National Forests Of Texas Looking For Volunteers

The National Forests in Texas are looking for volunteers interested in locating and assisting with an endangered bird.

The red-cockaded woodpecker, which makes its colonies in mature, living pine trees, has been receiving care, concern and special attention by the U.S. Forest Service for several years because it is on the endangered species list.

A target for the National Forests in Texas is 425 colonies. Throughout the South on national forests, there are about 2,000 active colonies. Another 2,250 colonies need to be found to remove the bird from the endangered species list.

Persons interested in adopting a red-cockaded woodpecker colony will care for, maintain and gather data after receiving some training from the staff wildlife biologist for the National Forest in Texas, Lannan said.

Volunteers interested in this program are encouraged to contact the Wildlife Biologist, state numbering less than 700 of the woodpeckers.

mentally sound forest of use, followed by bulldozing. Then, selection, Bezanon says, the Forest Service replants a single species of tree, which in Texas is the pine, and begins another tree farm, not a native diverse forest.

For two years we have been asking the Forest Service to shift over to selection harvesting. Bezanon says the cause that would be far less destructive of our soil, wildlife, water quality, and native diversity. She cited the May Texas Plan as "bullheadedly insisting on clearcutting." She said that the plan attempts to deceive the public in many ways. One example, she said, is the Forest Service's statement "...there simply does not exist a large ownership of forest types like those of the National Forests in Texas that have been successfully managed to sustained yield state with selection or harvest-cutting methods." The statement is absolutely not correct, she said.

The Forest Service is blinding itself to the cost savings of selection forestry," Fritz said. "They insist on following up most clearcuts by spending large sums of money on site preparation and planting their tree farms."

The TCON chairman quoted the public advertising of the big Louisiana-Pacific timber company operation in Texas and other southern states, whose motto, "Helping the forest grow for people," starts with "LP Forestry's environment."

SCS Pasture Planting Hints

If you happen to be getting ready to establish your pastures at this time, there are certain factors you should consider before you get to the field, states Tom Mackey, Soil Conservation Service.

Soil Type: The soils in Tyler County range from deep sands to sandy loams to black and soil types. The type of soil you have governs all other factors involved in establishing a pasture.

Soil Fertility and PH: The first step in any type of pasture planting is knowing what nutrients are needed for plant establishment. This can be obtained by making a soil test on the particular field you want to plant. Most of the soils in this county are low in

fertility and high in acidity. An accurate soil test will give you recommendations on the amount of fertilizer and lime you need.

Grass Selection and Use: Depending on whether you want pasture or hayland, you will want to select a species that best suits your objectives. The most commonly planted grasses are: pensacola bahia, hybrid bahia, coastal bermuda, and hybrid bermuda. The type you select is dependent on soil type and personal preference.

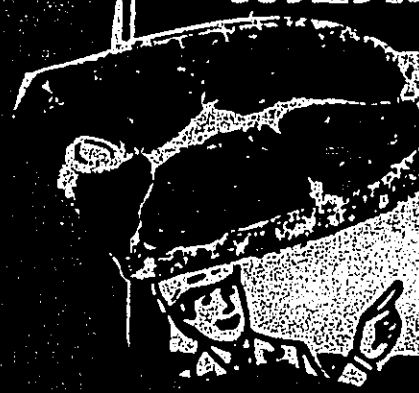
