

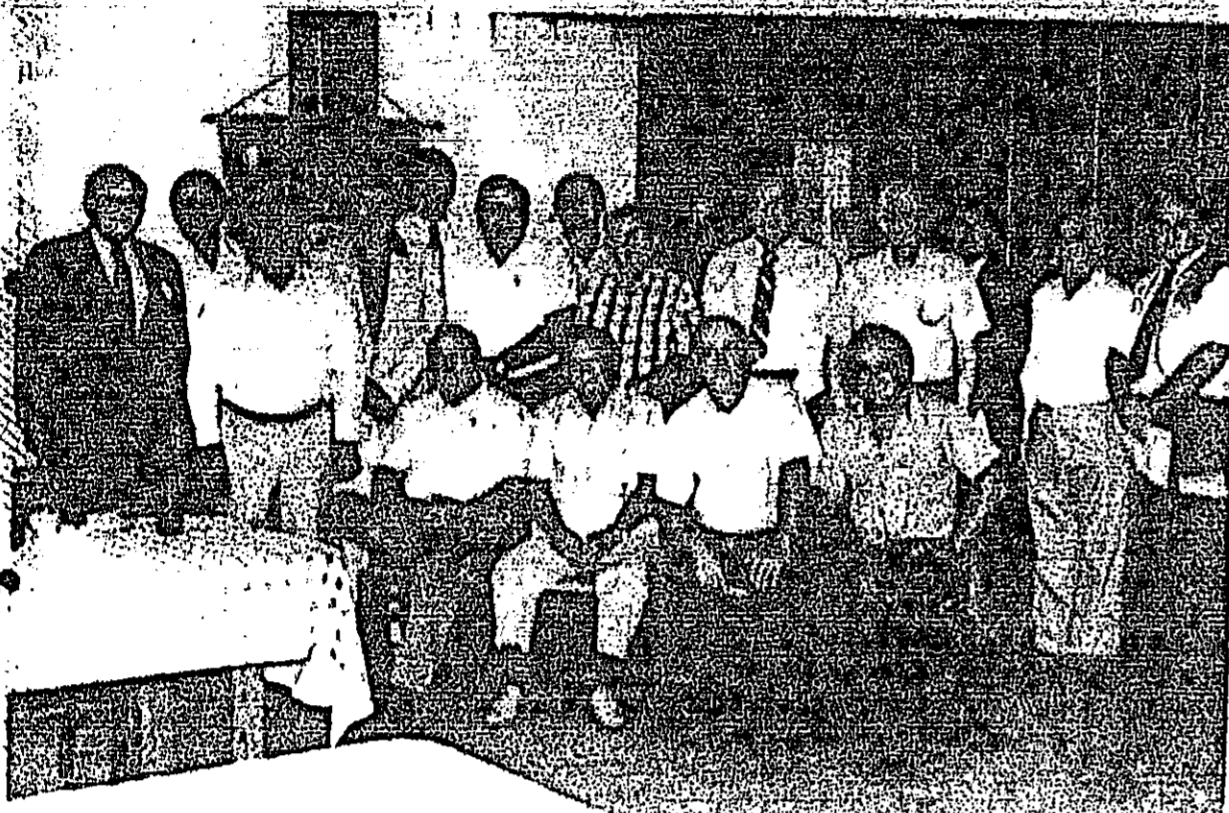

Lions Hear Hunger Talk

Tyler County Lions Club members didn't go away hungry for a talk of food Thursday after hearing Caring Is Sharing representative Linda Sowarby give an account of the World's hunger situation in general and Tyler County's hunger problem specifically.

Sowarby said, "It's really hard to talk to a group about hunger just after they've eaten."

Sowarby who is on the board of directors of the Caring Is Sharing Program here was invited to give a report to the membership about the service which has been provided since the Sharing group was formed in 1985. Sowarby reported that 16.2 percent of Tyler County's population, or 2,590 persons, are considered poor. From May 31 through July 19, 1986 the food stamps office in Tyler County assisted 680 households for a stamp value of \$93,352. Woodville alone represents 261 households or 729 people for a dollar expenditure of \$33,944, or one third," she said.

