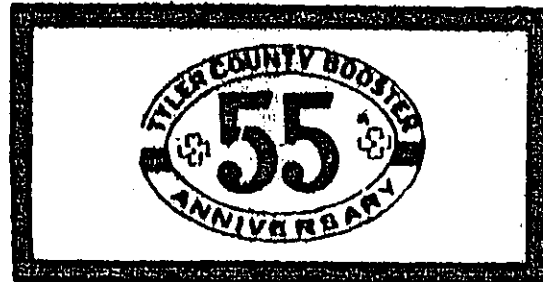

Stanford Offers New Option

Tyler County voters will have a different choice to make when they go to the polls Saturday, May 3rd.

This happens to be the only county in all of Southeast Texas which has a woman running for County Commissioner. For only the second time in the history of Tyler County, a female has accepted the challenge of campaigning for the all-male court. "I just want to make Tyler County the best place it can be," said Ruth Stanford, who is running for Commissioner of Pot. II against three male opponents. "I care about the people's needs. Women are just more oriented to care," she added.

Stanford feels a Commissioner should be someone the people can come to for advice, such as what agency to contact for special needs who to call for assistance with medical problems.

She believes the Southeast Texas Macho Attitude has kept women out of local politics so far, but that women should be allowed to prove they are as capable as men when it comes to handling the responsibility of county government.

In her employment as a permit supervisor for a salamograph company, she has traveled a great deal and says many of the counties she visited have women commissioners and county judges, even in the southern part of the state where males dominate politics.

Stanford thinks money management is a key issue in this election. Since women manage the budget in a great percentage of families, a formal perspective is long overdue for Tyler County government.

