Tyler County Pledges \$4,622 For MDA

Benjamin, Texas (Sept. 2) - Jerry Lewis's 1986 Telethon - The Twenty-First Annual Labor Day Extravaganza to benefit the Muscular Dystrophy Association (MDA) - raised \$34,096,973. Southeast Texas viewers of the show, aired locally on KFDX-TV, Channel 6, showed their support by pledging \$262,720.00. Woodville and Tyler County pledged a total of \$2,516.00 and added to that a total of \$2,106.44 in cash contribution and special event monies. The local push was headed up by Skeeter Skinner of the H & R Block Office here. "We're tremendously grateful to the people of Southeast Texas for their all-out support of the Telethon," said Ellen

Curran, President of MDA's Southeast Texas Chapter. "Their pledges to help Jerry's Kids will help lead us to the treatments and cures MDA is seeking." Proceeds live from Caesars Palace in Las Vegas, the marathon show, and hosted by MDA National Chairman Jerry Lewis, who was backed by anchorman Ed McMahon and Co-hosts Casey Kasem in Las Vegas and Tony Orlando in New York City. Hundreds of performers brought their talent and personal support to the marathon broadcast. "The Telethon brings together the shining lights of show business," noted Lewis. "To see so much talent and energy united to help My Kids

and adults with muscle diseases is proof positive that show people are the greatest." Lewis also praised the nearly 200 "LOVE NETWORK" stations across the country that carried the Telethon into millions of homes. "OUR LOVE NETWORK" stations make the telethon possible," remarked Lewis.

"They bring together millions of Americans who unite on Labor Day in support of MDA's efforts to conquer Neuro-muscular Diseases." PIC Head Here

W. Floyd Clark, Chairman of the Deep East Texas Private Industry Council, will be in Tyler County to hold an Economic Development meeting on Sept. 3rd at the Citizens State Bank Community Room in Woodville. Eric Peyton, JTPA Public Relations Coordinator, will assist

with the meeting which will focus on the economic concerns of the County. The Private Industry Council is a regional body which governs the administration of the two million-dollar Job Training Partnership Act (JTPA). The JTPA was began in 1982 to replace the ill-fated CETA program. The JTPA program differs from CETA by having a major emphasis placed on involvement by private business. The Private Industry Council allows business and government to have an equal voice in decisions and policy making.

At present, the Private Industry Council (PIC) is composed of 37 members who are nominated by local business, approved by the Chief Elected Official (Judge Wayne Baker of Polk County) 2247,

and appointed by the Governor. The members in Tyler County include Connie Clark, owner of The Flower Shop, Inc. in Woodville, John Coker, President and CEO of Citizens State Bank also serves on the Council. Mr. Clark and Mr. Coker each serve on the Public Relations Committee.

Clark states that "the primary objective of the meeting is to discuss the concerns of the county and to explore ways in which JTPA could better address those concerns." During the Sept. 3rd meeting, Clark will also honor the local PIC members for their efforts and participation. Warren Begins Year Fully Accredited

According to Superintendent Joe Woodland, the Warren Independent School District has been returned to a fully accredited status by the Texas Education Agency. Woodland made the announcement after the District received a letter from Dr. Burt Dibek, Head of the Accreditation Department of TEA, which stated that all minor changes requested

by TEA have been made resulting in the reinstatement of full accreditation to the District. Woodland is looking forward to the 1986-87 school year and feels that "it will be a good one for the District." "We are starting with a full staff and are in real good shape in that department," Woodland said. He is also excited that Warren High School will

offer a seven-period day rather than the six period day of previous years. According to Woodland, "This will be of great benefit to our students, especially those trying to stay on the Honors Track and still have time for an elective of their choosing."

