Polls will open at 7 a.m. Absentee voting ended Tuesday. Currently serving on the council are Tom Knapp, mayor, and Aldermen Dr. Brian Babon, Doug Gilbert, Dr. Malcolm Radford and Gordon Anderson. The vacancy was created when Knapp assumed the post of Mayor.

## Wallace Daily Eyes Beautification Award

Wallace Daily of Woodville, a Woodville highway maintenance supervisor is in the running for the 1986 Lady Bird Johnson award for highway beautification, the Texas Department of Highways and Public Transportation announced Monday. Daily's specialty involves using natural plantings to control erosion, is one of six finalists for the annual \$1,000 award for the supervisor judged to have done the best job of beautifying the roadsides under his care. The highway department's Beaumont district is one of five contenders for another prize awarded to the district judged to have done the best job of enhancing the natural beauty along its highways. Highway department spokeswoman Juliana Fernandez said Daily, a Tyler County native, sows wildflower seeds every year along the state roads under his supervision. Fernandez said judges were particularly impressed with the erosion control work Daily has done at rest areas and for his planting of grass and crimson flower along the highways. Lady Bird Johnson will announce the award winners Oct. 8 at a luncheon at the Lyndon B. Johnson State Park in Stonewall.

## Rural Electric Co-Ops File Protest

Rural Electric cooperatives in East Texas filed a protest with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission on July 9 objecting to Gulf States Utilities Company's initial 40% rate increase of its proposed 3-year phase-in rate increase plan. Gulf States has asked the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission to put the new rates into effect by August 24th. The cooperatives argued that the Commission should suspend the rates for five months, the maximum period allowed by federal law, until January 1987. The distribution cooperatives, which serve a population of about 200,000 in East Texas, are Houston County Electric Cooperative, Inc., Crockett, Texas; Jasper-Newton Electric Cooperative, Inc., Kirbyville, Texas; and Sam Houston Electric Cooperative, Inc., Livingston, Texas. The 80-page protest filed by the cooperative argued that the cooperatives should not be saddled with the exorbitant cost of Gulf States Utilities' nuclear plant, and that River Bend is the most costly operating nuclear plant in the country with a price tag of \$2.962 billion for Gulf States Utilities' share of only 658 MW or over \$4,500 per KW. The cooperatives contended that Gulf States Utilities' so-called "Base Modification Plan," with a phase-in of the cost of River Bend, makes mockery of the term "rate moderation" because of the 40% increase proposed in the first year of the phase-in, totaling to 90% by the third year. The cooperatives criticized Gulf States Utilities' high amount of excess capacity showing that Gulf States Utilities' reserve margin in 1986 will be 49%, and in 1987 will be 52%. The cooperatives told the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission that customers should not be saddled with the excess capacity, but that the problem should be shared between customers and Gulf States Utilities stockholders. As to the prudence of the costs of River Bend, the cooperatives told the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission that evidence in the recent Texas retail case called into serious question the prudence of River Bend's cost. The cooperatives contended that between \$1-1.5 billion of the costs appear to be imprudent. The cooperatives said that Gulf States Utilities was "insidious" in agreeing to a rate decrease in the recent Texas Public Utility Commission settlement, while at the same time seeking a huge rate increase at the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission. The cooperatives' protest said that the wholesale case was filed on June 24th, the day before the Texas Public Utility Commission approved the retail rate decrease. The cooperatives' protest pointed out that if Gulf States Utilities' proposal is approved by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission, Gulf States Utilities' rates to cooperatives in Texas would be the highest by far of any utility company in the country. The cooperatives said that Gulf States Utilities' rates would be 50% higher than the nation-wide average of utility companies selling to rural cooperatives. Carl Morgan, the President of Sam Rayburn G & T, Inc., which is the power supply organization for the three member cooperatives, said that the cooperatives would "fight vigorously" in opposing Gulf States Utilities' exorbitant rate increase request. Board members did, however, in a straw vote agree to vote officially at their next meeting to add to the existing policy an addition of clause which would extend the rule to using only licensed Amulances, even if out of county. The meeting lasted only 15 minutes.

