Life Flight Helipad Dedication Set Nov. 24

Texas Governor Mark White has proclaimed the week of November 2-8 as "Life Flight Week" throughout Texas to mark Life Flight's anniversary. Ten of the communities served by Hermann Hospital's Life Flight will celebrate this milestone with local "Life Flight Over Texas" ceremonies.

"This vital service has provided the quick and decisive emergency treatment required to save lives, spare patients and their families needless suffering and improve the chances of survival for victims of serious injury and illness," White said.

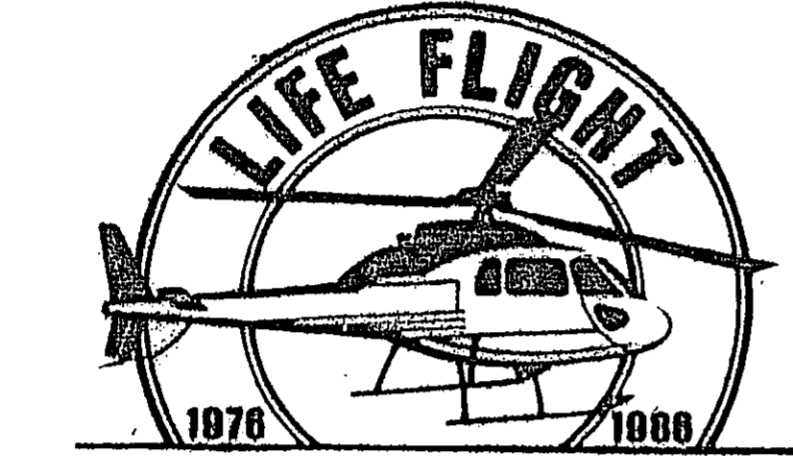
"The response of Life Flight daily makes the difference between life and death for victims of disaster. From its early days with a plane in the middle of Hermann Hospital's emergency room and single flight crew, Life Flight has grown to encompass a fleet of five helicopters, with bases in Houston, Galveston and Beaumont. Life Flight services hospitals and

patients within a radius of 150 miles from each of the three cities, with operations extending throughout Southeast Texas and Western Louisiana. More than 50 medical centers around the U.S. have emulated the Life Flight program with similar air ambulance programs.

Tyler County Hospital will join the "Life Flight Over Texas" activities with a birthday party and a Helipad Dedication on November 24 at the hospital.

The dedication of the Life Flight Helipad is the culmination of a County wide project that has been led by Woodville Police Officer Scott Yasko. Officer Yasko has been a driving force in the planning, construction and completion of the Life Flight Helipad. Along with Yasko's leadership there have been donations from the public in the form of materials, labor and cash contributions. Without this public support this project could not have been completed without public funds.

Life Flight will arrive for the festivities, which begin at 10:00 a.m. Tyler County Hospital is a member of the Affiliated Hospital Systems (AHS), the health care system subsidiary of the Hermann Hospital Estate. In a visit to Hermann Hospital on October 10, White congratulated Life Flight, the nation's busiest hospital-based air ambulance system. 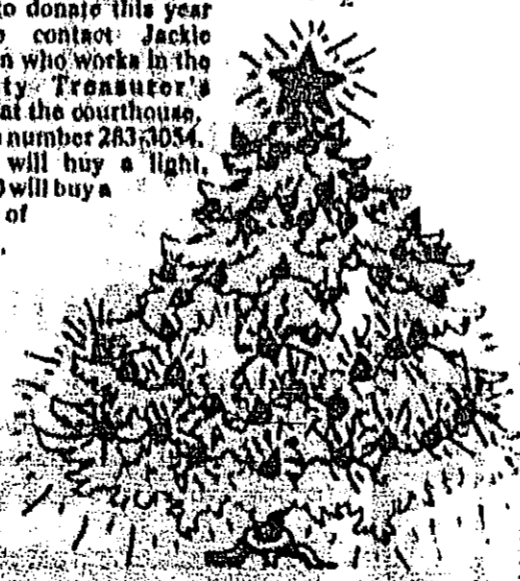
Tree Of Lights To Help Needy Kids

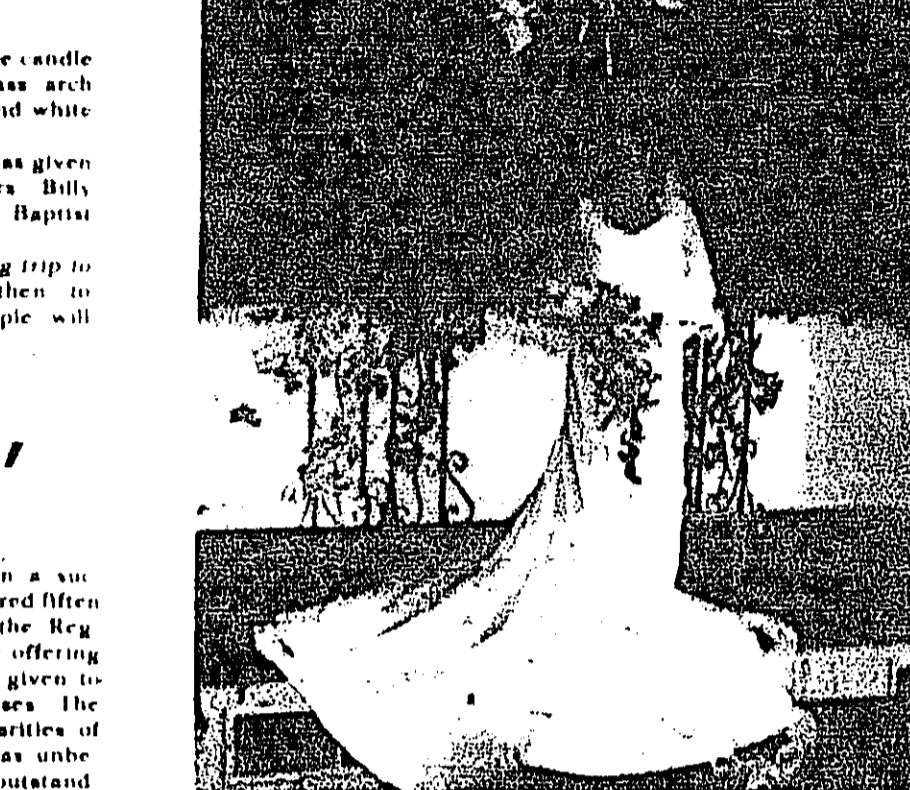

Beech Creek Reunion 'Heartwarming'

