## Rescue Heliport Eyed

Woodville City Police man Scott Youko is spearheading a drive to raise some \$3,500 in funds Youko says are desperately needed to construct a Life Flight Heliport to transport emergency patients to Beaumont and Houston Life Flight support hospitals in extreme emergencies.

Youko brought his appeal to the Tyler County Hospital Board of Directors in April and they told him "to proceed."

Youko is proposing that the heliport be located at the north west corner of the Tyler County Hospital property. Youko says that lighting would have to be installed and one tree would have to be removed in order to create the right amount of space for the project.

The police officer said the helicopter pad would remove the needless risk of travel to other points in the city. How much it would be to save time and

money every transfer needed to justify the project.

Youko said the city all cost program will provide a more facility. He said also the Medical Helicopter specialist city from Fort Worth, Texas, also be involved in participating in the use of the heliport.

Youko said he wouldn't be surprised if the heliport would be in use once a week in the near future.

# Typical Tyler County Forage Producer: 60

The typical beef cattle and forage producer in Tyler County is almost 60 years old, has been in the cattle business 24 years, earns 68 percent of his income from off-farm sources and owns 129 acres of land.

These are some of the facts revealed from a survey of almost 100 producers in Tyler County. The survey questionnaires were mailed last September as a part of the East Texas Beef Income Program initiated by the Texas Agricultural Extension Service.

According to Billy Perovich and Louy Douglas, Extension district directors, head quartered at Odessa, the program is designed to increase efficiency and profitability of East Texas beef cattle operations through adoption of practices that will produce the highest return for the dollar and time expended.

Forty-six percent of the cattlemen surveyed completed and returned the questionnaire. The survey showed that nearly 61 percent of the cattlemen have less than 50 head of cattle and 39 percent have between 50 and 99 head of cows. Over 64 percent have less than 200 acres in the ranching operation. Ninety percent of the cattle operations are single family operated. Eighty-three percent of the cattlemen are between 50 and 70 years old, with 55 percent being in the cattle business less than 20 years. The educational level of the producers was quite high with 76 percent having completed high school and 26 percent earning one or more college degrees.

The beef and forage industry in the 39 counties in East Texas accounts for 427 million dollars in cash receipts, this is 32.2 percent of the total agricultural income in the area. The survey indicates that 50 percent of the cattlemen have gross sales of less than \$10,000 per year and 45 percent have an off-farm primary occupation. Therefore, many individual operations make up the beef and forage industry in East Texas.

A large majority of the producers in Tyler County, 76 percent, raise their own hay. Fifteen percent use commercial weed control and 3 percent use mechanical weed control. Twenty-two percent of the cattlemen implant nitrating cavares.

County agents and Extension specialists rated number one as a source of information on local veterinarian, were second and other farmers were third.

Ninety-seven percent of the producers practice control of external parasites on their cattle with sprays, dusts and ear tags ranking as the most common methods of control.

Only eight percent of the cattlemen lease land for hunting and fishing. Marketing information is rated as important by 48 percent of the producers and 21 percent felt that production and management records are important. Ninety-one percent of the producers sell cattle at the local sale barn, but interest was expressed in special auctions, co-op marketing and forward contracting. Interest in financial management seems to be increasing and concerns over profitability were reflected in budgets and loan statements. Very few East Texas cattlemen are using computers.

Interest was expressed in a number of practices important to beef and forage production. Among these mentioned most often were market outlook, livestock auctions, financial management, controlled grazing systems, herd health, hay production, weed control, fire ants, legumes and fertilizer.

These are currently under way to design programs and educational efforts to meet the expressed needs of the Tyler County producers. The approaches taken will be those which can meet these needs the most efficiently and with the least cost to the producer.


In ancient Rome the first day of the year was given over to honoring Janus, the god of gates and doors and of beginnings and endings - the month of January is named for him.
