

BEEF-BARLEY VEGETABLE SOUP

CORN MEAL-WHOLE WHEAT MUFFINS

1 1/4 cups skim milk 1 cup whole wheat flour

4 teasp, baking powder

mixed. In a large mixing bowl, combine flour, salt, and baking powder. Add the liquid to the flour mixture, stirring quickly and lightly until mixed. Do not beat. Stir the cornmeal into the batter until mixed. From the bowl, dip the batter into oiled muffin tins, filling each cup 1/2 full.
