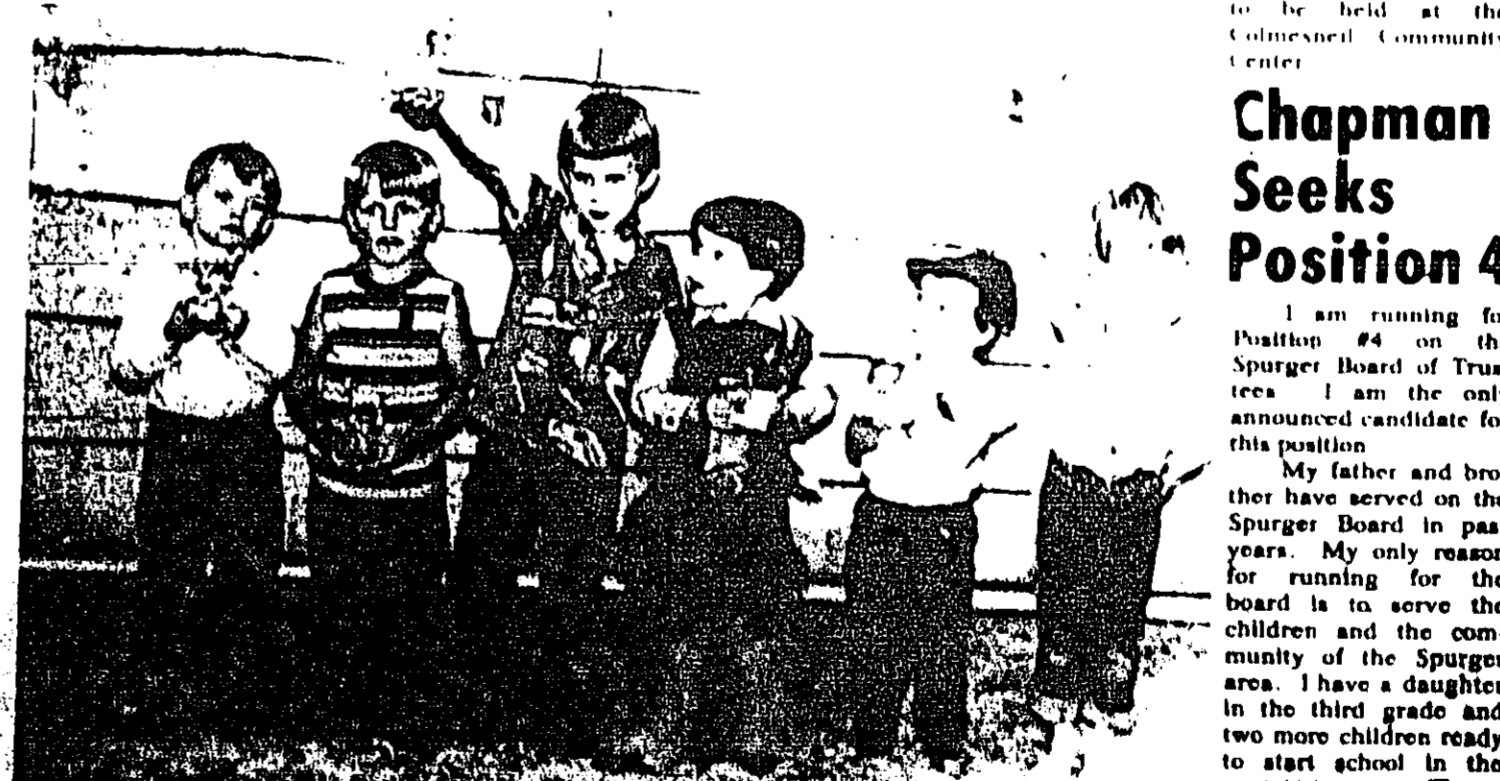
## Hicks In School Race In Spurger

## Dr. Burton At AAFP

KANSAS CITY, MO. Dr. Gayle Burton of Woodville has completed continuing education requirements to retain active membership in the American Academy of Family Physicians, the national association of family doctors. The Academy formerly was called the American Academy of General Practice.

The requirements call for members to complete a minimum of 150 hours of accredited continuing medical study every three years. The Academy was the first national medical group to require members to keep up with medical progress through continuing education. Because of their broad training,

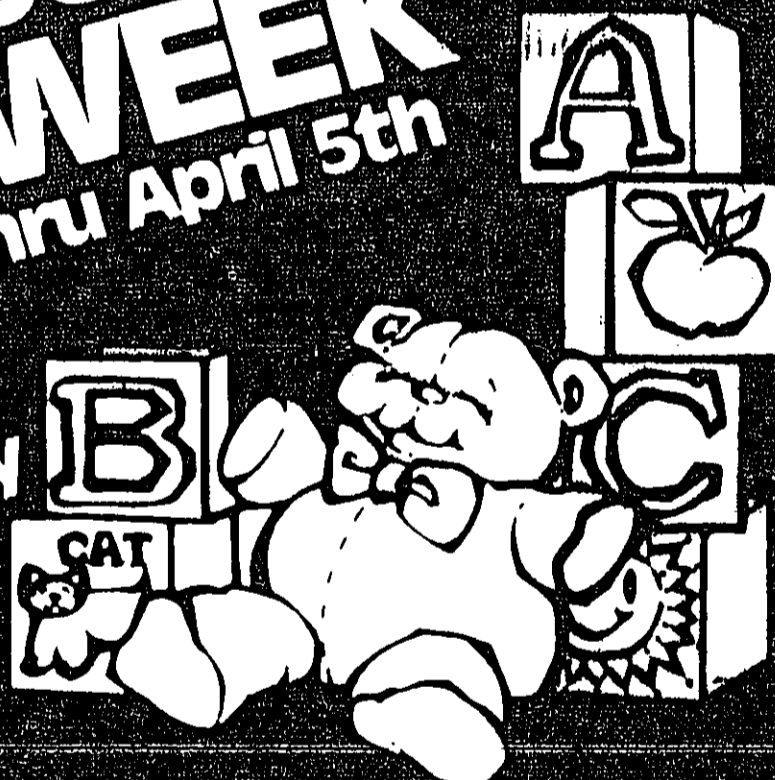
family physicians have the "know-how" to treat approximately 90 percent of all human illnesses. The Academy, founded in 1947 and headquartered in Kansas City, Mo., was instrumental in the establishment of continuing education. Besides maintaining continuing edu-

cation standards for its members, the Academy strives to increase the number of family physicians available to serve the public in the future. It's continuing education program also provides a major basis of eligibility for Academy members seeking certification in the specialty of family practice.
