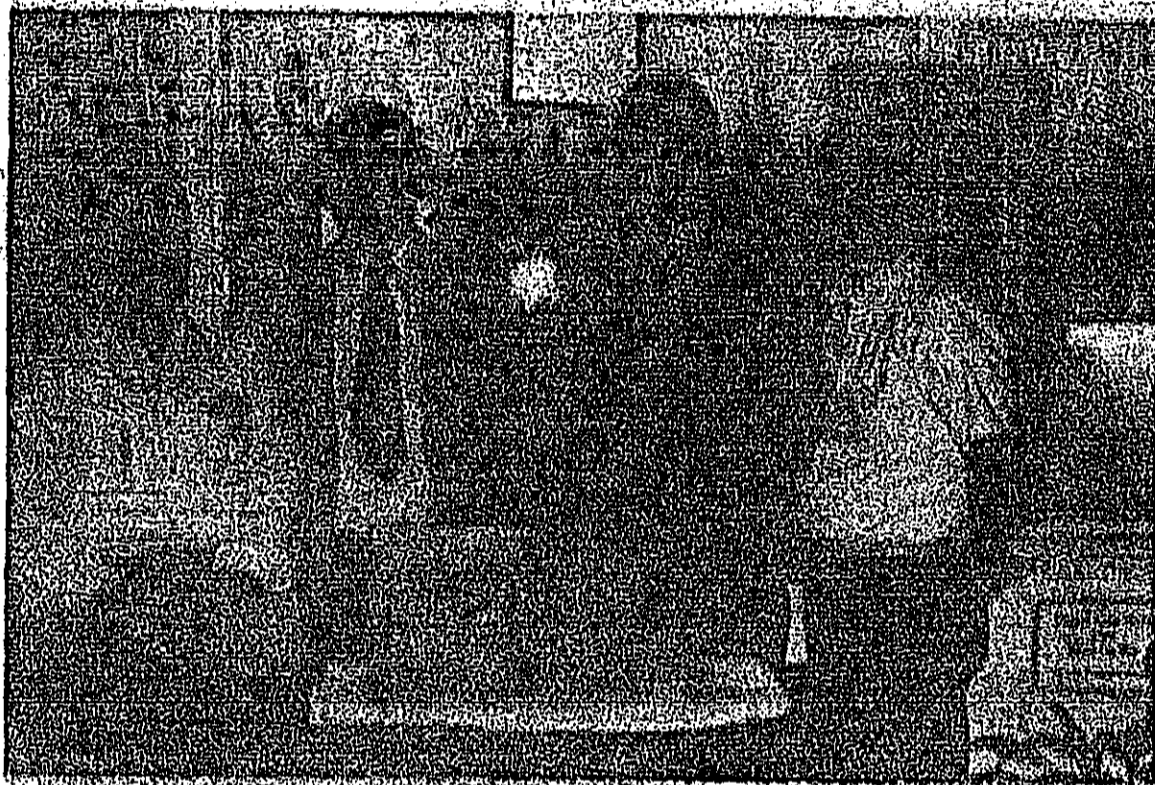

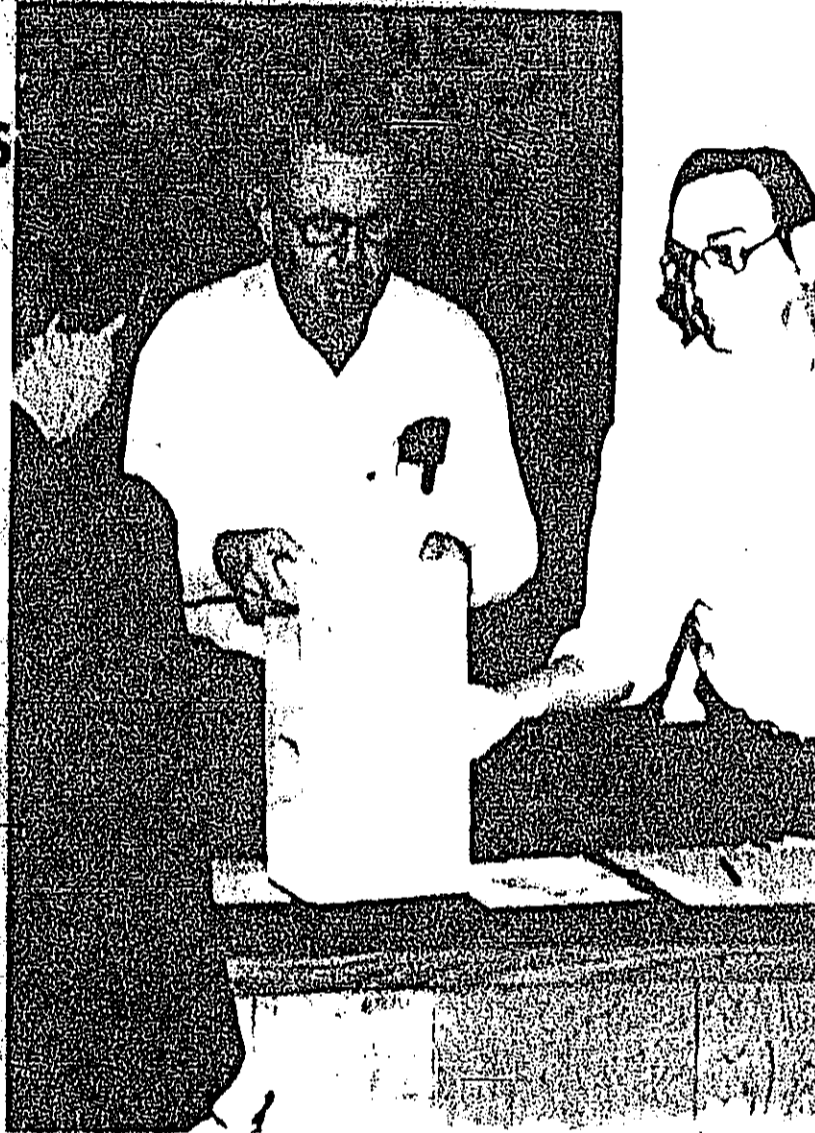
Childrens Monument Works is located on Highway 190, between Highway 287 and 290, in Woodville, Texas.

27 Accidents Reported

The Texas Highway Patrol investigated 27 rural traffic accidents in Tyler County during the month of October, according to Sergeant R. D. Henry, supervisor for this highway patrol sergeant area. These accidents resulted in 0 deaths and 16 injuries.

The total rural traffic accidents for Tyler County for this year is 185, which have resulted in 4 deaths and 139 injuries.

The ten counties which comprise highway patrol sub-district 2B-D have had 4013-00, 2116 rural traffic accidents this year, resulting in 62 deaths and 1363 injuries.



Beaumont Firm Wins Jail Bid

The Beaumont firm of H. B. Neild and Sons won the building activity Friday as Tyler County commissioners voted to spend \$1,617,881 on construction of the new Tyler County Justice Center which will be located on the east side of Hwy 69 in north Woodville. The vote to award the bid was initiated by County Commissioner Willis Graham and seconded by Bo Jordan. The vote was unanimous. The action was taken on the recommendation of Dennis J. Utter, representing the AID Architectural Firm of Dallas. Also bidding for the jail complex was Thomas C. Porterberry of Woodville both the Porterberry and Neild Companies were asked to submit itemized costs to the county and following the county's architectural firm discussions on Friday with both contractors the award was made to Neild.

Construction on the complex began on Monday Nov. 24.

Start Planning Tax Reform Strategies

COLLEGE STATION — That should offer a sizeable payoff next year, U.S. Treasury's savings individuals need to start doing some serious thinking and planning regarding tax strategies before the year draws to a close.

