## Beetle Said In 'Decline'

**COLLEGE STATION-** The multi-million-dollar devastation by the southern pine beetle to that Texas finally appears to be declining, from the 1985 record level, but at least eleven counties still have epidemic infestations.

Statewide, there is a combined total of 4,481 infestations in 13 East Texas counties with Tyler County ranked No. 25.

Nine of the eleven epidemic counties have received the "epidemic" designation for the first time this year. They are Harrison, Panola, Nacogdoches, Shelby, Cherokee, Rusk, Harris, Orange and Marion counties.

Montgomery County (Conroe) has suffered epidemic level infestations for three straight

years, and Liberty County is in the epidemic stage for the second consecutive year.

In 1985, the worst year on record in Texas, there were 14 counties in epidemic stage, with the tiny bark beetle causing timber losses estimated at more than \$60 million.

Also an estimated \$50 million in damage was caused in 1984 by the millions of little insects that can kill a 60-year-old pine tree in a matter of days.

Dr. Ron Billings, principal entomologist for the Texas Forest Service, said that Harrison County was the number one ranked epidemic county as of the latest aerial survey conducted July 30.

Harrison (Marshall), Panola (Carthage) and Rusk (Henderson) counties had a combined total of 1,442 beetle spots with a "spot" being the designation for an area of ten or more beetle infested trees.

To indicate the severity of this insect damage, the total 1,442 spots in the three adjacent counties this year would convert into 6,759,400 board feet of lumber of enough to build 615 average size (1,755 square foot) homes.

Figuring at four people per homestead that would be almost enough homes to shelter the entire population of the

towns of Karnack, Scottville, Latam and Minden.

Another graphic example is that the timber lost in these 1,444 spots if converted to log truck loads would equal an end to end line of log trucks more than ten miles long.

If the same conversion

examples were applied to the state total of 4,481 beetle spots, the damaged timber would amount to bumper to bumper log truck loads line up for 30 and a half miles of enough lumber to build 1,910 average size homes.

Dr. Billings explained that the number of spots he never does not necessarily correlate with the "epidemic" designation which is given to counties with more than one spot per every 1,000 acres.

This means that there are many other East Texas counties which still have serious infestations.

The music park is located on Recreation Road 235 north of Calmeson.

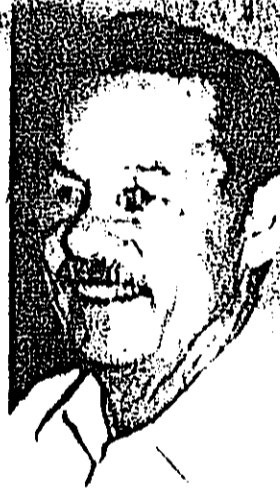
## Soil Scientist Here

Wiedenfeld says this soil survey is part of the technical assistance the Soil Conservation Service furnishes the Longleaf Soil and Water Conservation District. He says that when every spot is classified, a soil survey report will be published. It will contain everything we know or can find out about the soils, and should have some useful information for everyone that uses the land, says Wiedenfeld.

Wiedenfeld, a graduate of Texas A&M, has been with the Soil Conservation Service for 35 years. He has worked at Fredericksburg, San Saba, Lampasas, Ballinger and San Angelo.

## County Highway Injuries Total 20

The Texas Highway Patrol investigated 21 Rural Traffic accidents in Tyler County during the month of July, according to Sergeant Roy D. Henry, supervisor for this highway patrol sergeant area. Those accidents resulted in 0 deaths and 20 injuries.

The total rural traffic accidents for Tyler County for this year is 132, which have resulted in 2 deaths and 103 injuries.

The ten counties which comprise highway patrol sub-district 2B-B have had a total of 1410 rural traffic accidents this year, resulting in 56 deaths and 1047 injuries. This compares to 1419 accidents, 44 deaths, and 803 injuries reported during the same period last year (1985).

## Truckers Told New Law

DPS License & Weight Inspectors report they are encountering truckers who say they are unaware of a new law in Texas, S.B. 012, which became effective on January 1, 1986.

The statute requires that the name of the owner operator or lessee of commercial vehicles with three or more axles be displayed on both sides of the vehicle. All truck trailers also are included. The statute mandates lettering with a minimum height of two inches.

Failure to comply with the law is a class C misdemeanor offense which is punishable by a maximum fine of \$200.

Public utility vehicles hauling timber in its natural state on the first movement are exempt from the statute.

DPS officials indicate that most tractor trailer trucks were in compliance with the law as of last month's effective date.

The statute should help persons identify trucks which leave the scene of an accident or illegally dump waste.

Major W. P. Thomson, commander of The Texas Department of Public Safety, Houston Region, advised that all DPS offices, including Driver License, will be closed on Labor Day, September 1, 1986.

DPS Troopers will be on duty so that the primary law enforcement function will not be curtailed.

Dr. Edward Cullee Mann, 62, clinical director of Kerrville State Hospital, died Friday, July 25, at his home in Kerrville.

Private funeral services were held Monday, July 28, at Mission Funeral Park in North Van Antonio under the direction of Kerrville Funeral Home.

Mann went to the Hill Country area in 1955 as a staff psychiatrist, geropsychologist, consultant and coordinator of partial hospitalization at Kerrville State Hospital.

A distinguished physician and medical researcher, Mann was the author of over 26 publications which earned him professional recognition and awards nationwide. His final publication was a chapter for the second edition of the "Comprehensive Textbook of Psychiatry" published by McGraw-Hill.

## Watch Out For School Buses

Last year in Texas there were 1,228 accidents involving school buses, with seven fatalities and 223 non-fatal injuries. Schools are about to open again, and drivers are once more being cautioned to be unusually attentive in and around school zones and school buses.

An increasing problem in recent years has been drivers who either ignored or were unaware of the law restricting vehicles from passing a school bus while the bus is loading or unloading children. Children often cross the street in front of the bus, and a car that's trying to pass may not see them coming.

The problem became so bad two years ago that the Texas Legislature considered requiring buses to have mechanical arms at the driver's window that would extend into the traffic lane while the bus is stopped. At present, buses in Texas have flashing lights at the front and back of the vehicle when stopped, as well as signs noting that vehicles are required to stop for the buses.

To emphasize the importance of stopping for buses, the State Department of Highways and Public Transportation has produced public service announcements with Texas singer-songwriter Jerry Jeff Walker as its spokesman. Walker, the 44 year old author of the classic, "Mr. Bojangles," has a flow in the message he offers in the television commercial.

"It's important to note that stopping for those flashing red lights is not just a courtesy, it's the law," Walker said. "That means stopping whether you're behind the bus or approaching it from the other lane."