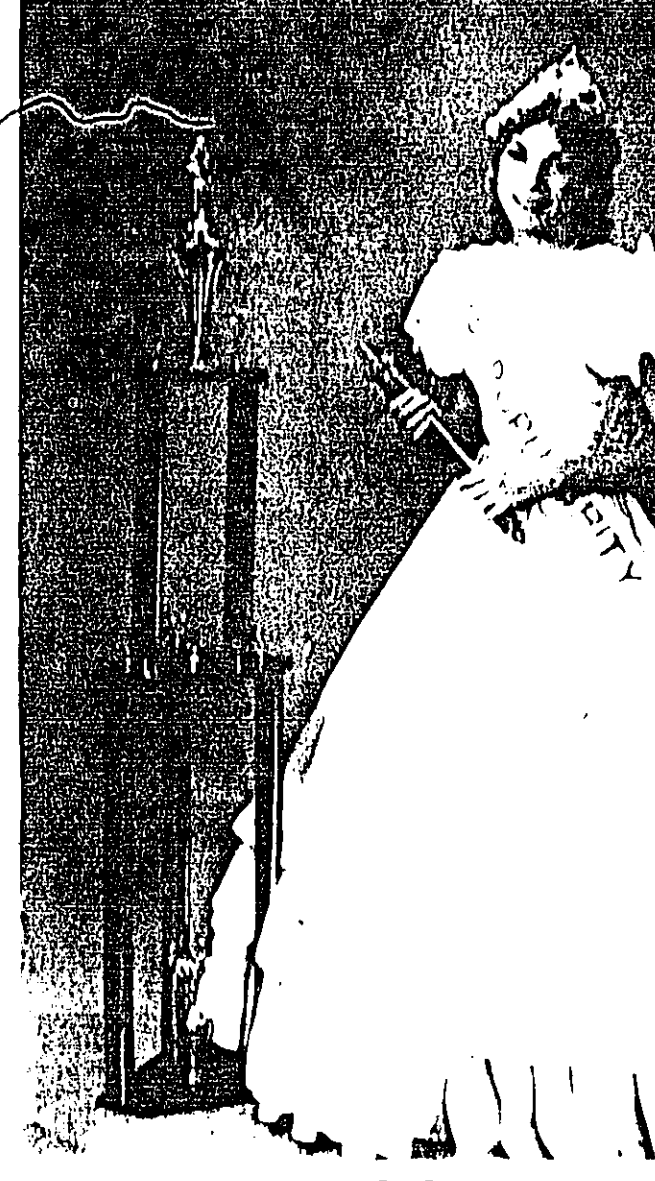

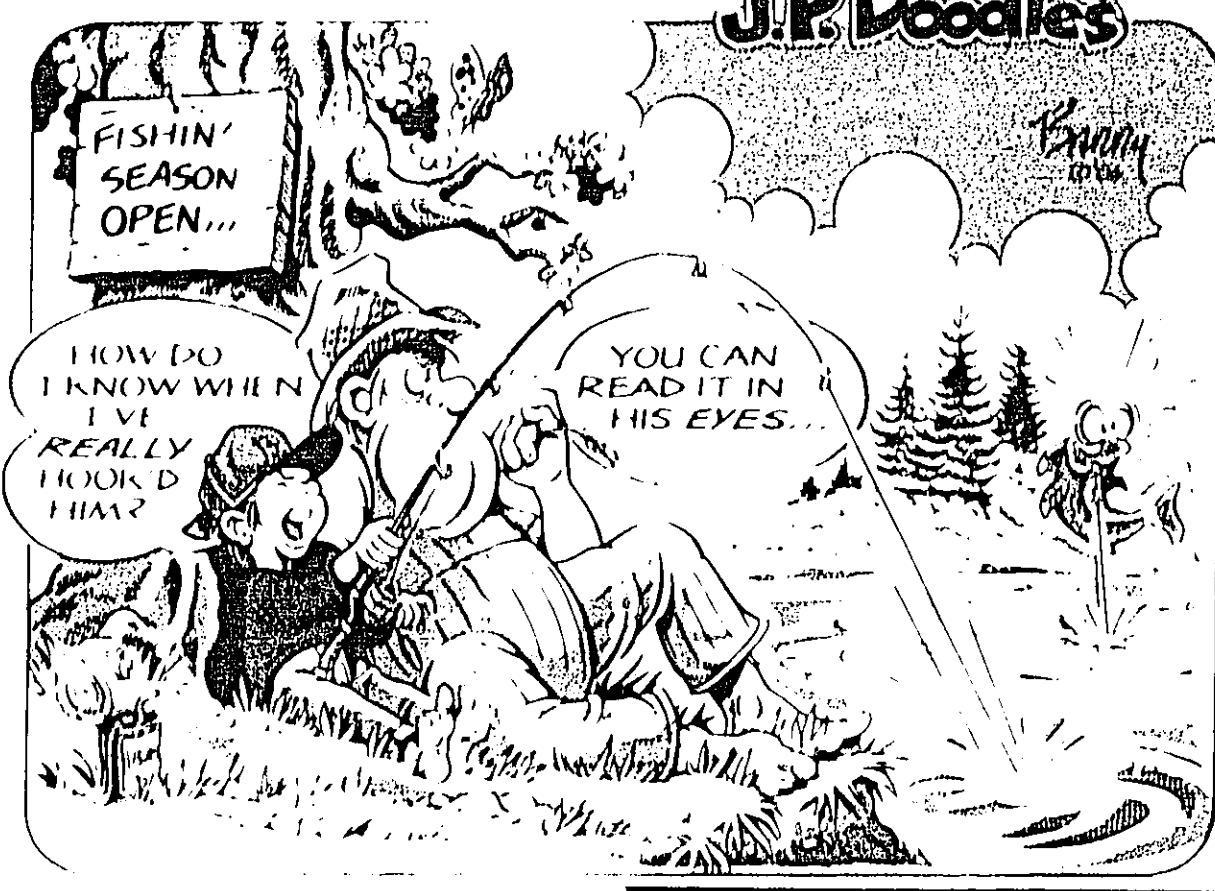

Newton electric Cooperative, and Sam Houston Electric Cooperative, both SR&T Interim and permanent rate increases requested are related in part to changes in the cost of service resulting from a ten percent increase of SR&T's entitlement share in Nelson Station Coal Unit No. 9 ("Coal Unit 9") power plant when SR&T retains a greater share of Nelson 6, it substitutes the power it is generating for the power that previously had been purchased from another utility and paid for through a purchased power cost recovery provision SR&T's proposal share of the Nelson 6 power plant operating expenses increase as it retains a greater share of the plant's output each year. The Public Utility Commission of Texas requires SR&T to recover these costs through an adjustment to base rates. Purchased power costs, however, are recovered through a separate formula that is approved by the Commission. Although

purchase power costs have decreased, the costs associated with retained ownership have increased. The reduction in purchased power costs is automatically flowed through the purchased power cost recovery provision, but the increased costs associated with increase in the retention of more Nelson 6 generation to meet system loads is not flowed through. For this reason and because other costs have increased since they were placed in effect on November 1, 1984, SR&T needs a rate increase at this time.

The proposed change in interim rates results in a reduction of 3.4% in the rate revenues collected for the adjusted test year under the present rates as annualized test year. When the annualized present rates are applied to the adjusted test year reflecting the reduced power costs that result from a generation from Nelson 6, a test year increase of \$2,500,169 or 0.2% is shown. The 2.4% reduction, therefore, is more representative of the expected change in the level of rate revenues under the interim rates. Local Residents Lead Study

Tyler County leaders, as well as others throughout Texas, are concerned about rapid changes occurring in the state economy and population changes that are placing challenging demands on resources of all state residents and their communities.

