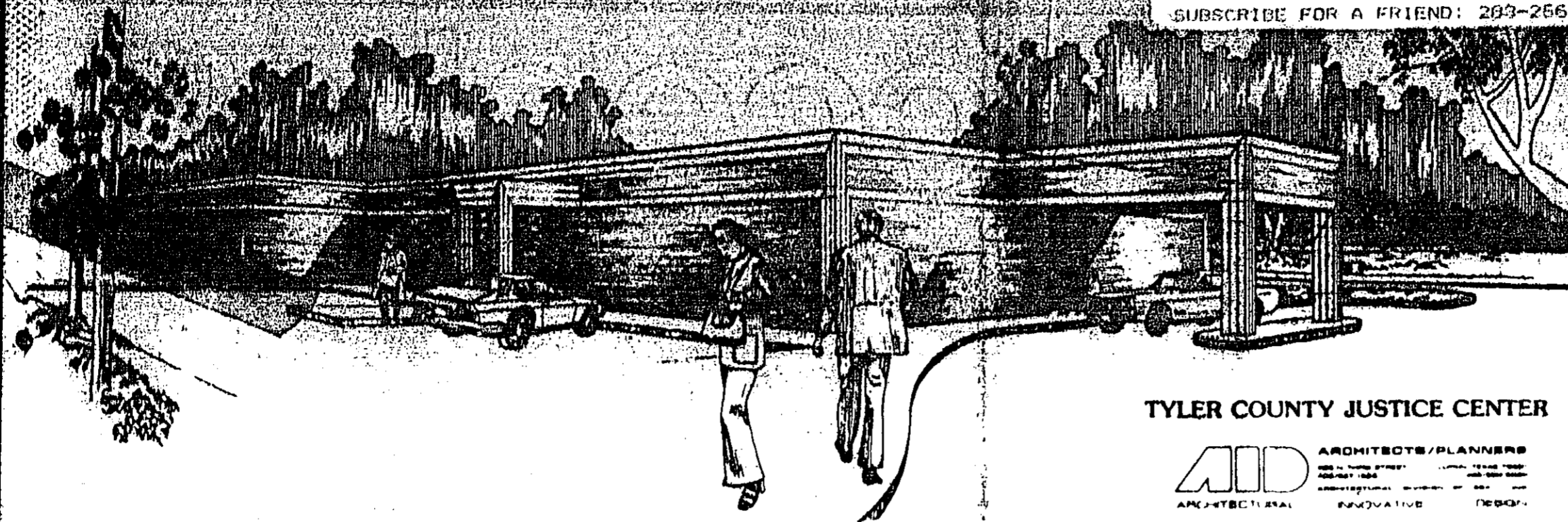

## New Jail Due Soon

The architect's drawings for the Tyler County Justice Center, shown at left, were released this week by the Commissioner's Court. The building will be located on Highway 69 in the north end of the city limits of Woodville. The county estimates the cost of the jail and land to be about \$1.8 million. Commissioners will begin taking bids from contractors in June and construction should begin sometime in August. The approximate completion date is November 1987.

The old jail located downtown had been declared inadequate by the state and the county was mandated by state law to provide more adequate facilities.

## Commissioners Pay Bills

Tyler County Commissioners quickly approved the three items listed on the agenda for their Special meeting Monday, May 19.

The bills from the auditor's office, auditor monthly report and the treasurer's monthly report were disposed of in a matter of minutes.

However, two items not listed were then discussed.

George McKeon, Warren Volunteer Fire Department fire chief, requested a two way radio with three pagers for the W.V.F.D.

It seems Commissioners had ordered eight of these radios when the Volunteer Fireman's Association was started, one for each department. However, W.V.F.D. did not join right away. Ivanhoe V.F.D. later joined the association and was given the eighth radio which had been ordered for Warren. Now that Warren has

joined, they are requesting a radio for their department. Commissioners asked McKeon to check on the price of a 37-180 radio, and they would take it up at the next monthly meeting.

