### 'Critical' Water Areas

AUSTIN -- July 2, 1986 -- The Texas Water Commission today released a list of 17 areas in the state which have been designated as critical ground water areas. Among those listed are "The Houston area, the rice irrigation areas and the Lufkin Nacogdoches area." Delineation of the areas is the first official action of a newly created Ground Water Conservation Section of the Water Commission. The new section will consolidate most of the agency's ground water activities. It will be headed by Bill Klumt and will be in the agency's Water Rights and Usage Division. Executive Director Larry Soward said the Commission "recognizes that ground water is becoming a significant water issue and is of concern to Texans." He said he believes the consolidation is the Commission's response to that increasing concern. "We think that this new section will facilitate better focus on ground water issues and provide citizens a place to get information and have input into the various decision-making processes relating to ground water," Soward said. The listing of the critical ground water areas is in response to House Bill 2, passed by the 1985 Legislature. Klumt said the Water Commission has been gathering information on areas considered for inclusion in the list since September. According to Klumt, a critical area means an area that is experiencing or is expected to experience critical ground water problems. These are areas which are characterized by ground water overdraft problems, due to extensive use of underground water for drinking, irrigation or industrial uses. Many of the areas' problems are complicated because other situations, such as subsidence or contamination, are also present.

The Woodville Summer Community Blood Drive will begin Monday, July 14 from 10:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. & 2:30 to 5:30 p.m. at the Tyler County Hospital, east wing. The drive is to make blood available and to provide family blood assurance to donors and their immediate families. Coordinator for the event is Gwen Sterling, Tyler County Hospital Laboratory director. Summer blood donations drop while patient needs rise. Each donation made during the Woodville Community Blood Drive will put us closer to the projected patient need of 2,200 pints of blood to be used in our area hospitals this July. These gifts of that "magical medicine", blood, will replace blood lost due to accident or injury, complications of childbirth, internal bleeding, major surgery or in treatment of shock (physical collapse with lowered blood volume and blood pressure), massive burns (in which fluid is lost through

damaged tissue), blood diseases such as leukemia, hemophilia, kidney and liver disease, etc. The Blood Center of Southeast Texas has the responsibility of assuring our hospital patients that blood will be there when needed. They can only keep up with this need through your help as volunteer blood donors. Giving blood takes only about thirty minutes and it is a safe and simple procedure. Only sterile disposable equipment is used and there is no way to contract any disease from giving blood. If you are in good health between the ages of 17 and 65, with no recent serious illness or surgery and weigh at least 110 pounds, you probably may donate. The Blood Center staff will carefully review you with a mini physical and check you

blood to make sure you have enough red blood cells to share at this time. The ultimate aim is to make it safe for the donor and safe for those who receive blood. If you have never donated before, remember the Blood Center's staff work with many first-time donors at high schools and elsewhere and will understand their apprehensions. There will be many follow-up community members, there are veteran donors and will give added support. Congratulations to the five new members of the Blood Center of Southeast Texas, Gallop Blood Donor Club. These gallant repeat donors are very important to the blood supply because statistics show that though 10% of a nation is eligible, only 5% actually donate. ### U.S. 190 Improvement Road Plan Approved

The State Department of Highways and Public Transportation has announced the approval of the route and design of the proposed improvement of U.S. 190 from Woodville, West 3.5 miles. This allows the Department to proceed with the next phase of engineering necessary for the development of this project. The proposed highway will be a modern two-lane facility with surfaced shoulders and climbing lanes. Right-of-way width varies from 120 feet to 200 feet with 200 feet being dominant. There are no plans for obtaining additional right of way. Construction plans have been completed and the adjustment of utilities is being planned. The project will probably be let to contract in September. Construction plans, environmental studies and all other pertinent data concerning the development of this project may be reviewed at the Resident Engineer's Office at 1 State Street, Jasper, Texas.

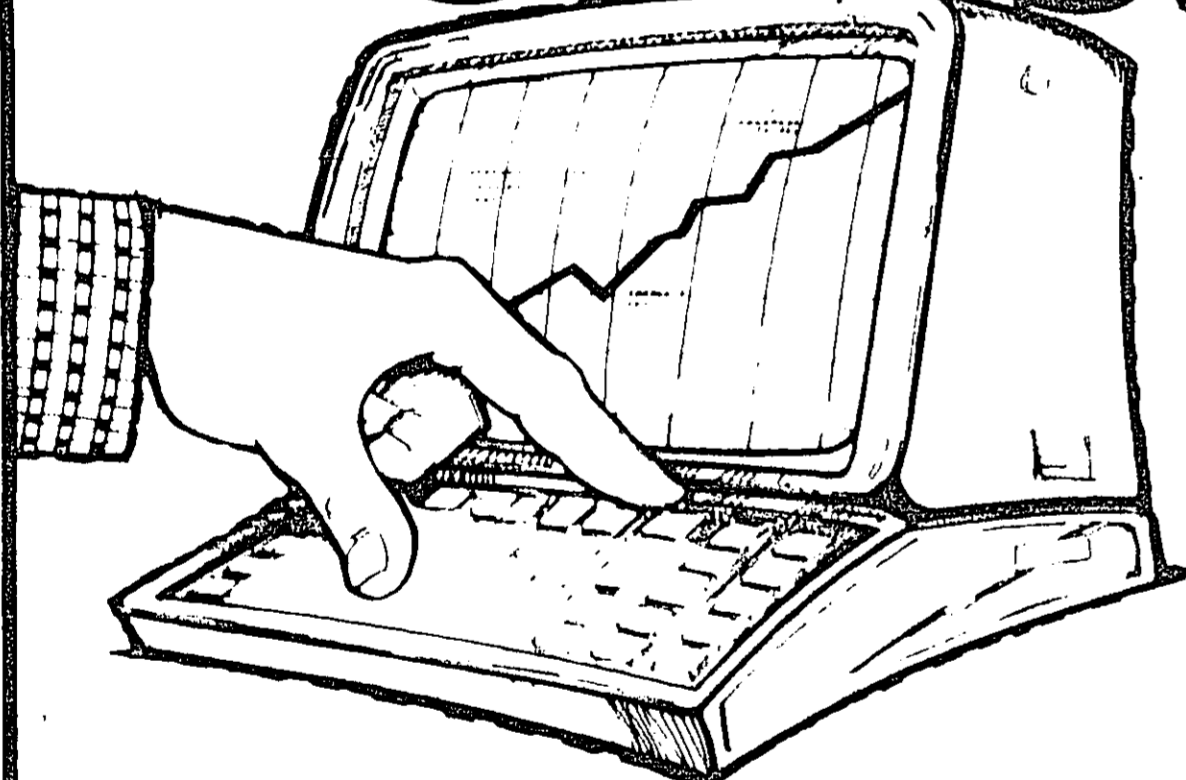

**MAKE CUT FLOWERS LAST!**

One of the many joys of having a flower garden lies in the wealth of blossoms available to grace your home. That keeps in mind that survival for a cut flower depends on several factors: (1) the relative maturity of the bloom when cut; (2) the time of day it is harvested; (3) the temperature at which it is kept; (4) the amount of water that can be maintained in the stem and flower; and (5) the rate of respiration. With these factors in mind, the following steps should help insure a reasonable display life for your bouquet.

First of all, cut your flowers early in the morning when they are full of water and look fresh. This is true for most day-lilies and plants, roses, for example, are better picked in the late afternoon when their high sugar content helps prolong their lives. Try to select blossoms that are close to but not past their peak of bloom. Use a sharp knife or shears to make a clean cut. Immediately afterward, plunge the stems into warm water (about 100°) and let the flowers stand in a cool spot for about two hours before arranging them.

To increase their viable water retention capabilities, many florists treat the stems just prior to creating arrangements, holding them under water and using very sharp knives that might have washed over and will expose more stem surface to the life-giving fluid.

The vase or other container that will hold the flower arrangements should be scrupulously clean. All leaves and flower heads—and in the case of roses, thorns—that will be below the container's waterline should be stripped off. Finally, add a preservative solution to the water and stir it well before putting the flowers in. Preservatives contain food for the flowers plus a fungicide and an acidifier to kill fungi in the water and prevent bacterial growth; they are available in most florists' shops. Many people claim that if a commercial product isn't available, you can make a hit at home with a sugar and aspirin solution.

Certain flowers may need special treatment in order to be kept as long as possible. These include gladioli, lilies, tulips, and hydrangeas. 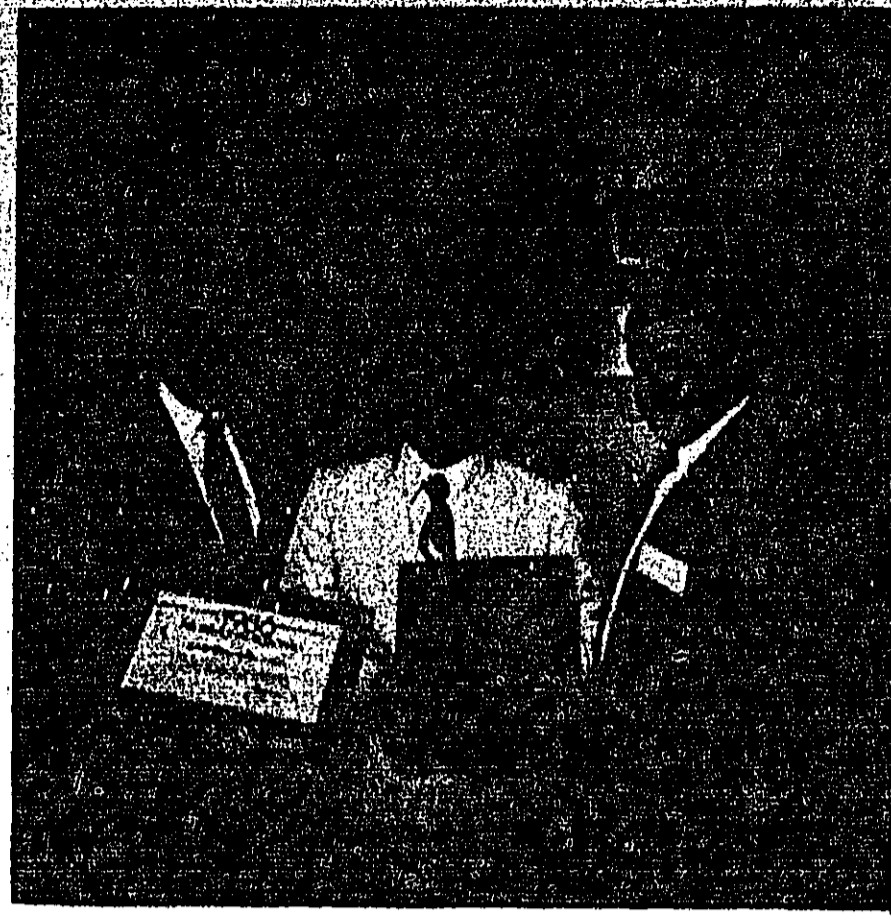
The request was made in an effort to round up any items of historical significance for the 50th anniversary of the National Forests in Texas which will be celebrated in October.

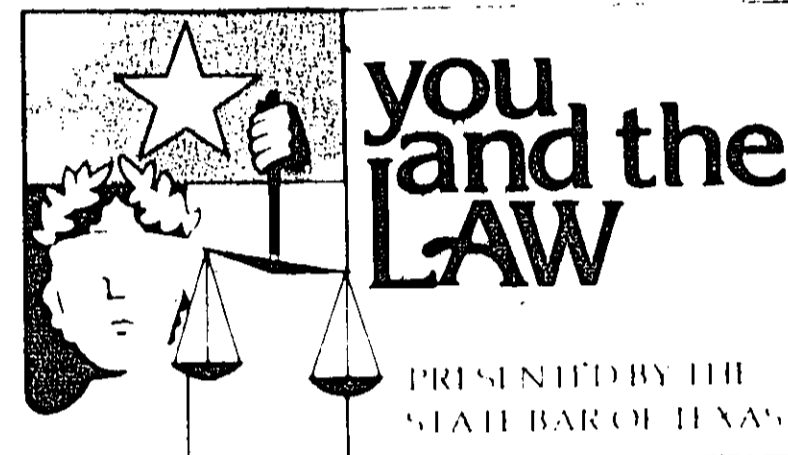

**Q** I realize that I was not required to assume my husband's last name at marriage, but I am curious: what is the Texas law regarding what we name our child?

**A** When you fill out the birth certificate, your child is generally given his father's name if legitimate, and his mother's name if illegitimate. The Texas Department of Health supplies detailed instructions and forms to all local birth registrars for this purpose. Its charge a child's name officially, you must file a petition in district court stating a good reason why the change is in the child's best interest. Both parties must agree to the change.

**Q** I was recently arrested for driving while intoxicated. In addition to all the other hardships I am now having because of this, my employer has fired me. Can he do this?

**A** Yes, he probably can. In Texas, your job can be terminated "at will" by the employer unless there is a contract. Federal laws prohibit discrimination on the basis of race, sex, marital status, or religion. But unless you had an employment contract or some type of prohibited discrimination led to your dismissal, you probably have no recourse against your boss.

**Q** After my divorce several years ago, I filed income tax returns as a feme sole. I have recently remarried, and would like to file in this status again. How would I do it?

**A** "Feme sole" merely means "single woman" in Latin. The only way you can file a tax return as a single woman, is to divorce your husband. Your right to file as single or married is determined by your status on the last day of the year. You can, of course, file a return as "married filing separately," but under Texas' community property laws, you must report half your husband's income and deductions and half of yours.

**Q** Is it the law that all hospitals must give emergency care to anyone whether or not she is able to pay?

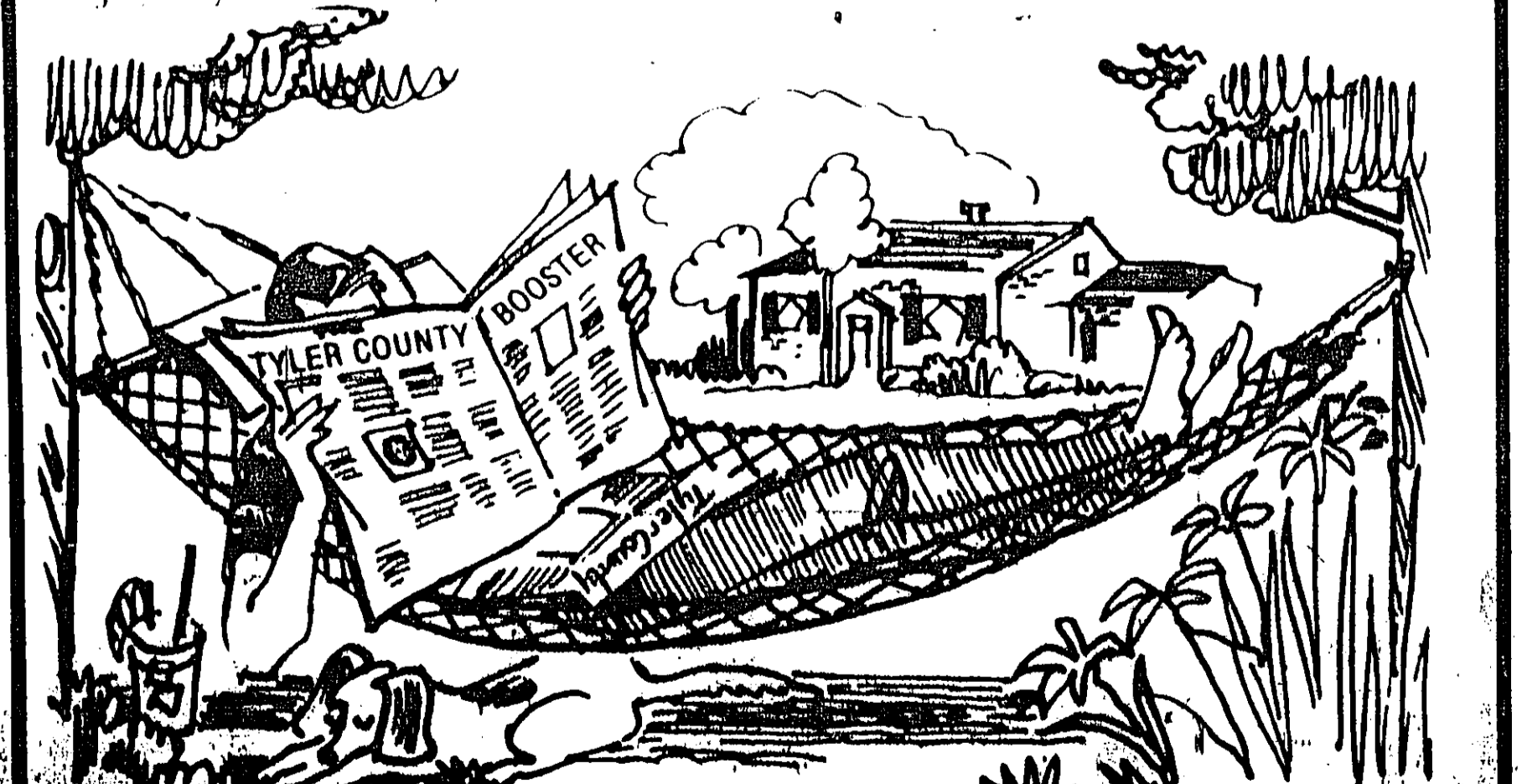
**A** It is a criminal offense for representatives of a "general" hospital to deny available emergency services to the person who cannot establish ability to pay. A "general" hospital is any establishment offering services beyond 24-hour treatment for illness. Certain institutions, such as mental hospitals, nursing homes, and some governmental facilities, are excluded from the supervisory rule requiring a hospital to furnish emergency care.

**Q** We are having some conflicts over management of the building used at our church. Before we take action, please let me if it's true that a church must have seven trustees on its board?

**A** If a church is incorporated under the Texas Non-Profit Corporation Act, it is only necessary that there be at least three people on the Board of Directors. Many times the words "trustee" and "director" are used interchangeably by an incorporated religious organization. If a church is not incorporated, then the By-Laws of the organization ordinarily determine the number of

## Lovett Covers Area For Consumers

Consumer services in the three county area have been expanded to include a check of gas pumps and a scale to check the weights in the most counter and other pre-packaged items for accurate weight. Lovett's other duties include checking and repairing nurseries and checking to make sure there are no problems with them.

Consumer services in general is a little known program to the public. "Most people I run into don't know that the Texas Department of Agriculture is responsible of these services."

But if they look on most scales used on gas pumps they will see a round sticker certifying the device to be correct," Lovett said.

Checking gas pumps and affixing a seal on them is one of the most time consuming jobs Lovett has. "It is not just every gas station we have to check, it's every gas pump we have to check. With the size of some stations, checking 20 pumps at one stop is not unusual," Lovett added.

The checking of gas pumps involves filling up an exact calling card can to 5 gallons. If the can shows the 5 gallons from the pump to be true and the price per gallon marked equals out a seal is affixed. If the measure and money do not equal out Lovett places a white restraint on the pump and puts it out of order.

The station can no longer sell gas from that pump until it has been fixed and Lovett has come back to make sure it is measuring and delivering gas properly.

The same premises holds true for meats and other pre-packs. "If the scales are measuring correctly a seal approving the device is affixed. If a discrepancy is found with the scale they are placed out of order and a stop sign is put on the entire meat counter or other pre-packaged area until the problem is fixed."

## Says Texas Land Commissioner Gary Mauro Veterans Benefits 'Dramatically' Increased

By a unanimous vote, the board voted to adopt recent recommendations of the Sunset Commission and the Texas Legislature to change the current program guidelines so that, instead of participation being limited to just one of the three Texas Veterans state benefits now available to Texas Veterans, an eligible Texas Veterans can now participate in all three. The multiple eligibility change will be in effect during a four month test period that began on June 17.

The board also acted to reduce the minimum acreage required to get a Texas Veterans Land loan from 10 acres to five acres.

"Reducing the acreage requirement from 10 acres to five will make it easier for more Texas Veterans to buy quality land close to the urban areas where they live," said Texas Land Commissioner Gary Mauro.

In addition, Mauro said that allowing Texas Veterans to participate in all three Texas Veterans Land Board programs will greatly increase the state benefits now available to Texas Veterans. "This means Texas Veterans can now get a \$20,000 loan to buy a house and get a \$20,000 loan to buy land and get a \$15,000 home improvement loan to make repairs to their homes," Mauro said.

Mauro also said that the board will study the effect of multiple participation in the four-month period.

"In the past Texas Veterans were limited to only one loan with the Texas Veterans Land Board," said Carlton Bell, Deputy Commissioner for the Texas Veterans Land Board.

Bell explained that during the next four months, however, a Texas Veteran who has already received one loan will be eligible to apply for a loan from one or both of the remaining programs as well.

For example, a Veteran who has already received a Texas Veterans home improvement loan will be eligible to receive a Texas Veterans Land loan to buy a house and get a \$20,000 loan to buy land and get a \$15,000 home improvement loan to make repairs to their homes.

Bell stressed that at the end of the four-month test period, the board will study the effect of multiple participation in the four-month period.

The Texas Veterans Land Board programs are financed through the sale of general obligation bonds at no cost to the taxpayer. The bonds are repaid by fees collected from Texas Veterans receiving loans through the program.