Governor Mark White will in Jasper on Saturday, Sept. 20 where he will serve as guest speaker at the ground breaking ceremonies for the Jasper County Mental Health Mental Retardation Center.

Master of ceremonies for the 4:30 p.m. event is Judge Allen Sturrock of Tyler County, chairman of the Deep East Texas MHMR Board of Trustees.

In June, White announced a \$250,000

grant would be given to Jasper County MHMR center. The funds, made available through the Texas Department of Community Affairs' community development program, were earmarked for construction of a new facility at the Jasper center, located on f.m. 777, northwest of Jasper.

One of three buildings comprising the center was gutted in an April 4 fire. The grant money will allow for the replacement of this building.

The new facility will house the center's workshop, business offices and therapy offices. Additional space will then be available in the older buildings to make room for a basic skills unit and an increase in the size of the psychiatric medical clinic.

The basic skills unit will be an educational program for the severely and profoundly retarded and developmentally disabled. It will provide pre-vocational training and will teach developmental and adaptive living skills.

The Lufkin firm, Ghodwin-Latter, has projected a Nov. 30 opening for completion of the building. In February, with completion estimated at six months.

The public is invited to attend the ground-breaking ceremonies.

Dr. Mason To Present Indian 'Heritage'

Dr. Melvin R. Mason will present "Alabama-Coushatta: A Proud Heritage" on Tuesday evening, September 23 at the Reservation's Community Center on Highway 190.

In recent years, Dr. Mason has made presentations on the Alabama-Coushatta for the American Folklore Society and other groups, including the American Studies Association of Texas. He is the immediate past president of the Texas Folklore Society and is a former president of the College English Association of Texas and of the American Studies Association of Texas. He wrote

Dr. Mason is beginning his twenty first year as a professor in the English Department at Sam Houston State University. 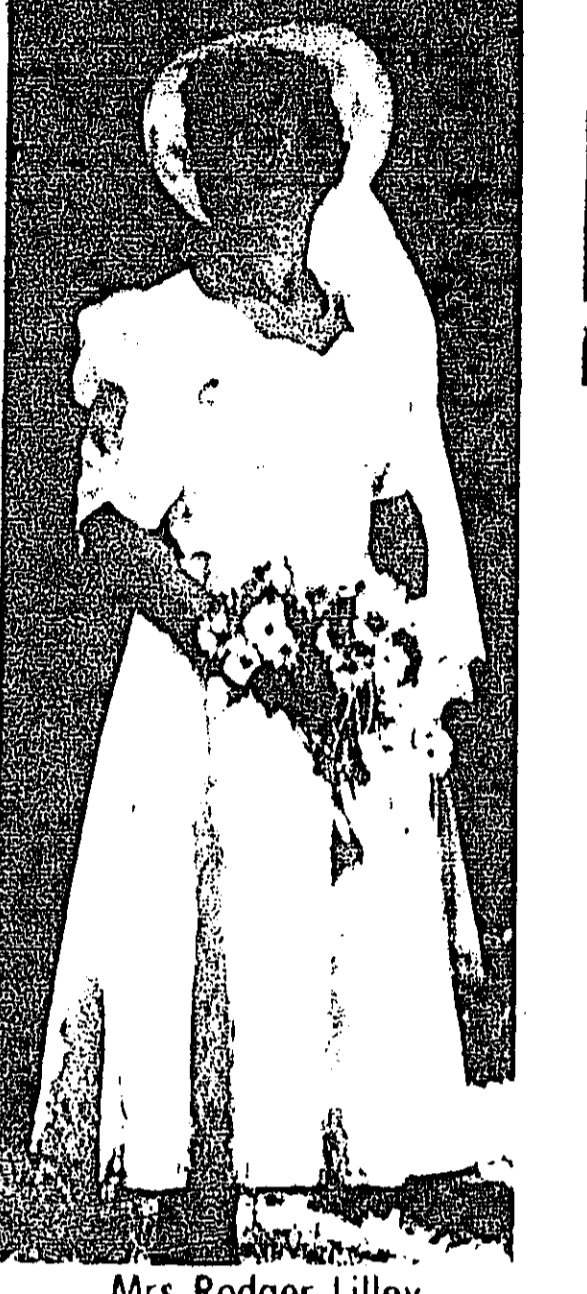

