Accident Claims Two On Hwy 69 South

A three-vehicle accident 2 miles south of Woodville at 2:40 p.m. Tuesday claimed the lives of two men and sent three persons to the hospital, one in critical condition.

Killed in the accident were Bobby Ray Kinnon, 46, of Woodville, and Air Force Sergeant Edward Astley, 38, of Beaumont.

Injured in critical condition and hospitalized in Houston was Vicki Kinnon of Woodville, while Air Force Sergeant Tommy Senegal, 25, of Lake Charles, is listed in "good" condition at Tyler County Hospital

along with Herbert Earl, 49, of Sacramento, California, who is listed in "fair" condition.

According to Department of Public Safety Trooper Gary Hennigan, a Bekin's Moving truck was traveling north on Hwy. 69 and careened out of control on the rain-soaked shoulder of the road

traveled 100 feet and jackknifed into the oncoming traffic, which involved two vans, one belonging to The U.S. Air Force which, officers indicate, was impacted first with the Kinnon vehicle following.

Hennigan said the Bekin's driver was

carrying about 10,000 pounds of furniture with the truck capable of handling a 60,000 pound load.

Investigators said that portion of Hwy. 69 had been involved in numerous accidents, including three since May 13 and seven since September and that several tests

have been conducted and will be conducted in the near future on that stretch of road. Officer Hennigan said a "DPS Skidmobile" will be used to test for oil slick and other unfavorable road surface conditions.

"We use it all the time up here," he said.

Apparently the U.S. Air Force enlisted men which represented Lake Charles and Beaumont at military recruiters had met in Lufkin for a meeting and were on their way home.

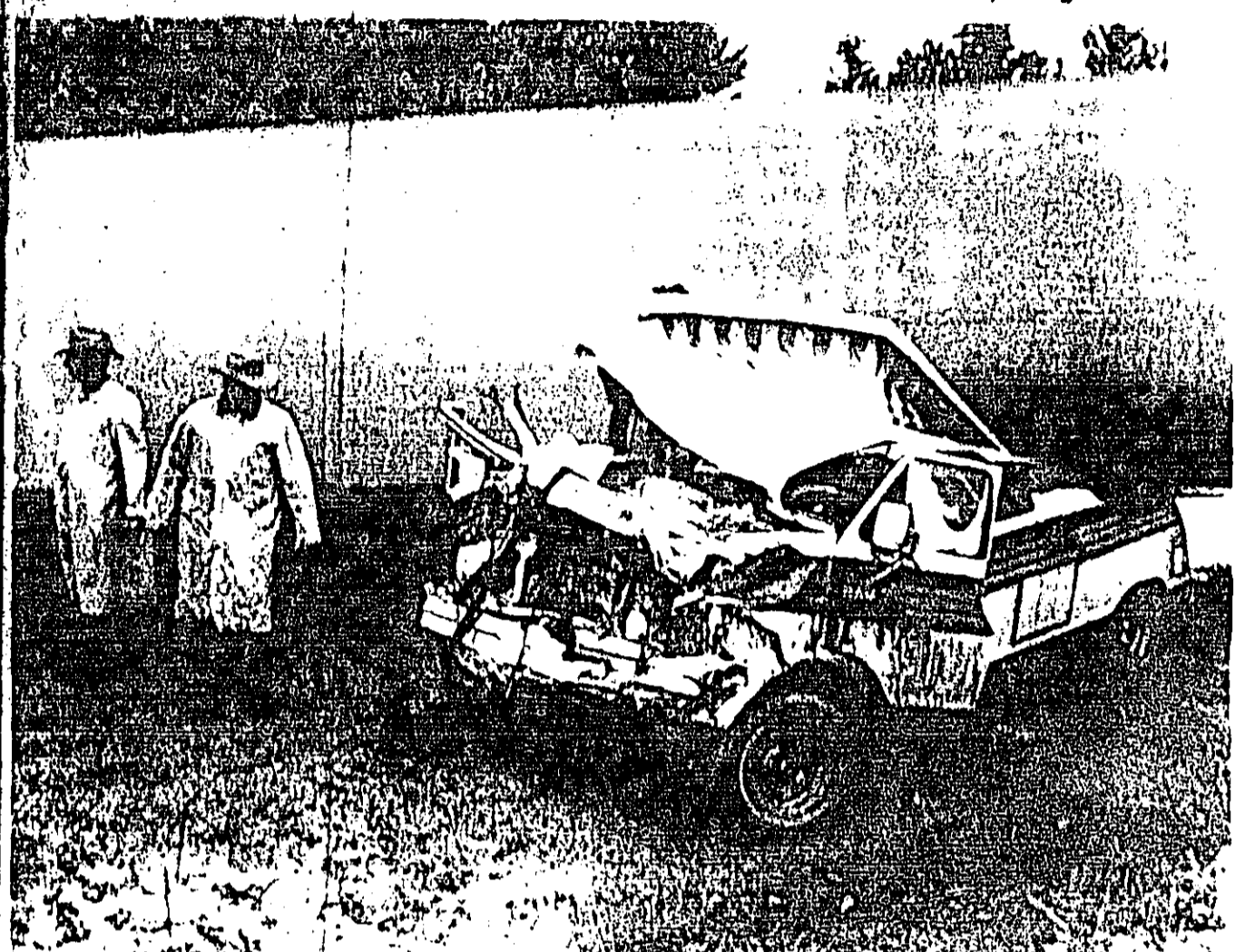
Funeral Services for Kinnon were scheduled Wednesday June 18 at the Our Lady of the

New Postal Service Opens Doors

A "new" Postal Service, nationally reorganized and committed to improving its responsiveness to customers, opened its doors in Houston June 7, according to Field Division General Manager Samuel Creed, Jr.

A great deal of the responsibility and

decision-making authority for operating the Postal Service has been shifted from headquarters in Washington, DC, to the local division, in Houston. Organizational changes are being implemented in the Houston Division, which is made up of 212 post offices serving almost 20,000 square miles of South Texas, including Houston, Beaumont, Bolivar, Pasadena, Galveston and all Zip Codes 770-778.

The recent national reorganization gives local managers and staffs the control and flexibility we need to solve local problems and meet local needs quickly without getting higher approval. The Field Division General Manager/Postmaster said.

"To back up this new commitment to service, the Postal Service will commit billions of dollars nationally in the next five years for modernization and automation, which will give

us the new equipment and new services to go along with our new dedication and spirit to serve Houston more effectively.

"Today, we are reorganizing our historic contract with the American people," Green said. "But, though our roots are in history, the Postal Service is not bound by the past. We control our future, and in the months ahead, I think you will see we have a new spirit and dedication to serving our customers."

DETTA To Meet June 27

Deep East Texas Development Association will hold its regular monthly meeting on June 27th, Friday at 10:00 a.m. at the Lake Country Inn, Center, Texas.

Joe Love, President of the Association, announced today that Dr. Ronald Billings, Forest Pest Control Section, Texas Forest Service from Lufkin will be the principal speaker for the monthly meeting. The topic will be Research in the controlling of the southern pine beetle.

Dr. Billings has served as principal entomologist and head of the Forest Pest Control Section, Texas Forest Service in Lufkin since 1973. He is responsible for developing, organizing and administering detection, prevention and control programs for major pests on non-federal forest lands in Texas. He also conducts research on the southern pine beetle, the most destructive insect enemy of southern pine forests. Billings' research has involved the development and implementation of systems for hazard rating forest areas for susceptibility to bark beetles and the

use of synthetic attractants and inhibitors for survey and forest control of beetle populations.

Billings studied forest management and forest entomology at the University of Washington, where he received his Bachelor of Science and PhD degrees, also has a Master of Science degree in Forest entomology from Oregon State University.

Prior to joining the Texas Forest Service, he served as a Peace Corps Volunteer in forestry programs in the Dominican Republic and Chile. He has worked on short term assignments in Honduras, Haiti and Mexico.

Dr. Billings is recognized as a leading authority on the southern pine beetle, as a result of his research and practical experience with the Texas Forest Service, together with his numerous publications on the subject.

Joe Love, President of the Association, stated that DETDA is a nine-county organization concerned with the orderly use of the resources of the area, including its forest, waters, wildlife, agriculture, recreation,

historical heritage, high ways and people.

