A three vehicle accident two miles south of Woodville at 2:40 p.m. Tuesday claimed the lives of two men and sent three persons to the hospital, one in critical condition.

Killed in the accident were Bobby Ray Kinnon 46, of Woodville, and Air Force Sergeant Ed