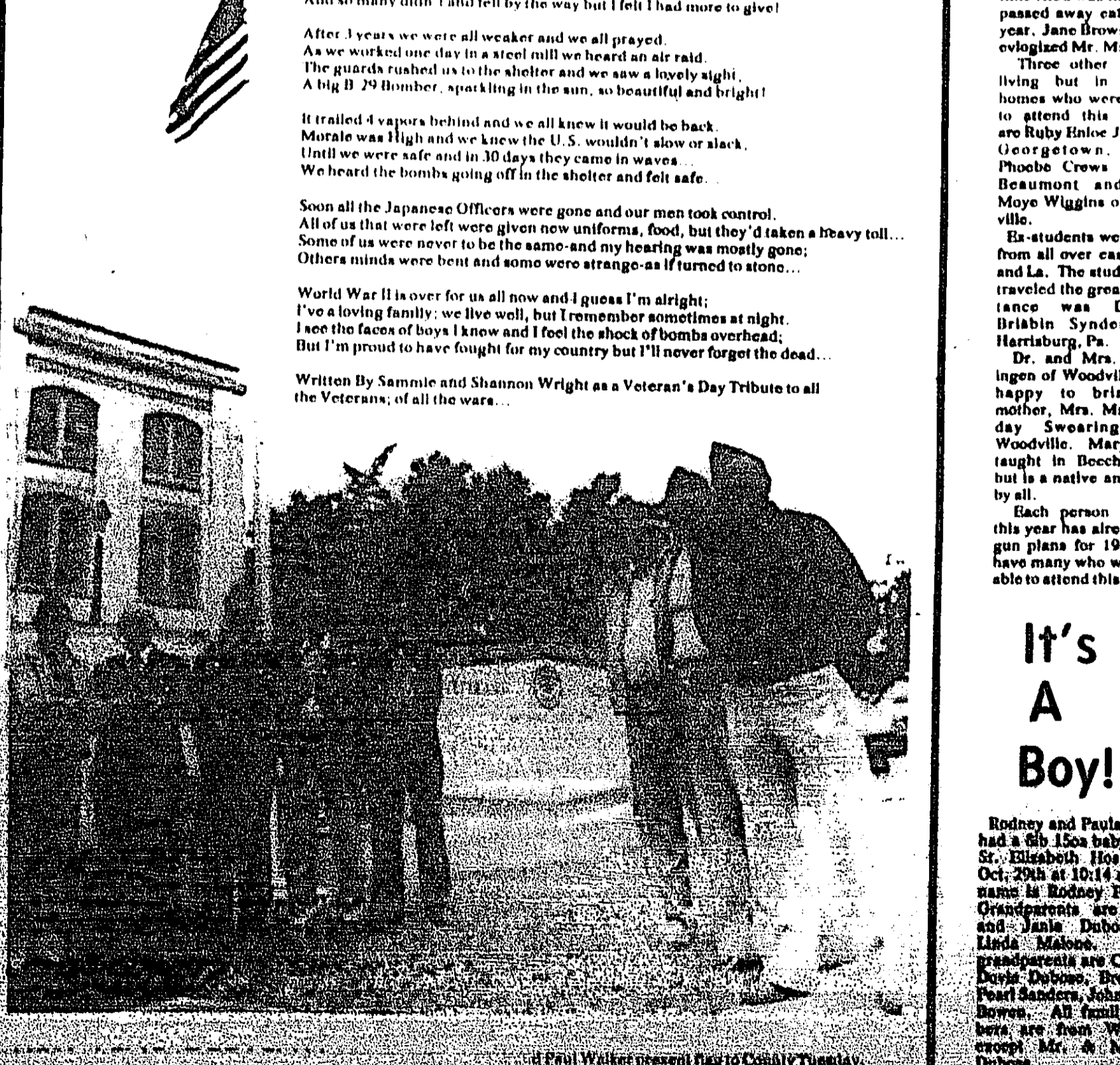

She brought an album of pictures including the old School House which was torn down years ago. Albu also displayed a beautiful friendship quilt given to her, made by mothers of the children. Memories Of A World War II P.O.W.

On April 4, 1941, I enlisted in the Army. Hoping to be of service and keep us all free! The next few months I spent a life so lonely. Thinking of the loved ones at home only. Soon the 3 months of that Camp had passed. And there were many times I felt I couldn't last! Then another 3 months passed and I thought we'd rest. But then orders came to go to the Philippines what a treat! I thought it would be great to travel 10,000 miles. To places I'd never seen but there were no airlines. When I boarded that transport in San Francisco that cool September day, all my dreams seemed to go. As we left the Golden Gate Bridge I wondered how long it would be. Until we all returned to the beautiful land of the free. We walked about 30 days before we reached Clark Field. Where I spent the next 18 months. My life was so real!

After Pearl Harbor, we were bombarded and the fight was really on! The next four years were hell on earth. I felt so sad and alone. We fought the Japanese and gave them all we had. But after 6 months our supplies were gone. It was bad. We couldn't get supplies so we were taken Prisoners of War. It hurt and we felt let down, after going so far! And so many didn't and fell by the way but I felt I had more to give! After 3 years we were all weaker and we all prayed. As we worked one day in a steel mill we heard an air raid. The guards rushed us to the shelter and we saw a lovely sight. A big B-29 bomber, spouting in the sun, so beautiful and bright! It trailed 4 vapors behind and we all knew it would be back. Morale was high and we knew the U.S. wouldn't slow or slack. Until we were safe and in 30 days they came in waves. We heard the bombs going off in the shelter and felt safe. Soon all the Japanese Officers were gone and our men took control. All of us that were left were given new uniforms, food, but they'd taken a heavy toll... Some of us were never to be the same and my hearing was mostly gone. Other minds were bent and some were strange as if turned to stone...