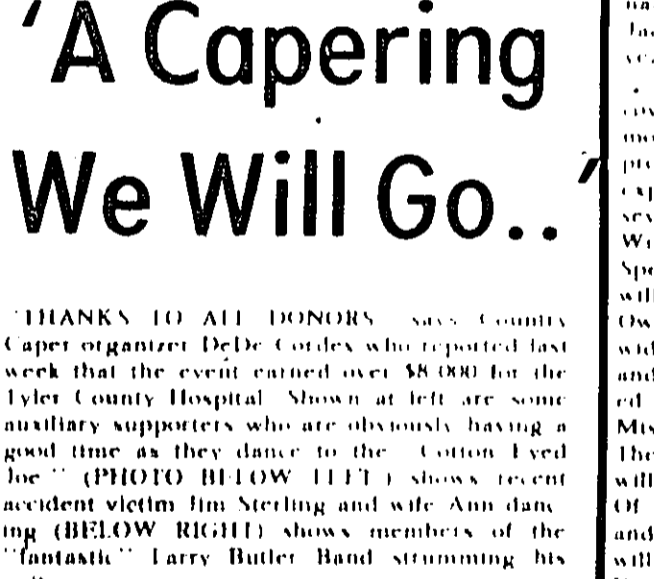

Letter To The Editor

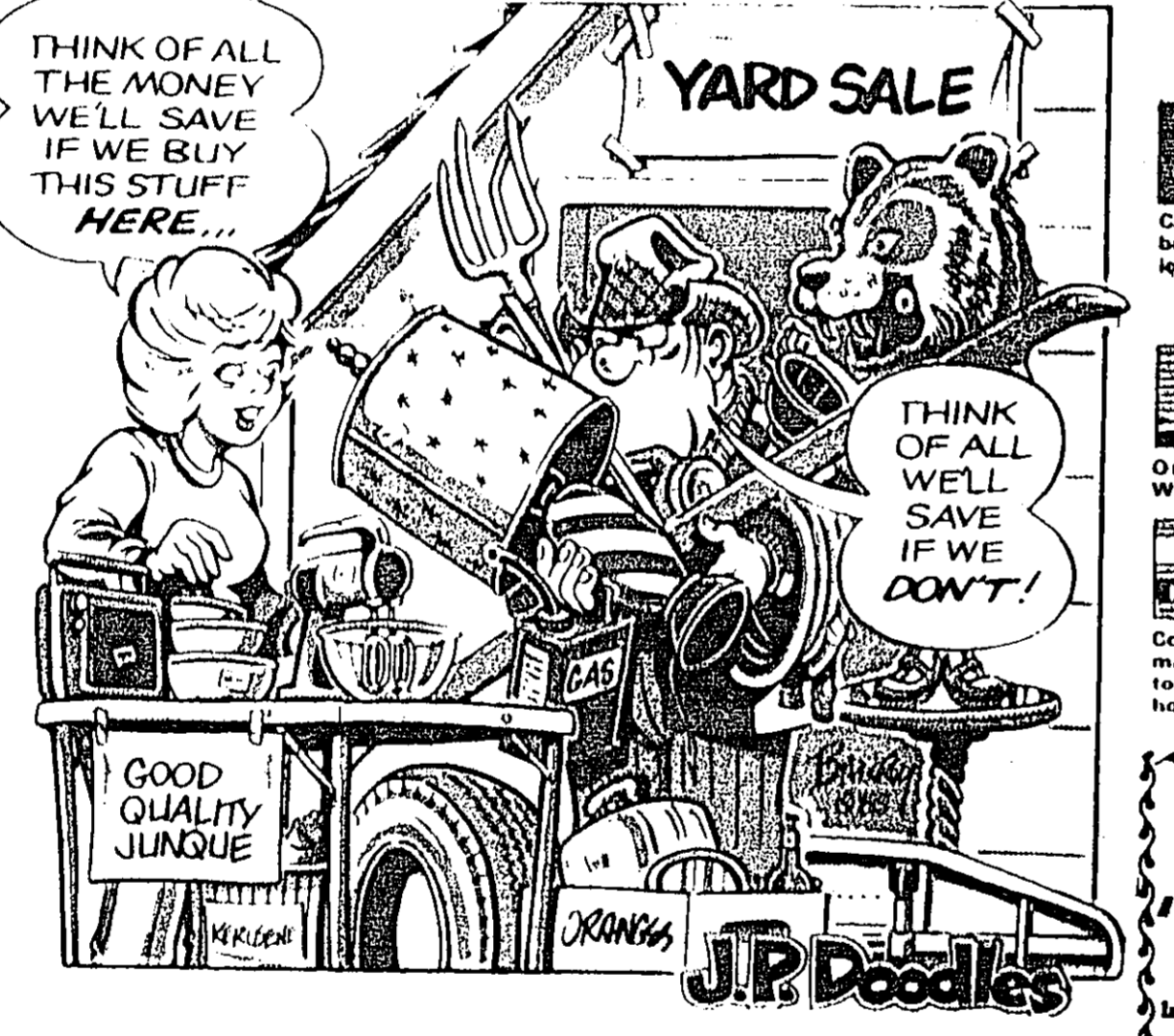
Dear Editor:
