

Y cup honey
Preheat oven to 300 degrees. Combine oatmeal, wheat germ, nuts and sugar in a shallow baking pan. Toss to mix. Drizzle with melted butter. Stir and spread evenly over pan bottom. Bake in 300 degree oven about 25 minutes until browned, stirring once or twice. Let cool. Transfer mixture to a bowl; add peanut butter, raisins and honey. Stir until well blended. Chill about 15 minutes until firm enough to handle. Roll between palms of hands into 1 inch balls. Store in refrigerator.

Combine eggs, milk, vegetable oil, fruit mixture and nuts in large bowl. In another bowl, combine flour, sugar, baking powder, cinnamon, allspice and salt. Make a well in center of dry ingredients and add liquid ingredients all at once; mix only until dry particles are moist. Fill lined muffin cups & full. Bake 20 minutes at 400 degrees or until wooden pick inserted in center comes out clean. Remove immediately from muffin cups to cool on rack. To store, place cool muffins into sandwich bags:
