Tempers Flare At Ambulance, County Hospital Meeting

What some courthouse observers billed as a "meeting that was completely unnecessary" turned into a heated exchange between Nate Greenup representing the Woodville-Tyler County Ambulance Service and Pat Riley of the Pat Riley Funeral Home.

The two were present at the meeting which included the Tyler County Hospital Board of Directors and The Commissioners Court and other citizens who offered some input but turned sour when Pat Riley challenged Greenup saying "Who's taking your money away from your big boy?"

Greenup called the meeting to try to obtain contractual agreements with the Tyler County hospital for patient transport to and from Tyler County Hospital. Greenup himself challenged the board of directors

saying "I don't want almost \$1,000 in ambulance to Riley Funeral Home." Greenup said that 12 percent of the ambulance service is provided by the hospital provide the ambulance service in Tyler County at the present time; that being the Woodville Tyler County Ambulance Service.

Hospital Officials noted that there is only one officially licensed ambulance service in Tyler County at the present time; that being the Woodville Tyler County Ambulance Service.

Greenup told the group that he couldn't operate without the needed revenues, he said he would lose if the services were

Legal Drinking Age 21: September 1

A different kind of dry spell is coming soon for some Texans.

W. S. McBeath, Administrator of the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission today issued a reminder that the legal drinking age will rise to

21 on Labor Day. The present legal age is 19.

At 12:01 a.m. on Monday, September 1, possession of an alcoholic beverage will be illegal for any person who has not reached his or her 21st birthday. The only exception is if

the underage person is in the immediate physical presence of his own parents or spouse who is over 21. Possession of an alcoholic beverage by the underage person is a misdemeanor with a possible fine of \$25 to \$200.

It is also a crime for the

underage person to present false identification or to misrepresent his age in an attempt to purchase alcoholic beverages, or to successfully make such a purchase even without misrepresenting his age. In either

case, the first offense is the same as for possession. Giving alcohol to a minor carries a fine of \$100 to \$500.

Sale of alcoholic beverages to an underage person is the most serious offense. A fine of \$100 to \$500 and/or a year in jail

is the penalty for the first violation. A second violation can result to the same jail term and a fine of \$500 to \$1,000.

McBeath also cautioned that the age change will affect persons entering package stores. Liquor stores may not allow un-

derage persons to even enter the store, and most such establishments have warning signs prominently posted.

"Many young people do not realize it is a criminal offense to ignore the warning signs and enter a liquor store," said McBeath. "It is a criminal trespass under section 40.05 of the Texas Penal Code, which is a class B misdemeanor."

Another common misconception is that drinking age violations only apply to public places.

"That's not true," said McBeath. "It will be just as illegal in a party barn, a fraternity house or a car parked on private property," he said.

McBeath urged voluntary compliance on the part of both licensees and underage former customers. Anyone who has a question about the upcoming change can obtain clarification from the nearest district office of the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission, or at the main office in Austin telephone (512) 458-2500.
