Agent ArmentROUT Launches Column

John asked me to write a brief column about what is going on in agriculture in general, and also here in Tyler County. You know, a lot of folks don't pay that much attention to agriculture anymore, but they really should. Even though not as many people are full-time farmers anymore, this state's economy still relies very heavily on agriculture as well as oil and gas. When both are depressed, so is the economy. Here in Tyler County, we sell about \$28.5 million dollars of commodities each year. The biggest part of this is timber sales, followed by beef

cattle and horticulture. You know, you hear a lot about the plight of the small farmer and it is true. Small farmers have had a hard time for the past several years, and it doesn't really look any better for the near future. However, while the number of full-time farmers are decreasing, the number of part-time farmers are increasing. This is probably due to some farmers needing a supplemental income and also is due to folks moving to the country and supplementing their income with agriculture. Our office met with local leaders last summer who developed some long

range issues for the Tyler Co. Extension Service to work on. During this next year, we will be offering a program on marketing, beef cattle, home gardens, forestry, forage production, enterprise diversity and agriculture. Now don't misunderstand - we are still offering the same services we have in the past - these are just some programs we are going to emphasize next year. Don't forget - the Tyler County Fair is Oct. 3 & 4 this year, and the hay show will be on Oct. 14. For more information, call me at 283-2482 or just stop by for a visit.

In Fred Bus Route Changes Ok'd

The Warren Independent School District Board of Trustees approved bus route changes in Fred Tuesday, September 23, which will enable Fred Elementary students to arrive at the Fred campus later and leave as soon as school is dismissed. The request for this action is one that has

been brought before the Board several times over the past few years. The reason for denial in the past was that the state would not pay money for double routes. According to Superintendent Joe Woodland, the state allotment is paid on a per student basis and is available for the new routes. In the past, Fred Elementary students have ridden the buses

that continue on to Warren in the morning. This caused them to arrive at the Fred campus very early and then stay late in the afternoons while they waited for the buses to return from Warren. The Board vote on the bus route changes was unanimous.

Mrs. Paul Houchin addressed the School Dress and Hair Code and the effect it had on their family. She requested that the Dress and Hair Code be removed or changed. According to Mrs. Houchin, "Hair touching the collar doesn't interfere with the learning process. This school is so 'progressive' that they allow a smoking area when smoking has been proven detrimental to good health. Long hair

is neither unhealthy nor unsafe. Mrs. Houchin expressed the opinion that the school was intruding upon territory that belonged to her and her husband. She said, "My husband and I are morally and financially responsible and the decision as to how our child looks should be up to us. The issue is not whether you men like long or short hair. It is that as a parent we have a right to make that decision." Mrs. Houchin stated that when her son was told to cut his hair that he chose to have his head shaved. Mrs. Houchin was told by the Board that if she wished to pursue the issue that she or her son should go through the Student Council. All changes in the present Handbook originate with the Student Council even though final approval must be made by the Board.

tion. Proceeds will be used to upgrade equipment that we might better serve you. Thank you for your support.



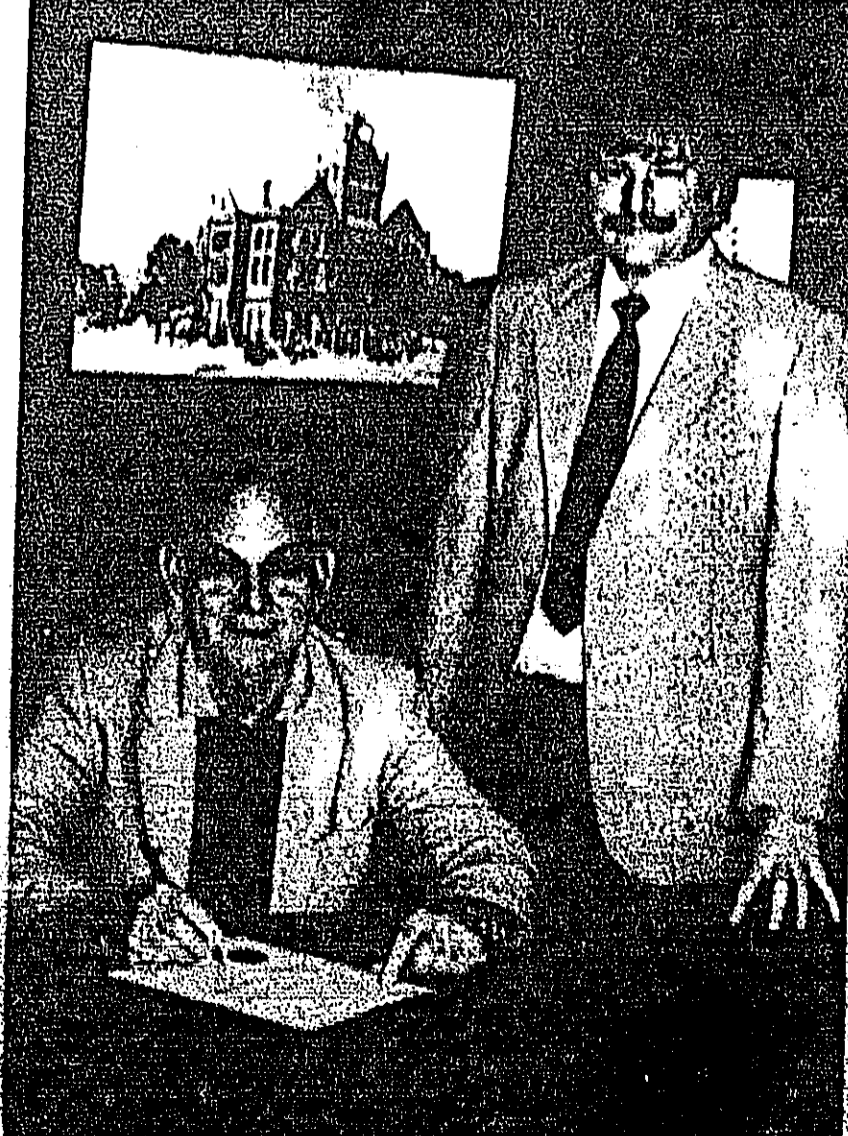
TAKING APPLICATIONS - The Tyler County Youth Development Center is currently taking applications for the position of Director of the facility. In the photo above are board members

