

It seemed that whatever was paid the former superintendent and his wife would be paid by the District's insurance company and no money would have to be taken out of local funds. And that is good, but what about the many thousands of dollars in legal fees the District has already paid getting ready to go to court? Is it possible that those costs could have been recovered if the District has gone to court and won? What about the fact that this is the second time in less than fourteen months that the District has paid off people who have sued them rather than go to court? How much longer will an insurance company carry a school district with that kind of record? If the district is dropped, the premium charged by a new insurance company could prove to be very costly. But most important of all. what about the cost that you cannot put a money value on? Doesn't a settlement imply that whatever you were being accused of is true? What happened to standing up for what you know is right? Is the district opening the gate to be sued over and over again as long as the insurance company will pay the cost no matter who is right? When the pockerbook is affected, do principles go out the window? It seems so because the personal pocketbooks of the Board Members who were such individually are protected by this settlement.