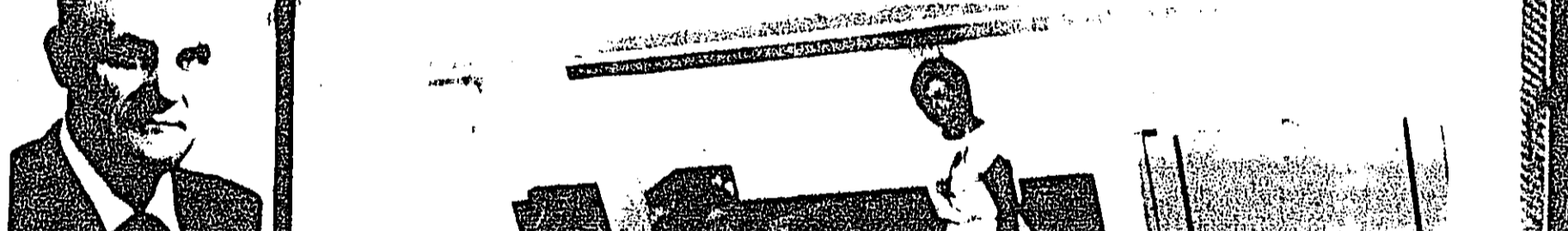

THREE-MINUTE FISH CLEANING
Recently I came across a simple set of instructions. They outlined how to clean and fillet a fish in three minutes with seven strokes of a knife.

BROILED TEXAS BASS
Wash and clean the fish. Cut it in half lengthwise along the backbone. Cut off the head on the gill plate. As soon as the cut is started, keep the knife level and cut along the backbone to the gill plate. You may need to use a sawing action as you cut through the rib bones. Stop when you reach the gill plate.

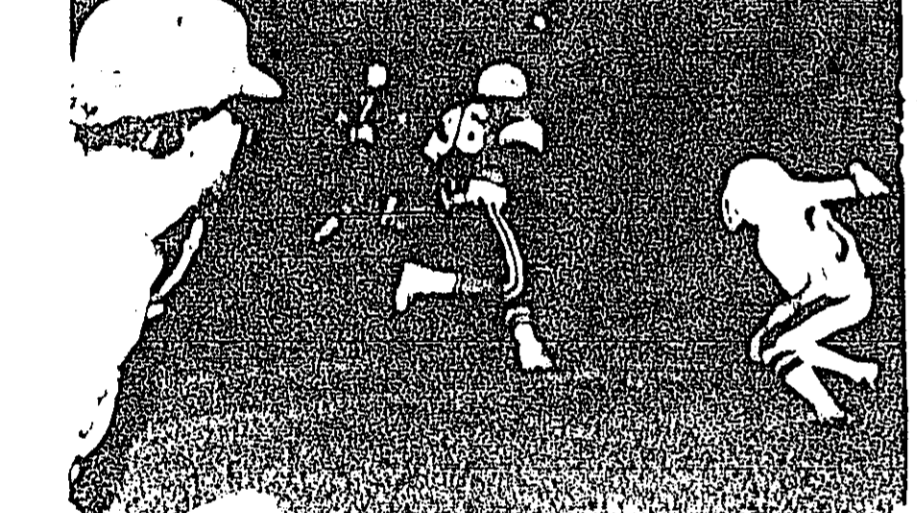

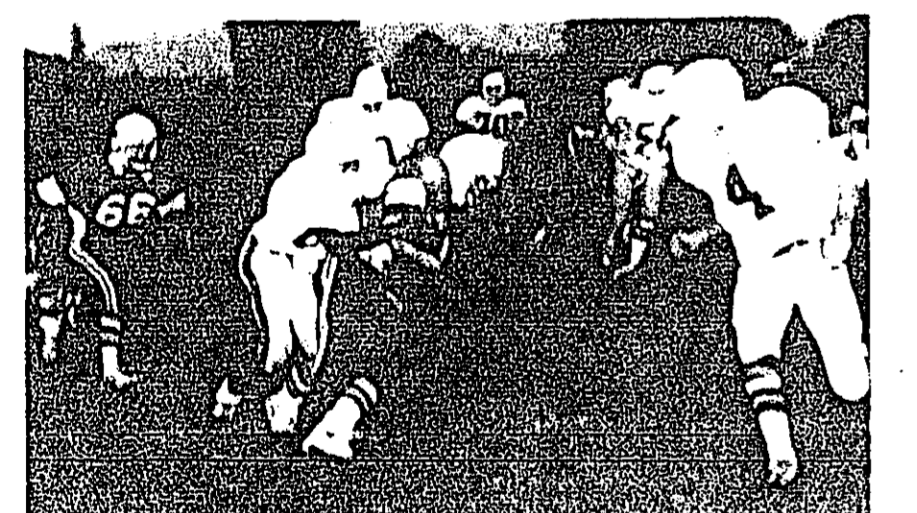

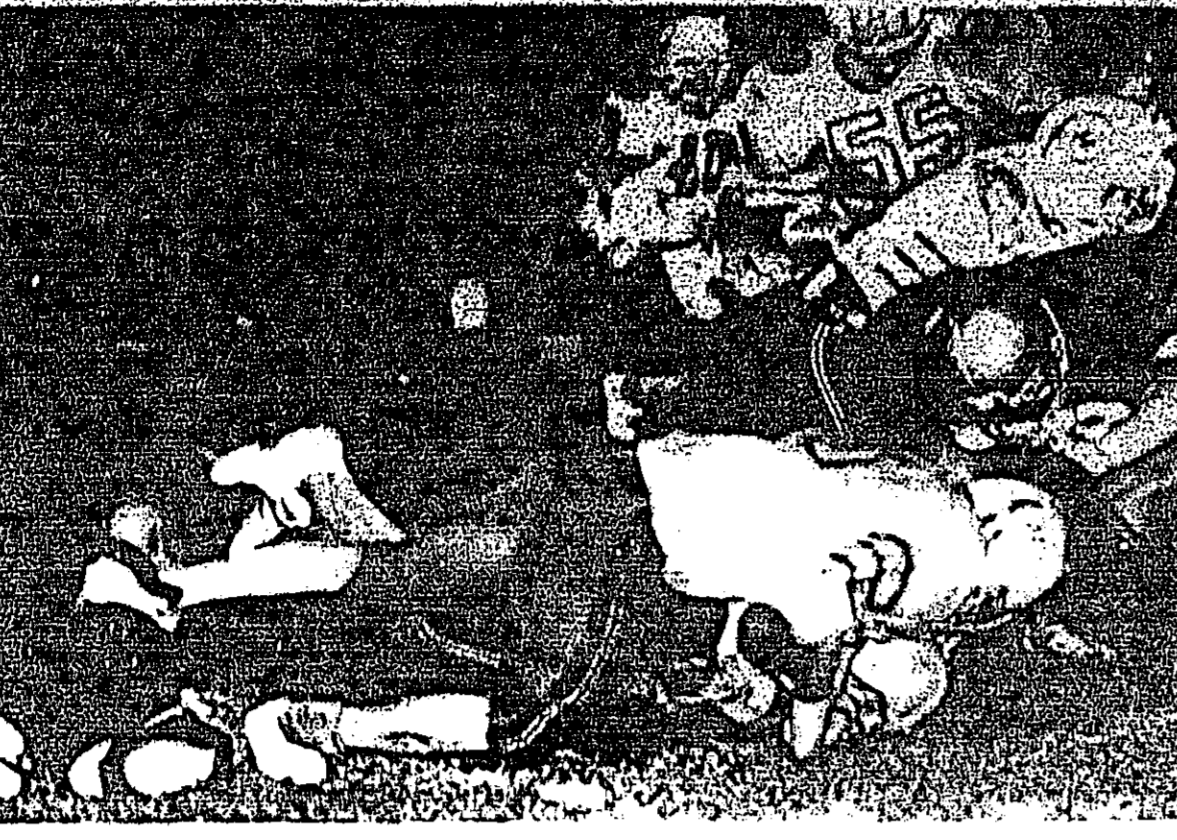

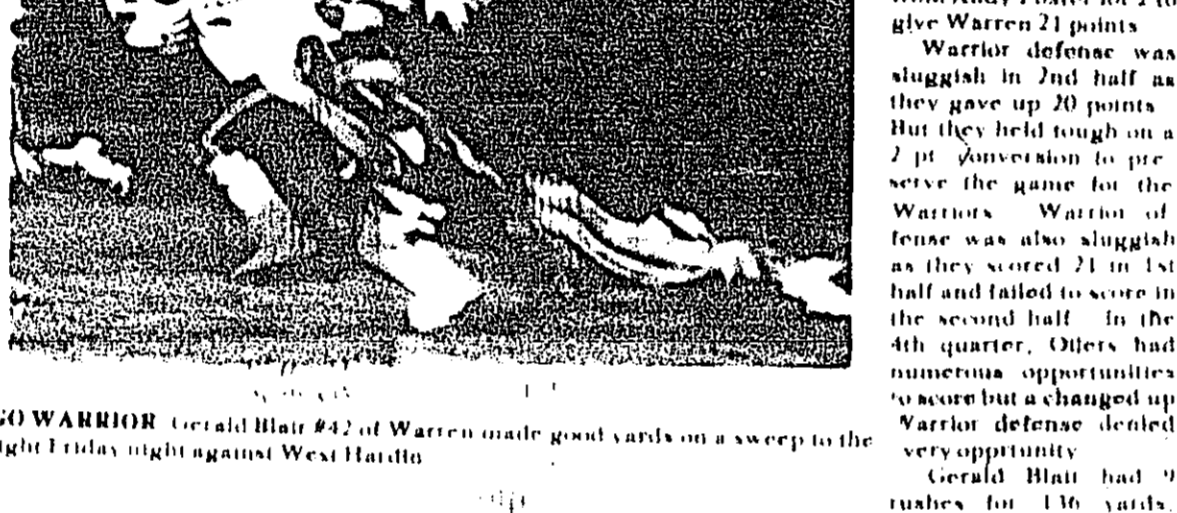

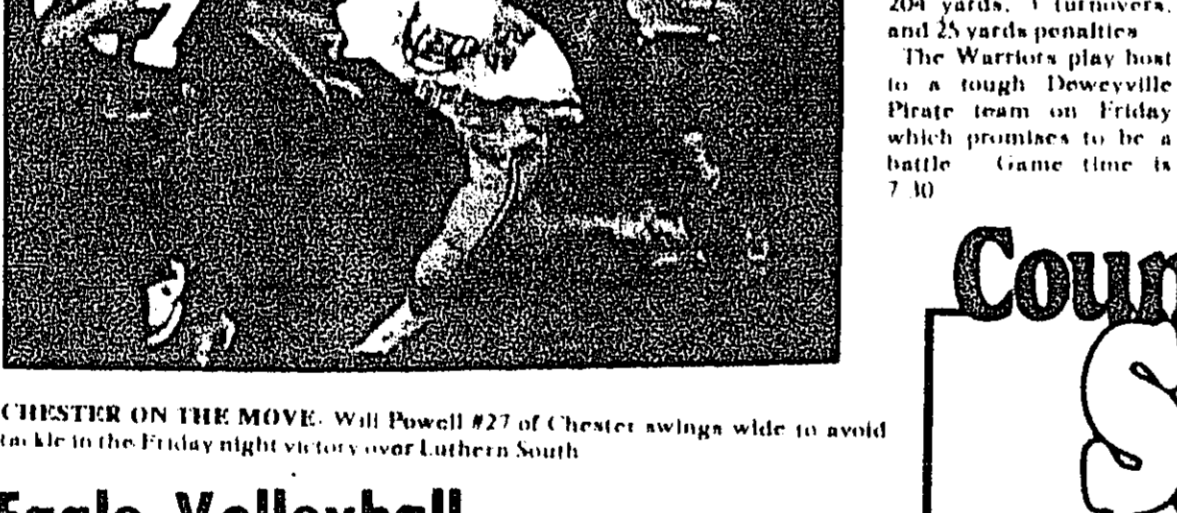
A WINNER: A Warren Warrior goes for short yards in their victory over West Hardin Friday night.

