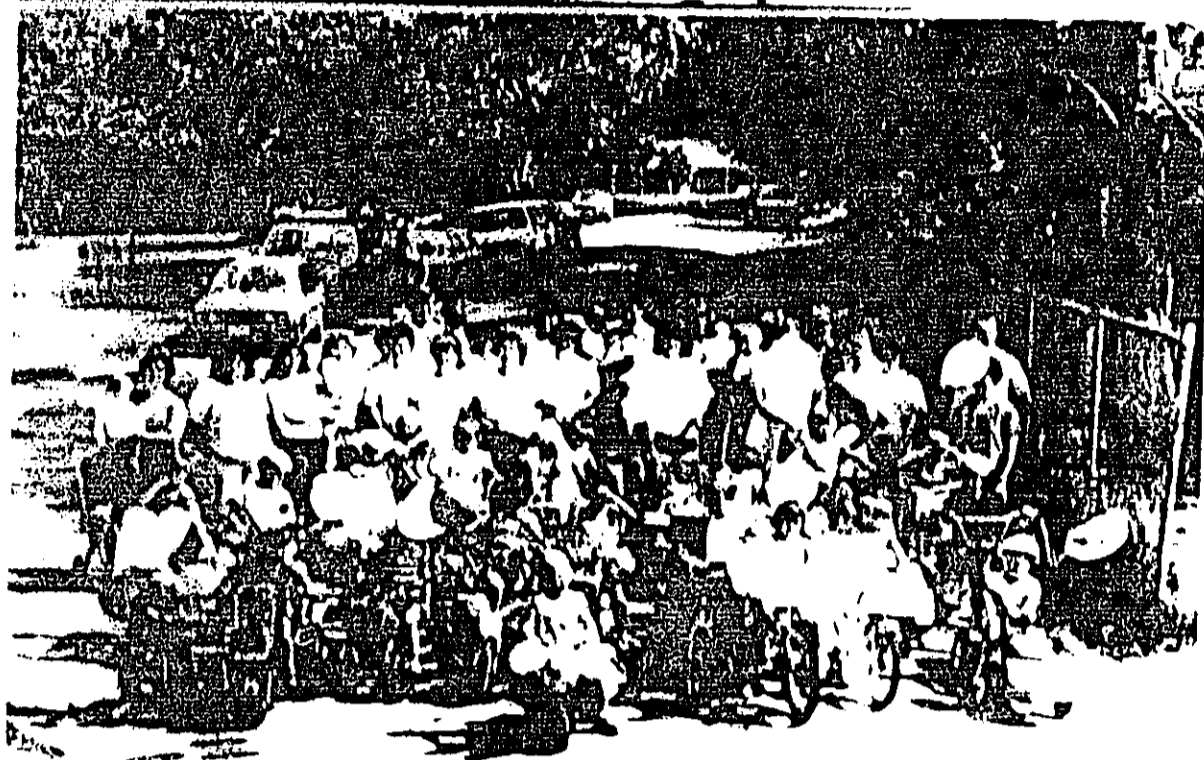

## Silver Haired Legislature Vote Set For May 30

All this week, May 19 through May 23, and again on election day, May 30, registered voters in Texas who are 60+ will be going to one of the Senior Centers (Nutrition Sites) in their counties to vote for a candidate to represent

them in the First Silver Haired Legislature to be held in Texas. Across the state 116 delegates will be elected.

The delegates will meet in Austin in the fall for the purpose of considering and voting on legislation that concerns the needs of older Texans. The mock legislative session will closely resemble that of the Texas Legislature. At the close of the session, the Texas Silver Haired Legislature will select several issues which it feels are priority concerns of the elderly. Those issues will be presented to Texas Legislators for consideration in the 1987 session.

Persons living in Tyler, Polk and Jasper Counties will have the opportunity to vote for one person from a list of five candidates who qualified during January and February.

The five candidates are:

- Mr. Arthur Pettijohn, Woodville
- Ms. Frances Lee Hill, Spurter
- Mr. Columbus Butler, Colmesneil
- Ms. Jane Reynolds, Ivanhoe
- Mr. Robert Doolittle, Onalaska

The winner shall be the person who receives the most votes. There will be no run-off. The

term of office is two years and there is no salary.

There are four polling places in Polk County, three in Jasper County and one in Tyler (600 Elm St.) If you need more information, call one of the candidates, go to your Senior Center or call the Area Agency on Aging in Jasper at 1-800-4-1111-RS. Remember the polls close promptly at 5 p.m. on Friday, May 30.

## Spurger I.S.D. Accreditation Fully Restored

Spurger Independent School District Accreditation status has been restored to Fully Accredited by Texas Education Agency according to a letter received by the district on May 20th from Victoria Bergin, Texas Deputy Commissioner for Curriculum and Program Development.

The Tyler County District's accreditation status was lowered following a state monitor-

ing visit December 7 and 8 of last year which cited two violations and several areas of concern.

In her letter Bergin said that based on documentation received from Spurger Schools, the district is considered to have removed all cited discrepancies and to be in substantial compliance with state accreditation standards.

