





Winter is tough on houseplants. One of the biggest problems is replenishing the humidity to the air that has been robbed by fireplaces and wood burning stoves. It helps to arrange plants together, or group them on trays filled with pebbles and water. You can also place containers filled with water near plants.

which thrive in a warm, humid environment. Mist regularly; at least once a week. Never soak the lant, but mist just enough to simulate dew. Wal-Mart carries an all purpose mister and sprayer. It comes in a handy size. You can also provide moisture for your indoor plants by adding small bits of styrofoam to the soil.

Indoor plants can be harmed by too much water. Always check the soil by sticking your finger an inch below the surface. If the soil is damp, the plant does not need to be watered. Check again in





Plants also begefit from extra nourish. ment. Superthrive, sold at Thomas Florist and Nursery, Highway 69 South, is a vitamin and hormone rich additive that can be used along with plant food. According to Paula Oandasan, Superthrive helps keep plants from going into shock when they are first brought indoors. It also helps prevent transplant shock for seedlings and other plants being repotted. Paula says it prevents leaf drop on ficus and generally helps plants grow better. able at Thomas Florist and Nursery, is a special formula for blooming plants and helps enhance the color of crotons, colcus, and begonias. It is sold in granule form and mixes with water for

Indoor plants also need light. If you don't have enough window space check with Thomas Florist and Nursery for Durollte Grow Lights. They are available in two sizes and will fit any standard light fixture.
