Ann Richards, the State Treasurer of Texas, will be the special guest speaker at the "Annual Membership Roundup" of the Deep East Texas

Council of Governments on May 28, 1987 at the Lufkin Civic Center in Lufkin, Texas. The setting is based on a "western theme" and guests will be enter-

tained by the dance performers of the Alabama Coushatta Indian Reservation. Ms. Richards became the first woman elected to a statewide office in

fifty years when she was elected Treasurer Nov. 2, 1982. She has received numerous honors, among those was receiving the Governor's Award in 1984 for "exceptional contributions to the selection, development and promotion of women in state government."

Economic Development Conference May 28

A series of one-day workshops on economic development for rural areas and small cities is being sponsored by the Texas Agricultural Extension Service and East Texas Chamber of Commerce. The workshops are scheduled in Paris on May 28, Tyler on June 4, Waco on July 1 and Texas City on August 6. A registration fee of \$45 covers study materials, continental breakfast, luncheon and refreshments.

"One critical issue which emerged throughout the state was the sagging economy of local businesses and agriculture," Marquiss noted. These workshops are specifically designed to address this issue. The target audience is chamber of commerce executives, mayors, city council members, bankers, county officials, school board members, business leaders and other community leaders, he said.

Community economic development specialists from utility companies and Texas Economic Development Commission, economists from Texas A&M University and experts from local industry will share ideas and make suggestions during the workshops.

A City and County Seminar co-sponsored by the Texas Department of Community Affairs will begin the day's activities. Major General Willie Scott, appointed by Governor Clements to be Executive Director of the Texas Department of Community Affairs, will be conducting the Seminar.

"All across Texas, county Extension agents and citizen task forces have recently completed studies to identify crucial concerns and plan long-range Extension programs to address these issues," said Tyler County Agent, Janie Marquiss.

According to the county agent, the agenda is designed to help these leaders understand why and how economic development occurs, develop a feasible and workable strategy for community economic growth and initiate viable development programs.

County agent Janie Marquiss says, "the program will include just enough theory to see how and why economic development occurs and will concentrate on the practical." Registration information is available from the county agent's office, call 283-2482.

Following the noon luncheon, an awards ceremony will be held to announce the winners of the Dr. Ralph W. Steen Memorial Award and the President's Award for Outstanding Committee Work. The Grants Application Review Committee and the DETCOG Board of Directors meetings are scheduled to begin following the awards ceremony. Election of new officers for the 1987-1988 will be held.

Country Kitchen

The gardens in Tyler County are really growing with the recent rains. Before you know it, there will be an overabundance of fresh produce and one way to use some of it is by pickling vegetables. Brined vegetables add crispness, firm texture, and pungent flavor to meals and snacks. They contribute some nutritive value and contain little or no fat. Brined or fermented pickles go through a curing process of about 3 weeks. Other vegetables such as tomatoes may also be brined in the same way as dilled cucumbers.

The following recipes are provided by our County Extension Agents and published by Texas A&M.

BRINED DILL CUCUMBERS
20 pounds (about 1/2 bushel) cucumbers, 3 to 6 inches in length
1/4 cup whole mixed pickling spice
2 or 3 bunches dill plant, fresh or dried (optional)
2 1/2 cups vinegar
1 1/4 cups salt, pure granulated
2 1/4 gallons water

Brining
Cover cucumber with cold water. Wash thoroughly, using a vegetable brush; handle gently to avoid bruising. Take care to remove blossoms. Drain on rack or wipe dry.
Place half the pickles spices and a layer of dill in your chosen container. Fill with cucumbers to 3 or 4 inches from the top. Place a layer of dill and remaining spices over the top of cucumbers. (Garlic may be added, if desired.) Thoroughly mix the vinegar, salt and water and pour over the cucumbers. Cover with a heavy china or glass plate or lid that fits inside the container.
Use a weight to hold the plate down and keep the cucumber under the brine. Cover loosely with clean cloth. Keep pickles at room temperature and remove scum daily when formed. Scum may start forming in 3 to 5 days. Do not stir pickles, but be sure they are covered completely with brine. If necessary, make additional brine, using original proportions specified in recipe.
In about 3 weeks the cucumbers will have become an olive-green color and should have a desirable flavor. Any white spots inside the fermented cucumbers will disappear in processing.
Freebening
If a less salty flavor is desired in the brined pickles, the surplus salt may be removed. Soak in fresh water an equal part of vinegar and water until the amount of salt is removed for desired flavor.

Packing
The original brine is usually cloudy as a result of yeast development during the fermentation period. If this cloudiness is objectionable, fresh brine may be used to cover the pickles when packing them into the jars.
When making fresh brine, use 1/4 cup salt and 4 cups vinegar to 1 gallon of water. The fermentation brine generally is preferred for its added flavor and should be strained before heating to boiling.
Pack the pickles, along with some of the dill, into clean, hot quart jars; add garlic, if desired. Avoid too tight a pack. Cover with boiling brine to 1/2 inch from the top of the jar. Adjust jar lids.
GREEN TOMATO DILL PICKLES
Green tomatoes, if freshly picked, can be used for making dill tomato pickles. Select uniform size tomatoes in excellent condition. The amount of brine planned for 20 pounds of dill cucumbers will be sufficient for the same amount of dill tomatoes. Use Brined Dill Cucumber recipe; substituting tomatoes for cucumbers.

"Gulf States could not have been aware in 1979 of the increasing regulatory scrutiny that would occur in the 1980s, the pervasive nature of its effects on construction and design of River Bend, and the increased costs of engineering, quality assurance and construction that would result."




