You always thought the coming of Spring had something to do with the vernal equinox. We beg to differ. Springs arrives when you start incinerating the bagworms on your plum tree. When you walk across your lawn looking for tell-tale mole and gopher runs.

But most of all, it is the return of the nursery trucks. The last time you saw them they were delivering poinsettia plants at Christmas time. That's the same plant you finally threw out of the living room in February when its leaves fell off, and there were just a few red petals remaining drooping around a faded red ribbon. You told yourself then you would prune it back, hide it in the storeroom and revive it next Christmas season. About August it will be getting in the way of the bug spray and garden hose, and you'll throw it out with the rest of the garbage.

But back to the nursery trucks. Watch the way they try to intimidate you when they come down the street. They arrive just when the sun comes up. You notice they stop at your neighbor's house. Folks pile out of the cabs carrying shovels, hoes and chainsaws. It's a blur of activity as old shrubbery disappears. New plants are carried out of the truck like so many potted soldiers, and a miracle takes place right before your eyes.

Part of the crew tests the underground sprinkling system, and you tell yourself it won't be long before you are dragging hoses all over the yard trying to beat the Texas heat.

Just when you think they've done all they could do next door, out comes bag after bag of fertilizer, and the spreading crew crosses the yard at a high angle, and you know the mowers can't be far behind.

You wonder to yourself if maybe you should have taken that mower in for a systems check weeks ago. Maybe it won't even crank now. You'll think about that tomorrow.

You notice that the fence-row shrubbery is a foot higher than the top fence rail. You wonder where you hid the pruning shears when you cleaned out the store room. Better look behind the poinsettias.

Finally all the shovels, hoes and chainsaws disappear into the back of the nurseryman's van, and you marvel at what they have been able to do in a few hours. Took you four hours and a can of penetrating oil to get the fertilizer spreader to move. You'd forgotten to wash it down, and last year's residue had frozen the gearing.

But instead of speeding out of the neighborhood, the nurseryman approaches to a halt right in front of your house. Gets out of his truck, and wanders along the property line scanning every blade of grass, every shrub, every vacant spot in the plantings that identifies another unloved plant that didn't survive the winter.

He reminds you your hedge is too high. Tells you the boxwood should be pruned. Says if that row of juniper along the drive was supposed to be a decorative screen, how come you let it until it was higher than the caves.

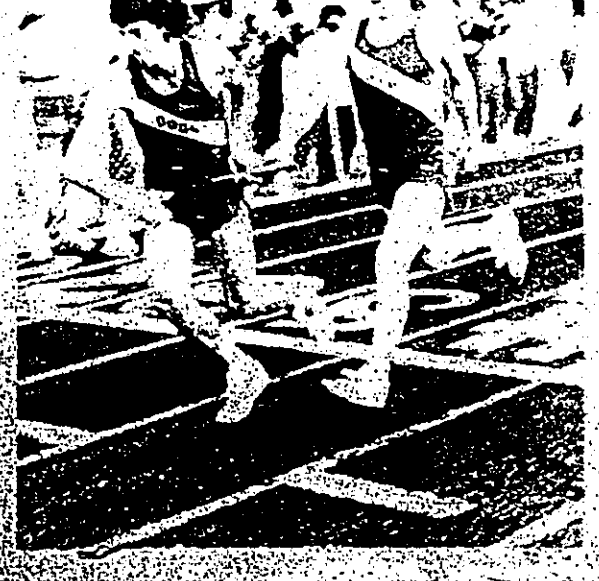

Mr. East Texas Award Goes To Beaumont Mayor Maury Meyers

Cited for his ability "to bring people together" as exemplified in the west Economic Summit held in Beaumont. That cities Mayor Maury Meyers was chosen "Mr. East Texas" by the Dogwood Festival Directors.

Maury Meyers, mayor of Beaumont from 1978 to 1982, was called back to that office last April -- with an 85.2 per cent majority vote -- to lead Beaumont out of the most devastating crisis in the city's history.

Plagued by unemployment, declining population, businesses closing, a crippling loss of \$20 million in municipal funds and a widespread sense of frustration and malaise, Beaumont turned for leadership to a former mayor whose terms had been characterized by enthusiasm, vitality and unprecedented progress.

