



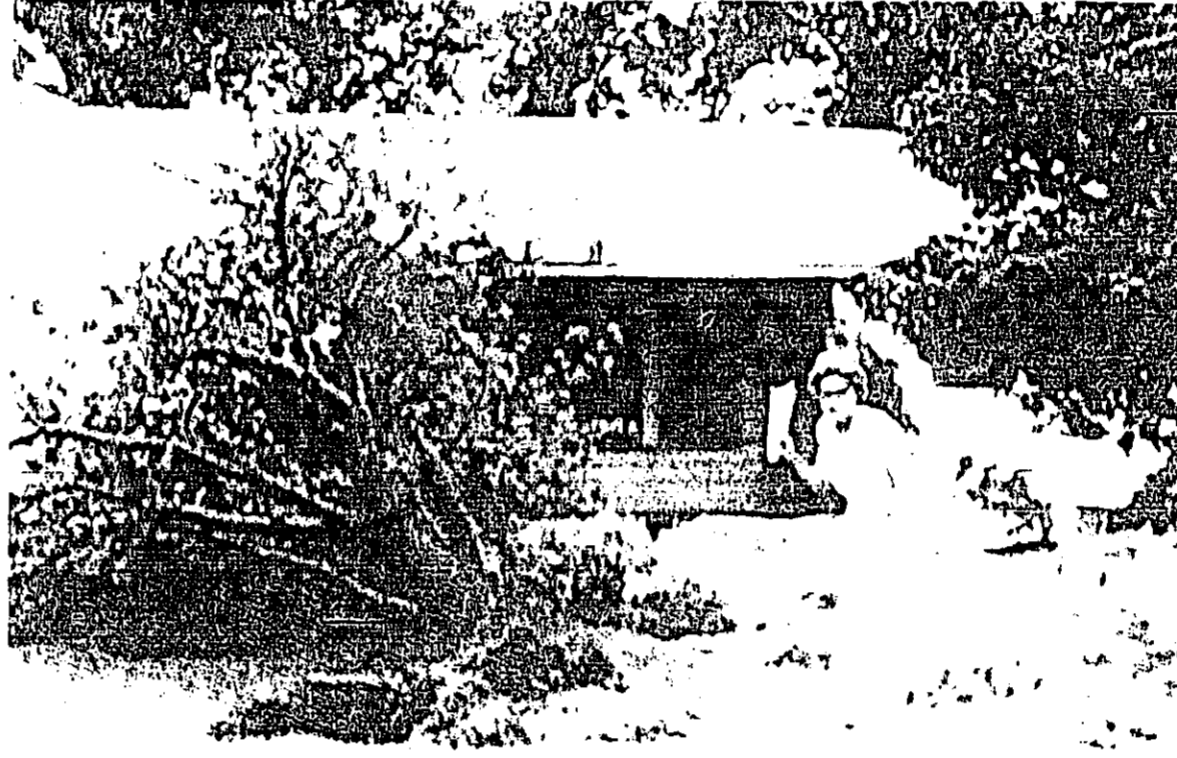
Not Over Ocean Anymore! My Bonnie Lies Over Land

Gulf States Utilities Woodville Station Manager Wyatt Bell has worked every hurricane since 1951 all over the OSU District. "But this one caused more damage than any one I've ever seen."

Bell referred to the storm as "the most expensive in Tyler County since the beginning of time."

The utilities manager said that out of some 597 miles of line to manage in the Tyler County area only 16 miles were unaffected by the storm. He said his office marshalled crews from Texas Power and Light in Dallas,

crowns from Temple Associates, and outside crews from Treco Inc. to help clear the lines and restore lights to OSU customers. Some 18 OSU systems operations personnel were brought in from throughout the district to man the offices in Woodville, answering phones and patrolling the district to report down lines.

Area Pork Producers Vote Urged

Tyler County pork producers have the opportunity to participate in a U.S. Department of Agriculture sponsored statewide election July 11 to help select individuals for appointment to an industry-wide body that will administer a promotion, research and consumer information order for pork.

Bob Amos, county extension agent, said all pork producers in Texas are urged to vote in the election. Candidates for the highest number of votes in each State will be eligible for appointment by the Secretary of the U.S. Department of Agriculture to the State's allotted position on the National Pork Producers' Delegated Body.

The Delegated Body consists of approximately 100 producers including 10 from each of the 48 states and four representatives responsible for administering the order.

Amos said that voters should take time to fill out the ballot and return it to the State Extension Office.

can vote in any county in their home State after signing a voter registration list certifying that they are pork producers in that State.

Pork producers are urged to vote in person at the county Extension Office. If that is not possible, an absentee voting packet containing a ballot and registration form may be obtained from Jim Epstein, National Pork Producers Election, P.O. Box 33767, Washington, D.C. 20026-3762, telephone 202-437-3400.

Absentee ballots must be postmarked by July 11 and received at the above address no later than July 18.

Votes will be tallied at 10 a.m. on July 13 at the local county office of USDA's Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service. The public is invited to be present at this official counting, and the results will be forwarded to the Secretary for confirmation.