The Warren Independent School District Board of Trustees met Tuesday, August 26, and granted the request of teacher Bonnie Burrow to incorporate the Liaison Committee into Board Policy. The Committee was formed in January, 1985, for the purpose of establishing and main-

taining communication between teachers and the Board. The Committee, consisting of selected teachers and Board members, has been meeting on a regular basis since it was formed. The Board voted unanimously to officially recognize the Liaison

Committee and to place it in the Board Policy Manual. In other business, the Board awarded the District's Fleet Insurance business to Tyler County Farm Bureau for a bid of \$7,687.00. Stephanie Yearwood was employed as English teacher at High School.

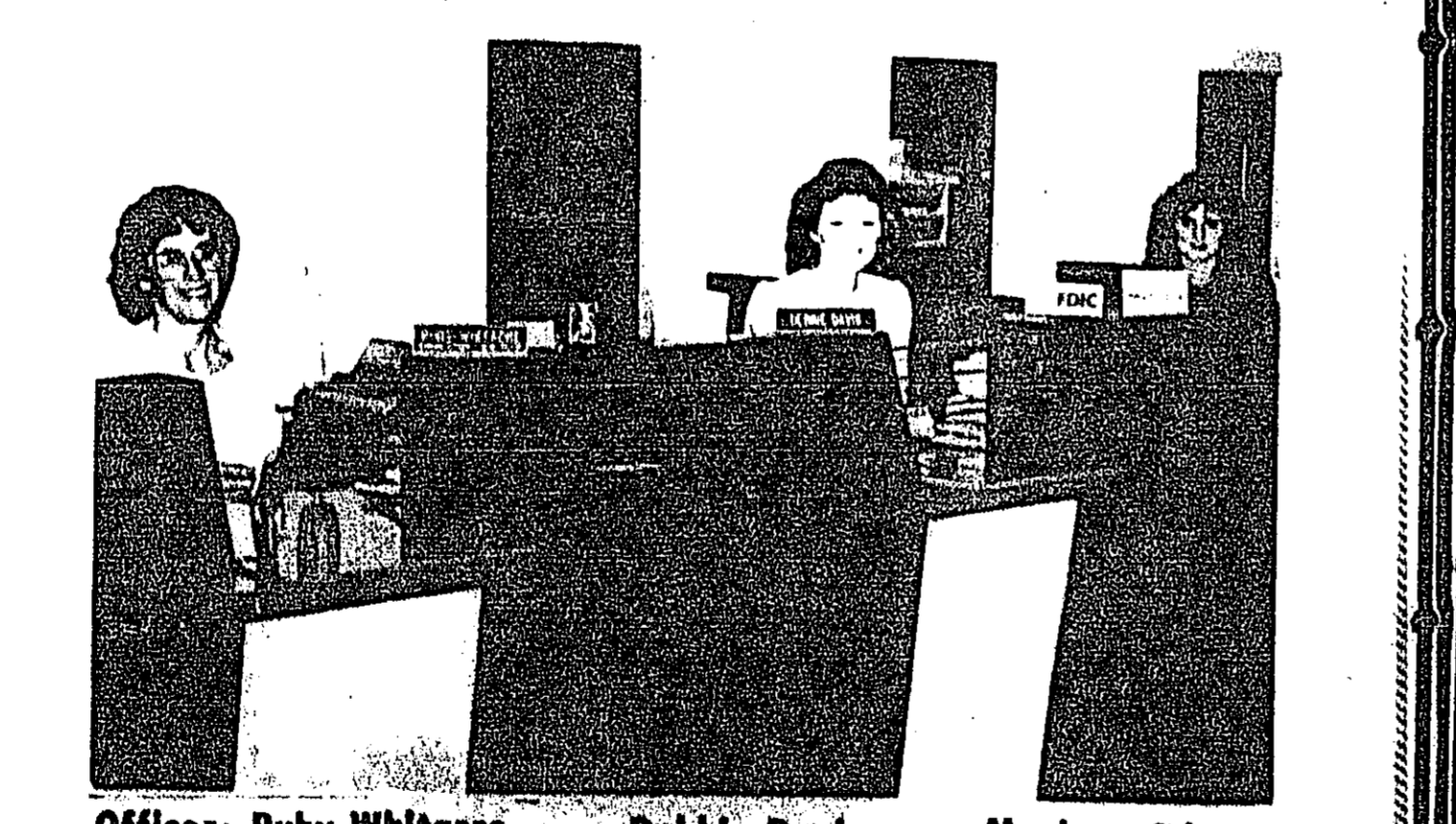

Reduce Credit Charges Soon

If you have large unpaid balances on your credit card accounts, now may be a good time to analyze your credit spending habits. Why now? Tyler County Extension Agent James Marquis says that the tax reform proposals now in Congress all for eliminating the deduction for interest paid on credit cards, so it may be advisable to begin reducing interest expenses this year.