Maury Meyers became mayor in April, 1978.

Upon completion of his first two-year term, he was reelected with 83.4 per cent of the votes cast in the 1980 election. At the end of his second term in 1982, he did not seek reelection but returned to private life to devote full time to the affairs of his business as president of Accurate Business Machines, Inc.

But the Meyers' years in city government had changed the face of Beaumont and the character of the community, with more improvements in more areas than any like period in the city's history. Those years saw completion of Beaumont's largest capital improvements program, including a new City Hall and Civic Center, a gigantic railroad grade separation underpass for Railroad Avenue, which had been designated as Beaumont's No. 1 safety problem; completion of history's largest city-wide residential street rehabilitation program; passage of a \$31 million bond issue for improvement of major thorough-

fares; improved municipal services including upgraded refuse collection service with better equipment and more efficient routes and schedules; initiation of multi-million dollar capital programs for water and sewer system improvements; development of a master plan for drainage,

establishment of the city's first community health clinic and organization of Beaumont's first Emergency Medical Transportation and Care System.

Improvements were evident in virtually every aspect of community life, including:

City beautification,

with anti-litter campaigns; formation of Beaumont's first Clean Community Commission and initiation of a "Focal Point" beautification program for the landscaping of parkways and open spaces to make the city more attractive.

Encouraging, with the initiation of programs to en-

courage construction of new dwellings and rehabilitation of substandard housing.

Citizen participation, with hundreds of private citizens serving on city-appointed advisory committees and neighborhood town-hall meetings and hearings to encour-

age citizen input in community affairs.

On a broader scale, Meyers' efforts to rejuvenate Beaumont have focused directly on the problem of economic recovery and the creation of more jobs.

These efforts resulted in

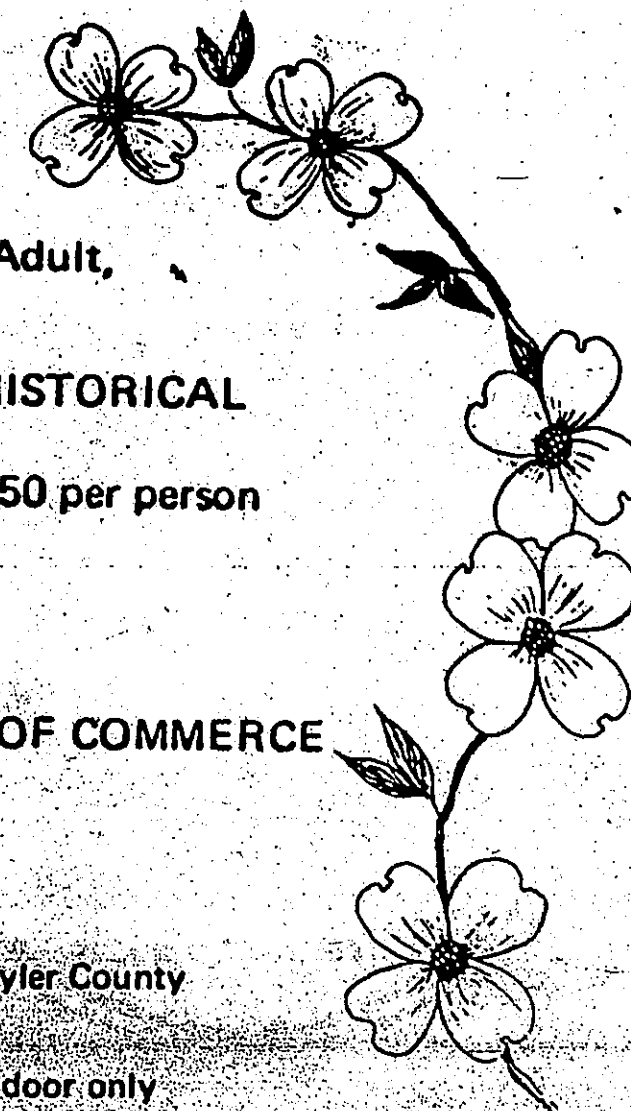

There are other royalty appearances by the Princesses, Ladies-in-Waiting and the Queen's Court. Young royalty includes Train-bearers and Children of the Court.