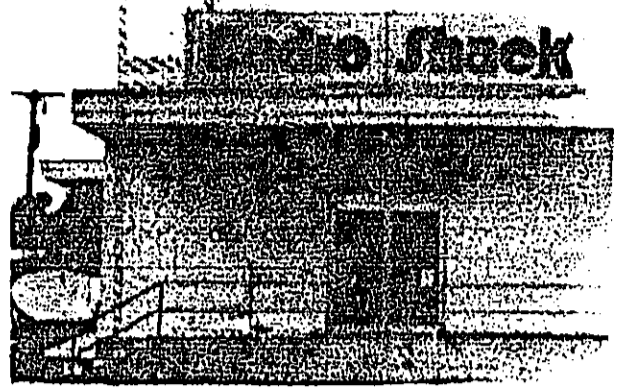

BRIEF EXPLANATORY STATEMENTS OF PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS GENERAL ELECTION NOVEMBER 4, 1988

PROPOSITION NO. 1 ON THE BALLOT
Senate Joint Resolution 16 proposes a constitutional amendment that would permit the legislature to provide by general law for the apportionment of the value of real and personal property for the purpose of property taxation and would delete the requirement that the legislature comply with both statutory and constitutional law in the apportionment currently being made by the State Property Tax Board in conjunction with the Comptroller.

Currently, a law is invalidated if a court finds its caption is defective. The amendment would provide that past and future amendments may not be held void on the basis of an insufficient title.

The amendment also would amend the constitution to provide that the state laws be revised every two years, and instead would provide for continuing revision of state laws.

PROPOSITION NO. 2 ON THE BALLOT
Senate Joint Resolution 33 proposes a constitutional amendment that would require the constitution of a bill to be expressed in its title with a mandate that each house of the legislature adopt rules of procedure that would require the subject of each bill to be expressed in its title in a manner that gives the legislature and the public reasonable notice of that subject. Determining compliance with the rule would be the responsibility of the legislature.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows:
"The constitutional amendment allowing political subdivisions the opportunity to engage in and transact business with authorized mutual insurance companies in the same manner as with other insurance companies."

PROPOSITION NO. 3 ON THE BALLOT
House Joint Resolution 23 proposes a constitutional amendment that would permit the legislature to authorize any county, city, town, or other political subdivision to use public funds or credit to pay interest premiums on nonresidential life, health, or accident policies. Due to the prohibition in the constitution against the lending of credit and granting of public money, political subdivisions currently are prohibited from becoming shareholders in associations such as mutual insurance companies, in which policyholders are shareholders. A nonresidential mutual insurance policy does not allow a company to raise capital by assessing the policyholder an extra amount on a pre-

PROPOSITION NO. 4 ON THE BALLOT
Senate Joint Resolution 4 proposes a constitutional amendment that would repeal the prohibition against branch banking by state and national banks domiciled in this state to establish and operate banking facilities at locations within the county or city where they are domiciled. The amendment would also authorize the legislature to permit a state bank or a national bank domiciled in this state to engage in business at more than one place if it acquires a failed state bank or national bank domiciled in this state.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows:
"The constitutional amendment provides that a bank may offer full service banking at more than one location within the city or county where its principal facility is located, subject to limitations and restrictions provided by law."

PROPOSITION NO. 5 ON THE BALLOT
Senate Joint Resolution 45 proposes a constitutional amendment that would allow mutual insurance companies and stock companies to bid for life and health group policies of political subdivisions. Public liability will be limited to the payment of premiums specified in the contract.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows:
"The constitutional amendment allowing political subdivisions the opportunity to engage in and transact business with authorized mutual insurance companies in the same manner as with other insurance companies."

PROPOSITION NO. 6 ON THE BALLOT
Senate Joint Resolution 46 proposes a constitutional amendment that would allow state banks and national banks domiciled in this state to establish and operate banking facilities at locations within the county or city where they are domiciled. The amendment would also authorize the legislature to permit a state bank or a national bank domiciled in this state to engage in business at more than one place if it acquires a failed state bank or national bank domiciled in this state.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows:
"The constitutional amendment provides that a bank may offer full service banking at more than one location within the city or county where its principal facility is located, subject to limitations and restrictions provided by law."