Another good reason for reducing credit expenses is the difference in interest rates for credit cards and for other forms of borrowing.

"Depending on the kind of charge card and where it was issued, consumers are paying annual percentage rates ranging from 12 1/2% to over 20%," she says. "Since home mortgage rates are in the 10% range, auto loans are somewhat less, and your savings dollars are earning no more than 6 1/2% interest rates, for credit cards seem high."

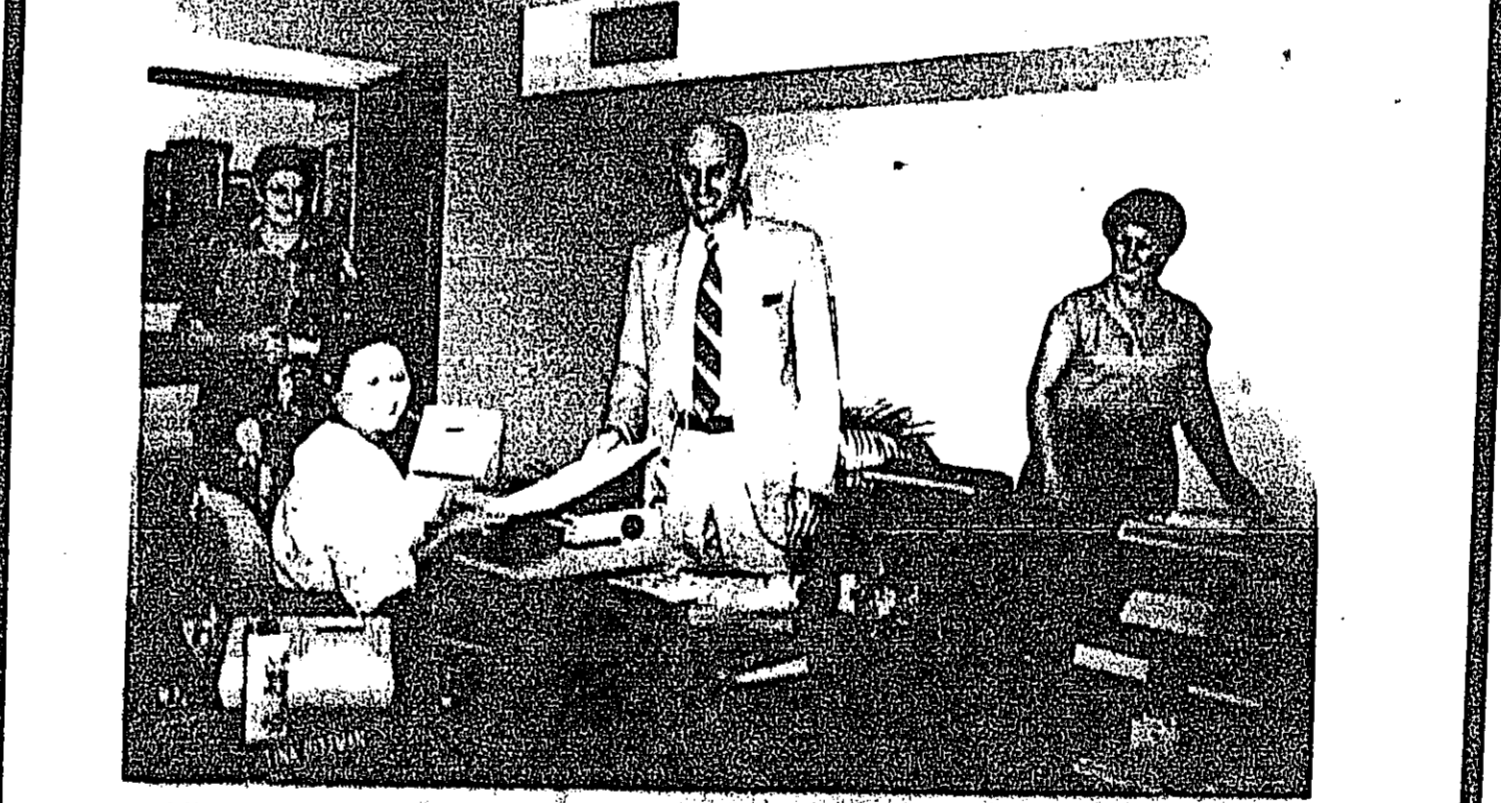
The grandfather is William C. Seltz, Sr. who held the post of a seminary professor at Bealey Seminary in Bealey, Ohio, until his death.