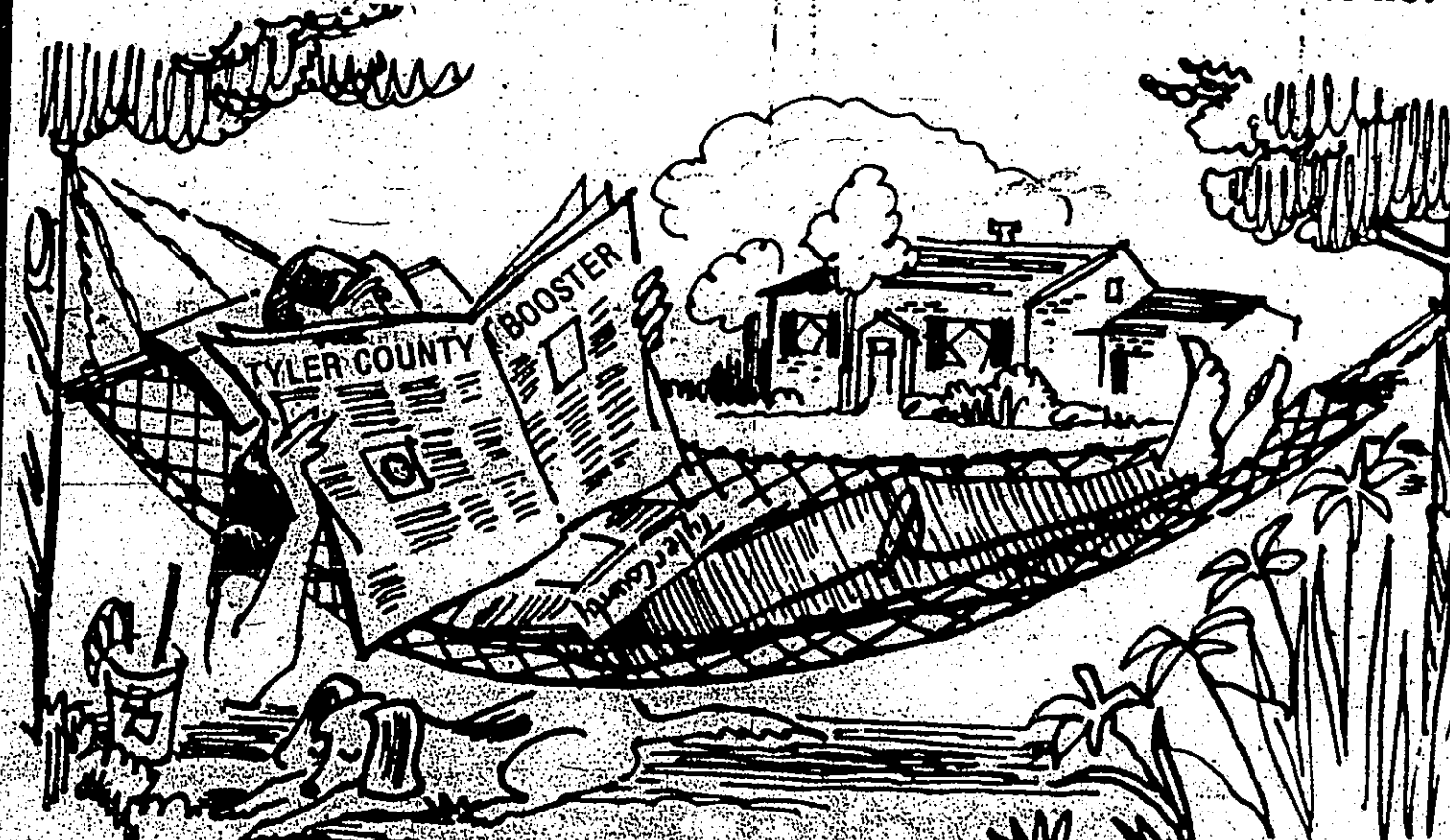

Jordan 'Family Tradition' Is Dogwood Festival

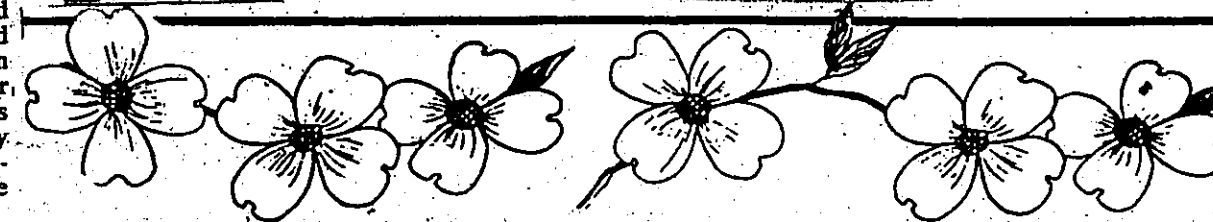

'Dream Come True' Says Warren's Lindgren

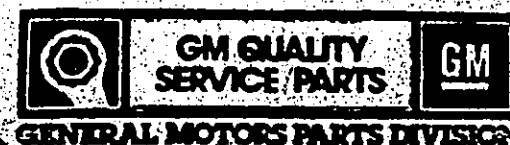

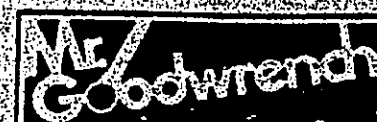

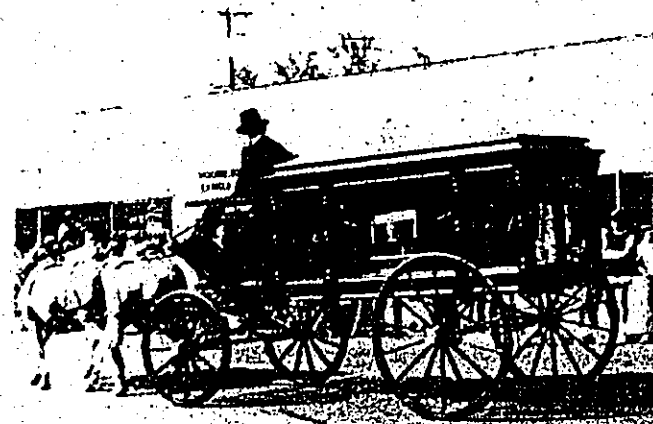

ing toward a second Eco-
nomic Summit in eight
months to take stock of
the results.

Apart from his office as
mayor, he is founding
chairman of Southeast
Texas, Inc., a private,
non-profit organization
speaking an innova-
tive approach to eco-
nomic development on a
regional basis.

three times with the Cardinals and once with the 49'ers.

In 1968, instead of taking an offer for a two-year contract extension with the 49'ers, Crow retired as a player and returned to Paul Bryant, who by that time was starting his 12th year at Alabama. Bryant hired Crow as an assistant in 1969 where he stayed three years before becoming running back coach with the Cleveland