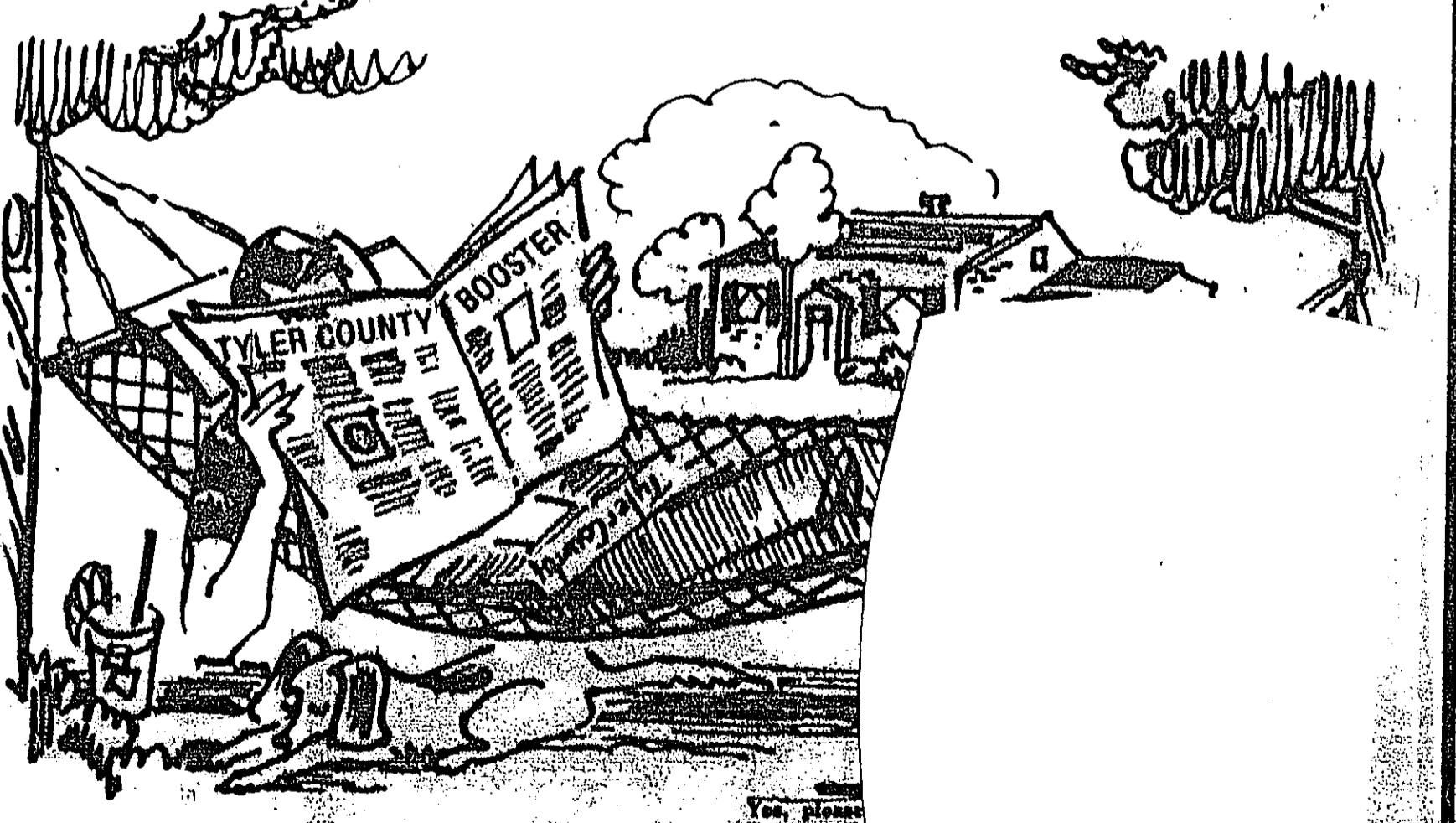