Since many provisions of the new tax bill will be effective on Jan. 1, 1987, individuals need to take advantage of the new tax code and to capitalize on existing as well as future tax breaks.

Hayenga says, "Hayenga recommends visiting a broker or accountant as soon as possible to look at tax strategies. According to Hayenga, certain steps should be taken in conjunction with the new tax situation. Defer income. Since tax rates will be dropping to either 15 or 28 percent, try to defer as much income as possible until next year so you will be taxed at lower rates. But don't defer income if you plan to use income averaging since this is the last year that method will be available.

Establish a 401(k). This is a salary reduction plan to which you can contribute up to \$30,000 during 1986. That amount drops to only \$17,000 a year starting in 1987.

Review your portfolio. Sell stocks now to take advantage of the favorable long-term capital gains rate, particularly if you feel they won't move up much in price.

Seek high dividend investments. Select corporations that offer high dividends since dividends and capital gains will be taxed at lower rates under the new law. Many investors believe there will be more corporate pressure to increase dividends because long term appreciated value will become less important than immediate income.

Stay clear of investments with immediately reportable income. Think about investments.

Consider municipal bonds. Municipal bonds and bond funds offer tax exempt earnings and good yields; they are one of the few legitimate tax shelters left.

Make another look at children's accounts. When transferring assets to children, select exempt trusts either when the child is more than 14 years of age or when the money is needed for college or some other specific reason.