These changes point to the need for identifying the most critical issues facing Texas today, and determining how best to address them. The Texas Agricultural Extension Service should take as the state moves toward the 1990's, explains Janie Marquis and Bob Armentrout, county Extension Agents.

This spring, a process for mapping a new plan of action for the Texas Agricultural Extension Service will be launched. Several Tyler County leaders will be among more than 10,000 Texans, representing all 254 counties, who will conduct an Extension-sponsored study to identify key local issues says Janie Marquis and Bob Armentrout.

Local citizen input is crucial if Extension is to fully address education, costs that reflect the major concerns of Texans, both agents note.

The kick-off meeting for the Tyler County study group has been planned for April 14, 7 p.m. at the Lion's Club by the executive committee of the local Extension Program Building Committee.

At the local meeting, leaders will form four task forces for identifying the most critical issues in the broad fields of agriculture and natural resources, home economics, youth and community development, the county agent says.

A second meeting, planned in about eight weeks, when the county study group will present its findings and make priority assignments.

"As county groups complete their studies, Texas Agricultural Extension Service officials across the state will form the foundation for a major new statewide Extension educational planning effort for the remainder of the decade," Marquis and Armentrout explain.

"Tyler County members are having a vital role in assisting with planning future educational programs," they add.

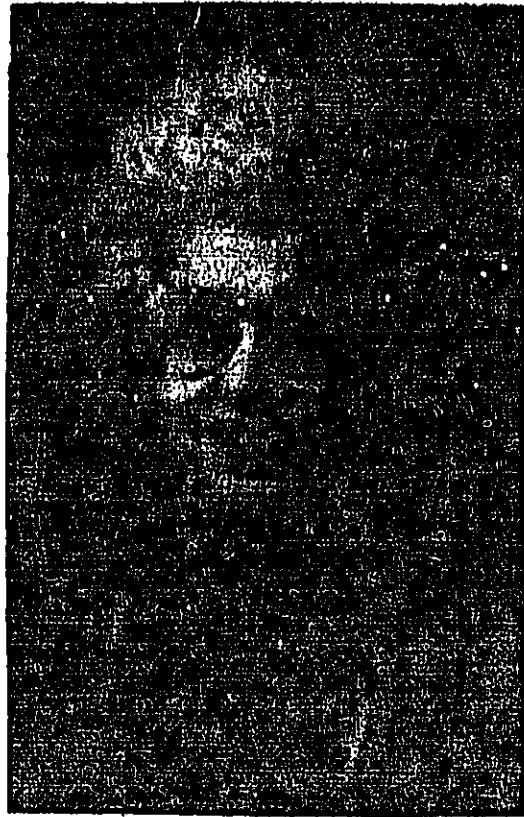

I always had to work within a limited budget for myself and the companies I have worked for and I have learned to get the best for my money.

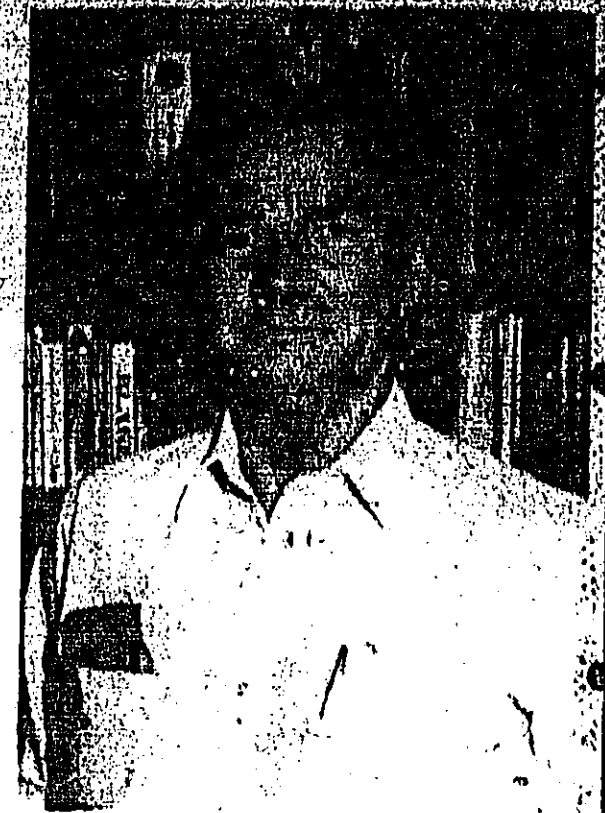