Hwy 190 Widening To Begin

More than three miles of US 190 in Tyler County will be widened and improved as the result of a contract awarded at the September meeting of the State Highway and Public Transportation Commission. Roland Hines, an engineer with the Highway Department in Jasper, said portions of the two-lane highway extending westward from Woodville will be widened to four lanes. Climbing lanes will be added in other portions along the

stretch. "The alignment will not be changed," Hines said, "but we will improve the grade and surface." Some shoulder areas will be flattened to improve safety, he said. P. R. Lewis Construction Co., Inc. and J. J. Construction Co., Inc. of Nacogdoches were awarded the \$3,555,140.04 contract. Hines said work will begin in October and be completed in about two years.

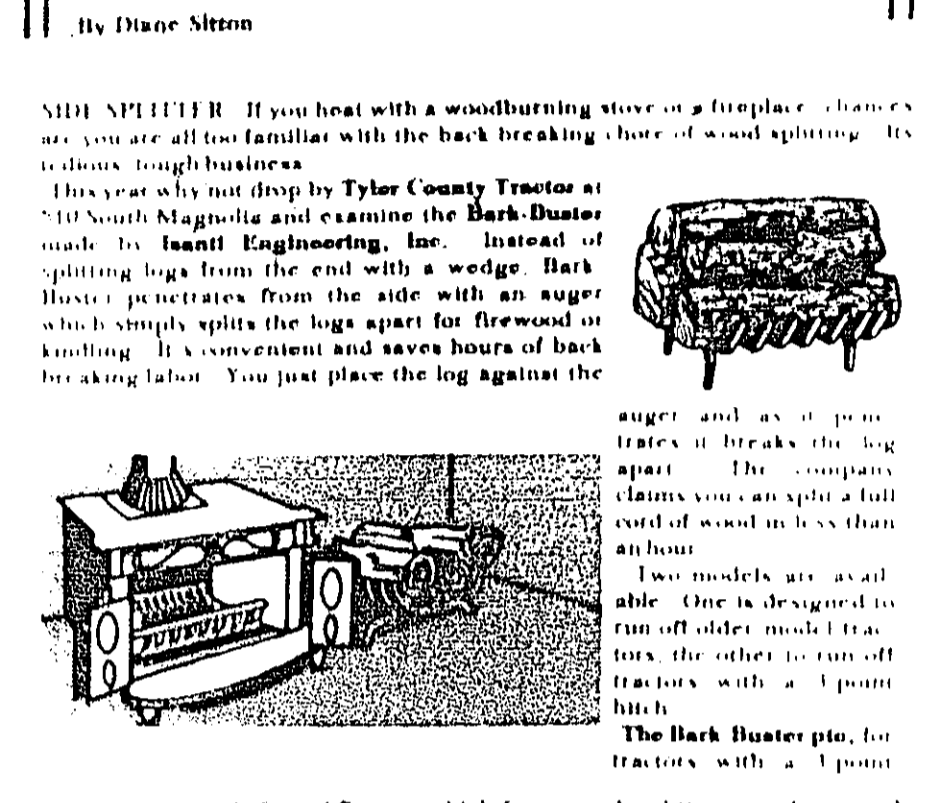

A general rule is: The heavier the wood, the longer it will burn and the more heat it will produce. Hard woods and fruit woods are best. A cord of wood is 2 feet wide, 4 feet high, 8 feet long. 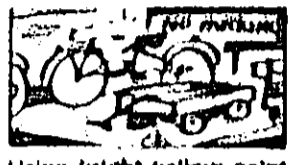