Precinct 1 Justice, Wanda Brasher requested the county to allow her to attend a Justice and Constable Seminar and Convention in Abilene, Texas at a cost of \$350. She will also attend a Legislative meeting there at that time.

Commissioners approved the request but will have to take it up again at the next regular meeting. Eleanor Holderman's Marketing Class from Woodville High School was visiting the court session while learning different aspects of owning a small business. Each of the students are employed part-time by local merchants and hope to own their own business some day.

## Hightower Visits Realtor Board Here

State Representative Allen Hightower was in Woodville recently to address the Tyler County Board of Realtors.

Among the topics addressed was the inequity of the tax appraisal system. "Committee hearings are being conducted all across the state to discuss the inconsistencies from county to county in the appraisal system," according to Hightower. He said the hearings will conclude in July and a recommendation will be made at that time. He plans to attend as many of these hearings as possible.

Another controversial issue which Hightower spoke on is the bill which would allow convicts to purchase individual television sets for their cells. This is mainly for prisoners who are being held in segregation due to bad be-

havior or for their own protection. These prisoners are not allowed to associate with the other inmates. The prison system is obligated to provide recreation for these criminals in some form. If they are allowed out door recreation for these criminals in some form. If they are allowed out door recreation, the state must provide additional guards to watch them which could run into much additional expense according to Hightower.

He is in favor of the TV sets for this reason and also because they could be used as a disciplinary tool. If the prisoner does not behave, the television will be taken away as punishment.

Hightower believes this method could provide an overall reduction in state costs for the prison system.

Hightower also addressed the issue of Tort Reform. That is

the attempt by the legislature to curtail the rising cost of liability insurance.

Damage awards in civil litigation cases have reached sky high proportions and are the cause of many city and county liability insurance coverage to be dropped, says Hightower.

If a limit is not put on the punitive damage awards, small businesses will not long be able to afford coverage. Without liability insurance, it would not be feasible for the company to stay in business. According to Hightower, in this district alone, two volunteer fire departments have been denied coverage and two cities have had to go to self insurance coverage because of the high cost of liability insurance. All of these issues will be taken up at this next session of the legislature.

## Ogden Gets Permanent Job Status

Vera Ogden, 55, of Woodville is the Office Manager at A & M Motor Co. She is also legally blind.

Ogden, who lives alone with her daughter

Morris, is able to keep her job of 38 years because of the new high-tech machines available through the State Commission for the Blind.

She suffers from

subretinal hemorrhages, a hereditary condition, which causes bleeding behind the retina and loss of sight.

Ogden began losing her sight about three years ago. At that time

she started a method of treatment in which lasers are used to cauterize the blood vessels to prevent further bleeding. Her last treatment was a year ago and so far the

checked. Although she has had to trade some of her previous duties with other staff members, her expertise at her job have made her an indispensable employee.

F. M. (Polly) Archer Sr., owner of A & M Motor Co. says "After 38 years on the job, we're thinking of making her permanent."

Ogden is aided in her work with a closed circuit reading machine which magnifies the material to be read as much as 60 times. It also provides black and white contrast variations to make it easier for the person to read. She sets here for white print on a black background. This is just one of many devices offered through the Commission for the Blind, according to Dan Chambers, rehabilitation counselor. Ogden has also been able to receive "talking books," books and magazines recorded on tapes or recorded for the visually handicapped. These items are accessible to her through the Commission for the Blind. She is a regional supervisor.

Ogden has been to a low vision aid specialist who fitted her with special glasses which allows her the freedom of being able to drive short distances during daylight hours. "This is one of the best things, because I couldn't drive for a year. It's hard when you have to depend on others for transportation." Now she can drive to work, church and the store.

She also has learned to cook, wash and dry clothes and to maneuver around inside her home with the help of The East Texas Lighthouse, an organization which provides orientation and mobility services for the blind.

The Texas Commission for the Blind has an office in Tufkin. According to Escobas, one percent of the population are blind or legally blind. The Commission helps a large number of these individuals. Blindness does not have to be the handicap it once was. With the new technology available, the visual handicapped can lead an active and productive life.