Browns in 1972 and 1973 and offensive coordinator with the San Diego Chargers in 1974 and 1975. In 1976 he was named head coach and athletic director at Northeast Louisiana, where he stayed five years. From 1981 to 1983 Crow spent

the only period of his life out of athletics. He entered private business in Monroe, La. until May of 1983 when he moved to Tyler and the insurance business. Two months later, Jackie Sherrill called.

John David Crow will recall both good and bad decisions he's made in his life but he'll claim the best one came in 1954 before entering A&M. On July 2 of that year he married Carolyn Gilliam. She had grown up in Sparkman, Ark., but had moved to Springhill where she and John David met. They have three children. John David Crow, Jr. was born while his father was a student at A&M. Their daughters are Anna Lisa Stenkvist and Jeannie Crow.

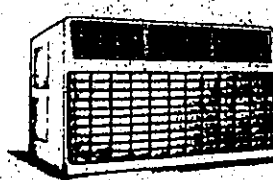

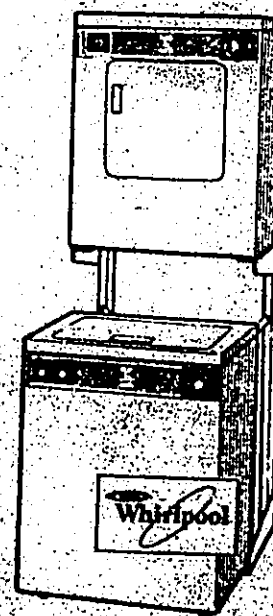