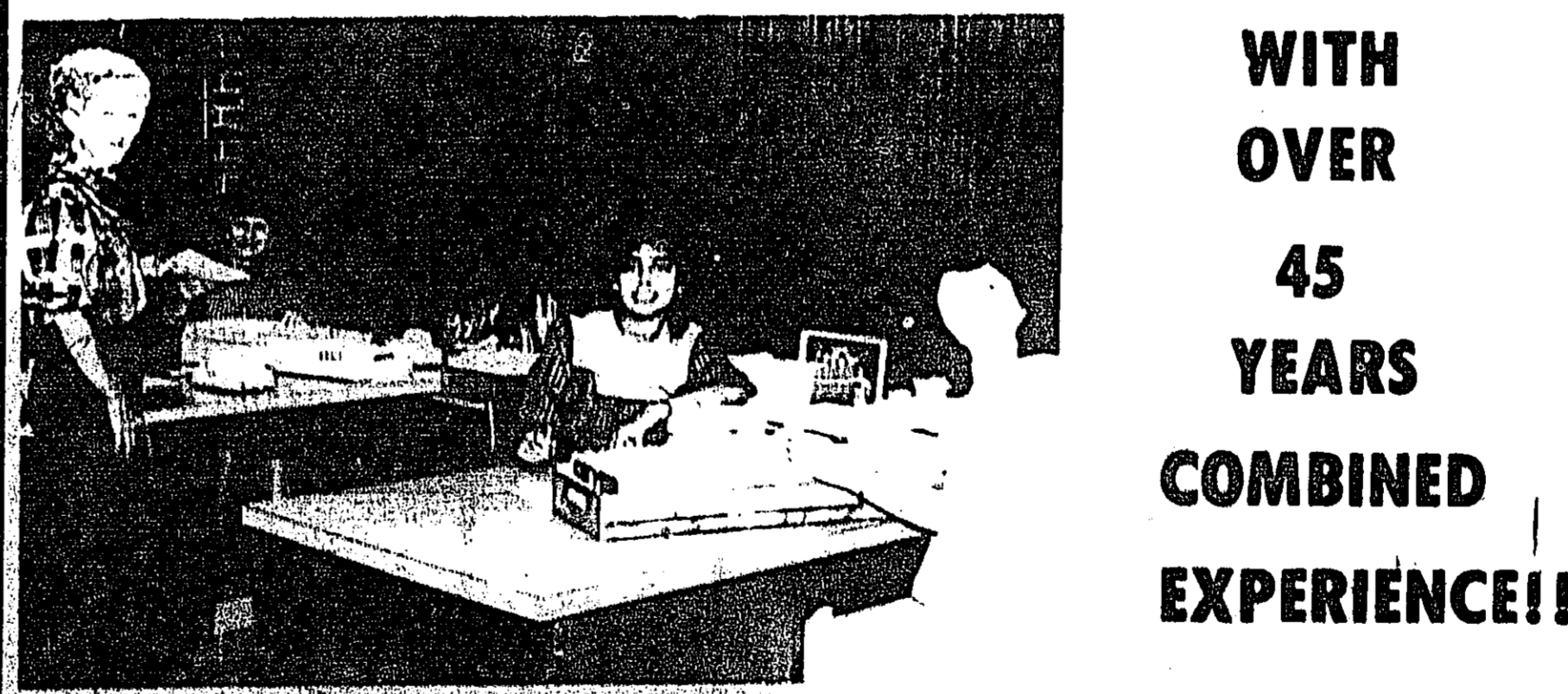

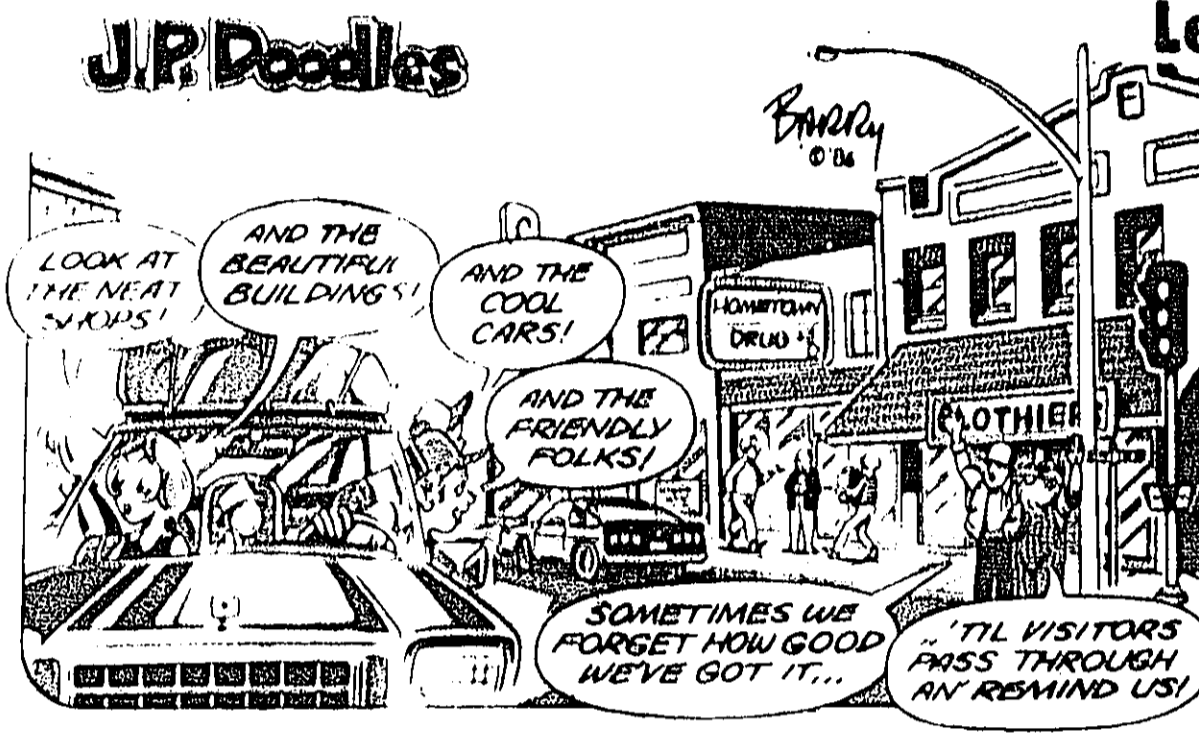

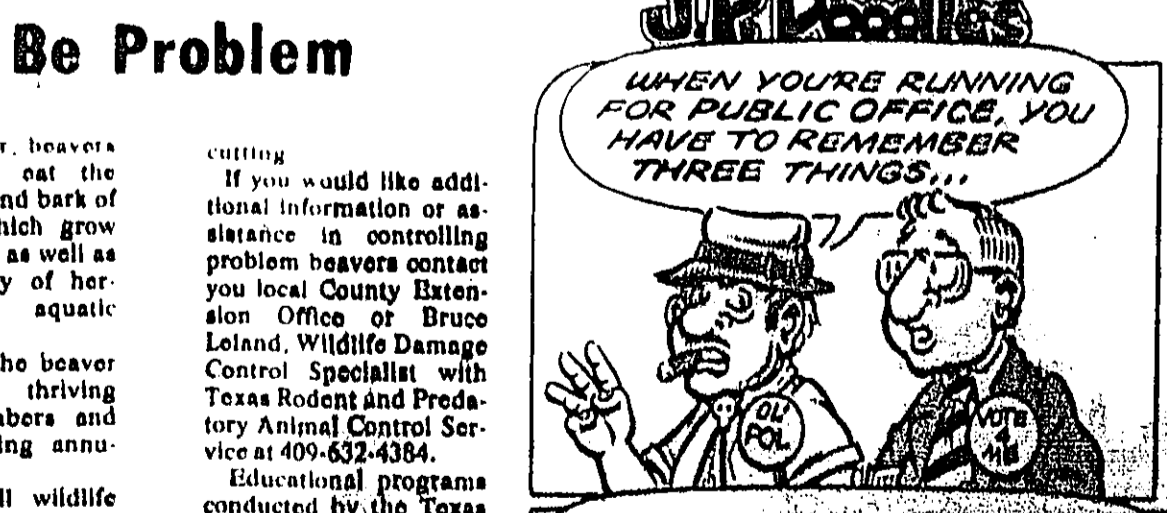

**TRIBUTE MONEY UNPAYABLE DEBT**

Even worse, suppose that I earn \$1,000, which I am allowed to keep, but am forced to promise \$100 of tribute in the future. In this case the \$100 is entered into the monetary bookkeeping system but the \$100 doesn't even exist and, hence, is unpayable. Enough of this type of tribute creates a large bookkeeping item for which money does not exist. That is why we, Mexico and all other countries have large national debts. All national debts are the result of tribute money charged, as interest, in excess of money in existence, hence unpayable.