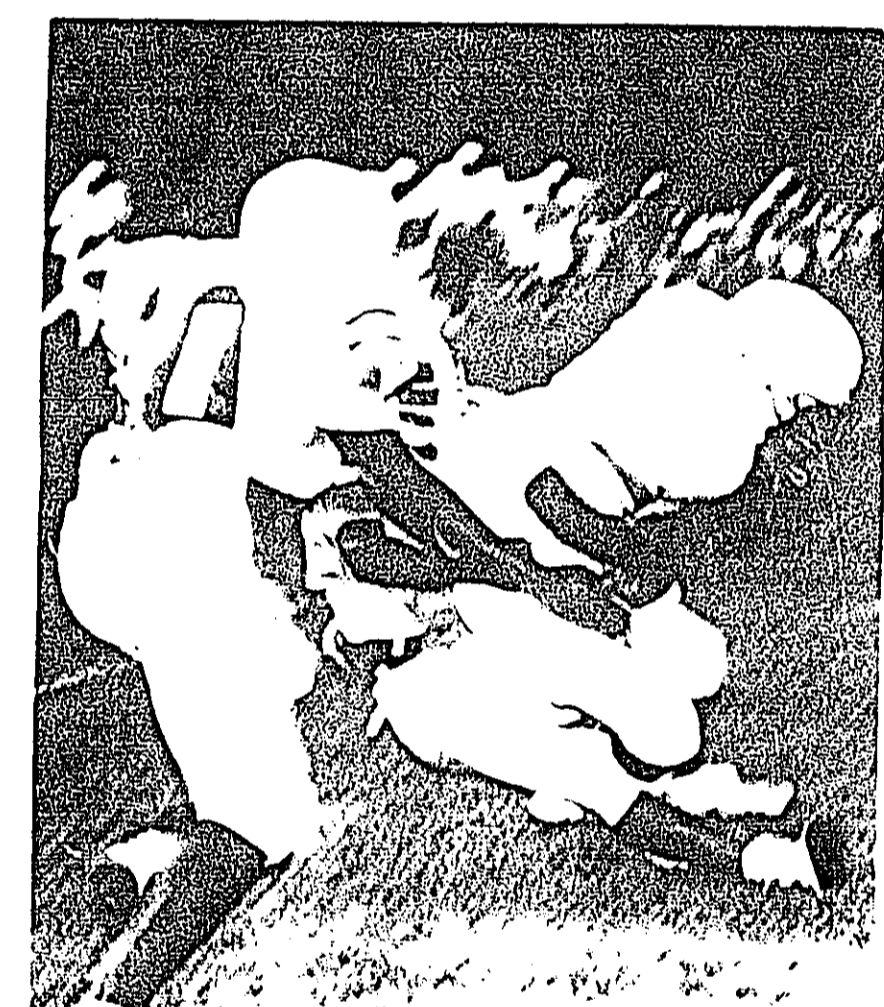