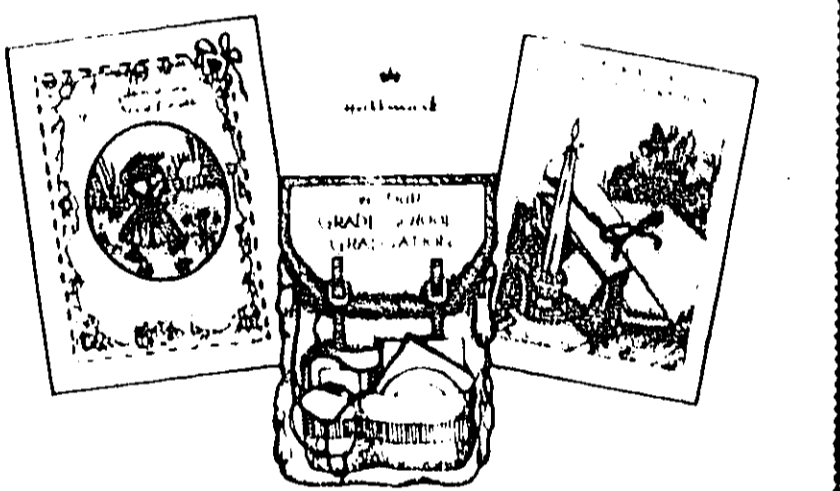

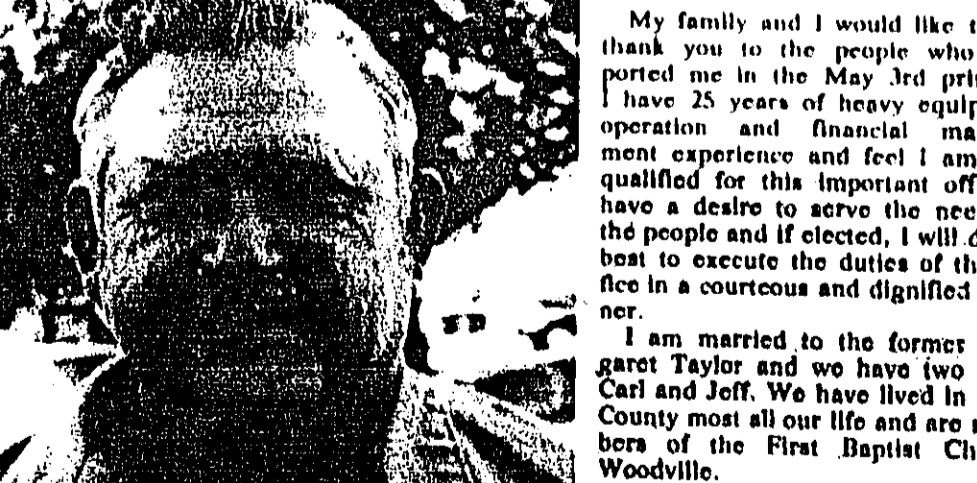

# Extension Child Care Conference Set For June 2

The first annual Extension Child Care Conference, designed for individuals who work with pre-school age children, is scheduled for Saturday, June 2, in Nacogdoches. Sponsored by the Texas Agricultural Extension Service in cooperation with the Texas Department of Human Services, Child Care Extension Service and the Early Childhood Education Program at Southern State University, the conference will be held at the NACO Grand Hotel.

The conference will provide 12 hours of inservice training credit in understanding children, improving job performance, and supervision and management. Additionally, the conference will give updated staff training as requested by the Department of Human Services Child Care Extension Service.

According to James Morrison, Tyler County Extension agent, the conference begins at 8 a.m. and ends at approximately 4:30 p.m. A pre-registration fee of \$25 includes registration, one copy of the conference proceedings, a certificate, refreshments, lunch and an evening banquet. # Durham Reminds County Farmers To File ASCS Acreage Report

Milton Durham, Tyler County Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service District 9 administrator, reminded county farmers to file their ASCS acreage reports for the 1986 program to insure crop acreage bases as well as eligibility for different benefits if they decide to participate in farm programs.

Durham said it is very important for farmers who are participating in the 1986 program to file an acreage report, because without it they are not really participating. "We must have the report in order to determine the level at which producers are eligible for price support loans, deficiency payments and other program benefits."

Final certification dates for program crops in Tyler County are June 15th for cotton, corn, and grain sorghum and July 15th for peanuts and soybeans.

Farmers who are not participating in the 1986 program are encouraged to report their crop acreages to insure future benefits and protect acreage bases. Call 283-2511 for further information.

# Honey Producers Vote Still Underway

USDA's Agricultural Marketing Service (AMS) will conduct a referendum May 19-31 for honey producers and honey importers to vote on a proposed research, promotion and consumer information program. The referendum will be made available by the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service.

Anyone who produced or imported 6,000 pounds or more of honey in 1984 and currently produces or imports honey may vote in the referendum, according to AMS official Joseph A. Gribbin. To become effective, the program would have to be approved by at least two-thirds of the affected producers and importers voting in the referendum.

Honey producers and importers may request ballots for the referendum from our office during regular business hours. Kathy D. Luce, County Executive Director of the Tyler County ASCS office, said that gran could obtain a referendum upon written request.

The Honey Research and Information Program would be administered by a 11 member Honey Board. Their responsibility would include recommendation of research projects for approval by the Secretary of Agriculture.