All over America and the world a great amount of unemployment is the direct result of exacting tribute money that should be used to employ someone in doing viable work.

To those who are objecting to the tribute money, for this unemployment, few employees are needed. There is no thought given, by these persons, of having very heavy debt derived from New Technology, going to the employees. Now we are not an autocratic nation (or are we?) all nations. These benefits should be passed off by reducing the length of the work week, instead of putting them into excess interest, dividends and bonuses.

Two years ago national statistics showed that the combined debts of government, business and individuals exceeded \$11 trillion. Our excess interest exceeds 8%.

Eight percent of \$11 trillion is \$880 billion. This is \$880 billion that should be used to pay for employment. This would pay 88 million people each \$10,000 per year. Think what it would do for the prosperity of the nation if the 88 million lowest paid individuals each received a \$10,000 per year raise (or their income).

Ooo, how devastating that our people would be! God bless America, who blesses the God, and all!!!

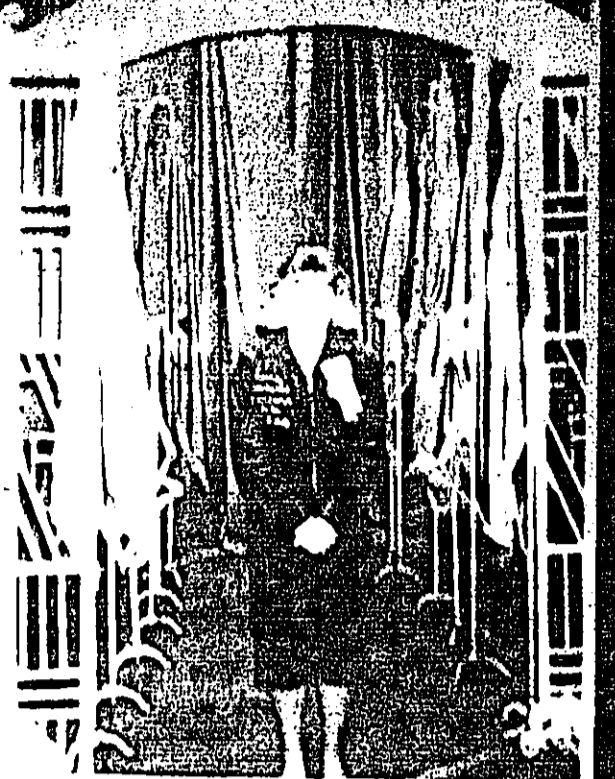


